I reckon that by the time you read this, it probably isn't as bad for us in South Texas as they were originally predicting, but no doubt, it is still cold.


I stopped by the grocery store to pick up a couple of items and discovered that what people had told me is true. The store shelves have been cleared out. It is a bit odd to see shelves that are typically loaded with meat or bread have been picked clean, as if vultures had swooped down. It always bemuses me how everyone goes into panic mode in the face of a storm. It is almost as if everyone is preparing for the apocalypse. I suppose there is something good in that, especially if the storm were to limit our mobility. We have learned a lot of lessons about preparedness throughout the years. Too many times tragedy occurs when people don't heed the warnings. It is better to be safe than sorry. Even if the weather isn't so bad, it is good to make provision for what could happen. In any event, I am praying that things aren't as bad as predicted, and that everyone stays warm.

There is something very humbling about inclement weather. It reminds us of the fact that, fundamentally, we are not in control. As much as we have harnessed various aspects of life, there are still aspects of our lives that are beyond our reach. In some ways, storms are the great leveler. They make us realize that we can all be affected when things in life get upended. We stand as one human family who rely upon one another and who need one another. We look around at all the things going on in Minneapolis, Chicago, Washington, D.C. and even locally, and it is evident that we are a fractured society. A sense of cooperation has virtually disappeared. Everyone picks sides without really giving thoughtful deliberation to the problems that exist. We are extremely divided.

The second reading is a beautiful reading that comes from St. Paul. He urges the Christian community in Corinth to not allow any divisions among themselves. The Corinthians had allowed chaos to creep into their ranks. Present in the community were rivalries and dissension. He clarifies that these are eroding their unity. They were attaching themselves to specific leaders in opposition to other leaders. Paul is emphatic in saying that he preached only one gospel, and that gospel was supposed to unite them.

We need to start listening to each other and putting on the mind and heart of Christ. We still may have divergent opinions, but we nevertheless respect each other and strive to understand each other. Amazingly, we do this all the time. We don't typically divorce our friends because of their political persuasions. True, some people have allowed politics and other strongly held beliefs to interfere with their friendships, but by and large, we often talk to people daily who may not have the same beliefs.

In the gospel, Jesus gathers his disciples and calls them into a relationship with him. Jesus is the binding





- End of Week: Talent Show and Spelling Bee.


Throughout the week, we also encourage you to:


