I was sitting in a chair in front of the first pew. Before me were 20 or so bishops from across the state and beyond. The soaring hymn "Praise Him, Jerusalem" was resounding as the presider of the installation, Archbishop Joe Vasquez of Galveston-Houston, kissed the altar. Joy filled the air as the ceremony began.


This past Wednesday was a historic day for our diocese. Bishop Mario Alberto Avilés, C.O. was installed as the 9th bishop of Corpus Christi. The Mass of installation marks another chapter for our beautiful diocese named after the Body of Christ. We are grateful to Bishop Michael Mulvey for having shepherded the diocese for the last 15 years. His guidance and pastoral care have left a profound impact upon the faithful in this area. Now we enter a new season in the life of this part of the Lord's vineyard.

Apart from the prelates gathered, there were approximately 130 priests from the Brownsville diocese, as well as our own diocese, who concelebrated the Mass. Many deacons, religious, ecclesial organizations, and lay people also gathered, along with Bishop Mario's family from Mexico. The universal character of the Church was on full display that day. It was evident that this wasn't just a celebration of our local church, but of the entire Church in communion with the Eternal Word, Jesus Christ, and our loving Father, in communion with the Holy Spirit.

These moments, much like the moment a priest is ordained and consecrated to God for service of our Lord Jesus Christ, highlight that Jesus did not choose the perfect or the most eloquent, or of the most exalted status to proclaim the gospel message. Rather, he chose and continues to choose imperfect human instruments to do extraordinary things. By the grace of God, the gospel disseminates far and wide through those who are called to share the Good News. It is truly a mystery how human beings, though simple and frail, can plant the seeds of faith in a way that supernatural grace can come to bear in the lives of people. It is a great mystery that God accomplishes his will through simple instruments. We congratulate Bishop Mario and pray that, as he embarks upon his role as shepherd, he will be guided by the Spirit, and that his ministry will be fruitful among the faithful.

The gospel this weekend presents us with one of the most famous scenes of Our Lord's ministry. Jesus ascends the mountain and crowds of people are gathered to listen to him preach. The mountain is always a significant place within the scriptural context. It is always a place of encounter with God. On a mountain, God spoke to Moses and gave him the Law. Now, Jesus is taking the place of Moses as the giver of the new law of love.

In this particular instance, Jesus proclaims the Beatitudes. Beatitude means blessing. He relays to his followers that true blessing does not consist in what the world typically thinks of blessing. True blessedness is found in what the world sees as weakness. Jesus begins with what is perhaps the most important of the beatitudes - poverty of spirit. To be poor of spirit does not mean being deficient in spirit. Rather, it means abandonment of self and our own independence and laying ourselves completely in God. Only then can we be
