Little Chef



Toddler A children practised their fine motor skills by mashing potatoes with a fork. They enjoyed pressing and squashing the potatoes to make them soft. After mashing, the children were excited to try what they had prepared and had a good time tasting and enjoying their mashed potatoes!

Gross Motor

Our Toddler B friends made Sensory Shake Bottles, where they explored different textures and materials like pompoms, sequins, and buttons! Using their pincer grasp and eye-hand coordination, they carefully placed the items into the container of water. With a good shake to the container, they watched the 'magic' unfold as the colours and sparkles danced inside!

Gross Motor



The children practised their balancing skills by hopping from one coloured marker to another. As they grew more confident, they challenged themselves further by hopping on one leg. The children did a great job trying to keep their balance!

Numeracy



For Numeracy, the children sorted ice cream sticks according to the colours on the given plates. They worked carefully and showed good understanding of colour matching. Well done, children!

Nursery 1B

Sensorial Play

The children learnt about the terms 'heavy' and 'light' by comparing different objects. Each child picked up items to feel and compare their weight. This activity was a fun way for them to use their senses, build their vocabulary, and practise their observation skills. By holding the objects, they also worked on their motor skills and began to understand basic ideas about weight. It was great to see them being curious and talking about what they had discovered!



I CAN SPY! Nature

The children had fun exploring different seashells during our 'I CAN SPY! Nature' activity. They looked closely at the shells and took note of the patterns and textures on them. They also saw that some shells were shiny and curved, and that some came in different colours and shapes. Activities like this help our children build their observation skills, curiosity, and vocabulary as they use words like 'pointy,' 'striped,' and 'bumpy.' Holding the shells also helps them practise their fine motor skills and feel more connected to nature. It was wonderful to see how excited and interested they were as they explored the shells!

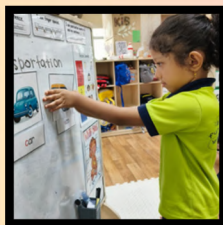


Discovery Lesson



The children ventured outdoors to observe living things in the environment. As they walked around the neighbourhood, the children showed curiosity and interest as they pointed out living things that they came across such as trees, red ants and flowers.

Language Lesson



During their Language lesson, the children learnt about different forms of land transportation. They matched pictures of different forms of transportation to the corresponding words, and were also guided to identify the beginning sound of each word before attempting to read it.



Nursery 2B

Gross Motor Lesson



The children had an exciting time participating in our gross motor activity, 'Bat to Score'. They took turns holding the bottle (bat), aiming and swinging to hit the target. Through fun and active play, the children developed their hand-eye coordination and social skills.



Phonics Lesson



During phonics lesson, our children learnt about the letter 'X' through an engaging hands-on activity. They also had an opportunity to hold and explore real objects that have the 'x' sound in their names, making the learning experience more meaningful.

Kindergarten 1A

Special Project



Learning about the use of sensory pouches for the elderly with dementia had built curiosity in the children. Through an engaging activity, they created sensory pouches using colourful materials. Through this experience, they explored different textures, strengthened their fine motor skills and had an opportunity to express their creativity.



Gross Motor



Our little ones enjoyed their gross motor activity where they learnt to bounce a ball continuously. This activity provided opportunities for the children to work on their hand-eye coordination, balance, and control while keeping their bodies active.

Kindergarten 1B

Discovery



Let's learn about crickets! The children were introduced to the parts of an insect, using crickets as an example. Once they were familiar with the cricket counter, more insects were added to the tray for children to identify and pick out the crickets among them.



Reading



After their reading lesson, the children dived into six high-frequency words found in the book. The children then engaged in a simple activity to see if they were able to recognise the sight words learnt. As they jumped and hopped to the high-frequency words pasted on the floor, they also had an opportunity to improve their balance and coordination.



Kindergarten 2A



'Dribbling Through the Gates' was a fun-filled activity which helped the children develop their gross motor skills as they dribbled the ball along straight and zigzag paths. In their teams, they developed their social skills as they practised communication, teamwork, and patience while waiting for their turn. Cheering for their friends, showing determination, and giving their best to help their team succeed, fostered both coordination and sportsmanship.



The children were engaged in observing different kinds of creepy crawlies. They were able to explore and identify black and red ants, butterflies, and even a grasshopper. Through this activity, their curiosity was sparked, encouraging them to ask questions, make discoveries, and deepen their understanding of the natural world. They eagerly pointed out what they had observed, such as the different colours, sizes, and movements of the insects, and also shared their findings with their friends. These observations helped them develop their communication skills and strengthened their ability to describe and interpret what they see.

Kindergarten 2B

Language



The children increased their awareness of Indian culture as they learnt about how Deepavali, also known as the Festival of Lights, is celebrated. They participated in a hands-on activity where they explored the Diya lamp, and had conversations with their peers about it.



Gross Motor



The children actively participated in a gross motor activity where they had to incorporate two ball skills - bouncing and rolling. They enjoyed the activity so much that they kept score to see who won in the end. As the children were able to demonstrate the skills independently, there was very little facilitation required. Good job, kids!

Our preschoolers came together to celebrate Deepavali, and learnt about the significance of the Festival of Lights through art, music and hands-on experiences.

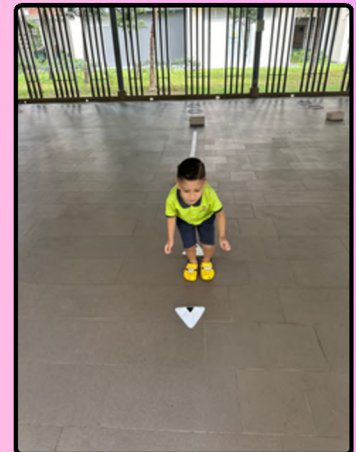
Learning Journey to Bird Paradise

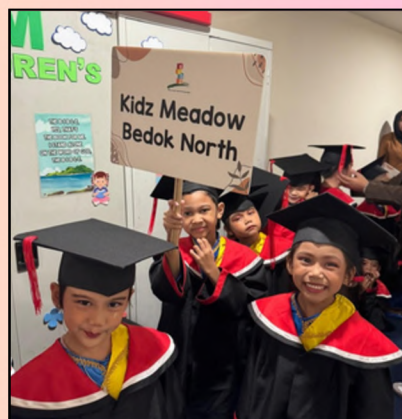
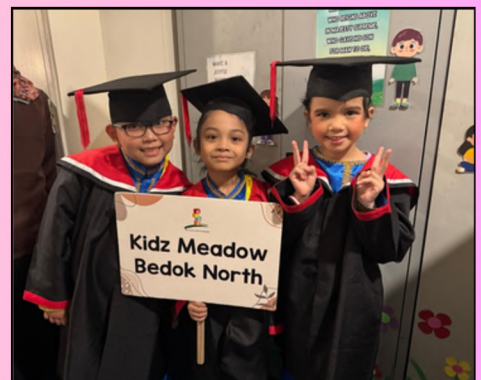

HEALTHY RECIPE: OLD SCHOOL COOKIE MONSTER

Plain cookies made with wholemeal flour for a wholegrain spin on the family's favourite cookie.

Ingredients

- 225 g plain flour
- 75 g of wholemeal flour
- 2 teaspoons of baking powder
- ½ teaspoon of salt
- 100 g of granulated sugar
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 100 ml of canola oil (with the Healthier Choice symbol)
- 2 teaspoons of vanilla extract



Preparation time: 20 minutes

Cooking time: 12 minutes

Serves: 20 children

Makes about 25 cookies (per piece 25 g)

Instructions

- Line parchment paper onto a baking sheet and pre heat oven to 200 degrees Celsius.
- Place all the dry ingredients into a mixing bowl and mix thoroughly.
- Make a well in the middle of mixing bowl and add eggs, canola oil and vanilla extract.
- Mix until all ingredients are combined. Use your hand to ensure that the ingredients are properly mixed.
- Pinch a portion of the dough (about 25 g) and roll into a ball the size of a golf ball.
- Place the rolled dough on the parchment paper. Allow sufficient space between the rolled dough as it will flatten during baking.
- Place the baking sheet into the preheated oven and bake for about 12 minutes or until the edges of the cookie turn golden brown.
- Remove cookies from the oven and allow to cool in an enclosed area that is not windy.

Tips

- During mixing, do not over knead the dough as it will cause the cookie to be hard.
- As wholemeal cookies are quite dense, they are best served with hot low fat milk which the child can dunk the cookie into while eating.
