Dear Friends,

Today, we draw to a close the season of Christmas with this feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The infancy narratives are behind us and we now see Jesus as an adult, coming out of his 40 day experience in the desert. Having spent this time in fasting and prayer in order to prepare himself for the beginning of his ministry, Jesus now appears at the Jordan River where John is baptizing. To initiate his ministry, Jesus enters the water and presents himself to John for baptism.


Obviously, Jesus has no need for a baptism of repentance because he is sinless. Nevertheless, Jesus wants to set an example for us and through his baptism, he is once again going to reveal himself much like he did to the Magi who visited him in his infancy. The gospel writer tells us that when Jesus came up from the water, "the heavens were opened for him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him." A voice from the heavens proclaimed, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

There is something very beautiful about this scene. Jesus identifies himself with us in our human condition. Though he is sinless, he takes upon himself the burden of our sins. Through baptism, Jesus is going to make us all new again. Baptism is going to be the means by which he undoes in us what was done by our first parents' disobedience. Through our baptism, we share in the gift of redemption gained for us by Christ's passion, death, and resurrection.

There is a point in the gospel of John where Jesus has a conversation with Nicodemus in the dark of night. Jesus tells him that unless he is born again, he cannot have a share in the kingdom of God. Confused by Jesus' words, Nicodemus asks how it can be possible to be born again. Understandably, he can't comprehend how such a rebirth could take place since our birth into this world takes place through our coming forth from our mother's womb. The birth Jesus is talking about is a different kind of birth - a birth through water and the Spirit. This new birth will not take place by a physical birth, but rather a spiritual one.

What Jesus is referring to is the birth that comes through the Sacrament of Baptism. In baptism, the baptismal font is the womb of Mother Church. When we are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we are spiritually reborn. Original Sin is washed away and we are incorporated into the family of the Church - God's family.

You may notice that when Jesus had died on the cross, a soldier pierced his side with a lance. The scriptures tell us that immediately, blood and water poured forth from the wound on his side. The Fathers of the Church recognized this as the fount of the Sacraments. The blood that was poured out for us represents the Eucharist. We partake of Christ's body and blood, which nourishes us and sustains us. The Fathers saw the water as the font of the Sacrament of Baptism. In baptism, we are born again and cleansed from sin. The Church states that Baptism is the doorway to all the Sacraments. This new birth initiates us into the life of the Church and directs us to the Eucharist where we find the strength to persevere in the life of faith we


