

A VISIT TO THE FIRE STATION











The children explored their sense of taste by trying a slice of lemon. As they tasted the lemon, they experienced its strong sour flavour, leading to a range of expressive reactions. This simple activity encouraged sensory exploration, built vocabulary around taste (like 'sour' and 'zesty'), and helped children become more aware of how different foods feel and taste.

The toddlers experimented with different sounds using natural materials like leaves, sticks, stones, and seed pods. They tapped, rustled, scraped, and shook the items, noticing how each element produced a unique sound. This activity encouraged careful listening, creativity, and a deeper connection with nature.

The children ran and moved around the play area in response to the name of a vehicle called out by the teacher, such as 'car,' 'bus,' or 'train.' They pretended to be that vehicle and moved to tag the corresponding pictures, promoting physical coordination, listening skills, and imaginative play.

The children engaged in imaginative play by pretending to drive around the 'town', taking turns in steering their make-believe vehicles and following pretend road signs. As they navigated their way through the 'town', they interacted with one another by stopping at pretend shops, visiting community places, and even obeying traffic rules.

As part of their creative learning experience, the children designed their own doctor's bag artwork. They painted a piece of paper black to resemble a medical bag, and once the paint dried, they carefully pasted a bright red cross in the centre, a symbol universally associated with doctors and healthcare.





During their Young Chef activity, the children had a delightful time making their own yoghurt cups. They used fresh fruits like watermelon to create a colourful, healthy, and refreshing snack. It was a hands-on experience that encouraged healthy eating habits while allowing them to enjoy the fun of preparing their own food.

The children learnt the chest pass technique as part of their gross motor activities, focusing on developing their coordination and upper body strength. They practised throwing a ball from their chest using both hands, aiming to hit a specific target. Through fun and structured games, they practised turntaking and improved their accuracy and control, while also developing important gross motor skills.

The children explored the numeracy concepts of 'more' and 'less' through interactive, hands-on activities using a variety of manipulatives such as counters, cubes, and everyday objects. By physically grouping and comparing items, they were able to visually and tactilely understand differences in quantity. These playful learning experiences helped build foundational number sense, encouraged numeracy thinking, and made abstract ideas more concrete and meaningful for young learners.

The children were introduced to the Letterland character 'Peter Puppy' as part of their phonics learning. Through engaging stories, songs, and visuals, they learnt to recognise the letter 'P' and its corresponding sound. The children actively participated in identifying and naming objects that begin with the /p/ sound, such as 'pencil', 'pizza', and 'panda'. These activities helped reinforce their letter-sound recognition in a fun and memorable way, laying the foundation for early reading skills.

During the Nature Magnified lesson, the children engaged in a hands-on exploration of natural dyes by creating their own water colours from flower petals. They took turns carefully plucking petals of various colours and gently mixing them with water using simple tools like mortar and pestle or brushes. As they observed the colours being released, they learnt how natural materials can be transformed into art supplies.

During their phonics lesson on the letter 'P', children had the opportunity to create a delightful puppy puppet craft. Each child received a puppy template, which they carefully coloured and then pasted onto a brown envelope. By transforming the envelope into a puppet, the children combined phonics learning with a hands-on art activity that reinforced the recognition of the



As part of their ongoing exploration of Singapore's culture, the children were introduced to a well-loved local dessert: Ice Kacang, Through a guided discussion, they learnt about the different ingredients that make up this colourful treat. The children had the opportunity to observe, touch, and name each ingredient before tasting them individually. This sensory-rich activity not only deepened their understanding of local food culture but also sparked curiosity and appreciation for Singapore's diverse culinary heritage.

The children had fun exploring the number bonds of 7. Using two different materials, they tried out various combinations to find the pairs that add up to 7. This playful approach helped reinforce their number sense and deepened their understanding of basic addition in an enjoyable and interactive way.

The children engaged in a fun and interactive literacy activity where they learnt to identify and differentiate between the digraphs 'ch' and 'sh'. Using flashcards with various words and pictures, they practised sounding out each word and identified whether it began with 'ch' or 'sh'. They then grouped the flashcards accordingly, strengthening their phonics knowledge, sound recognition, and word decoding skills.



The children worked together to create a tree display for Singapore. With support from their parents, each child made a heartfelt card expressing gratitude or wishes for the country. They decorated the tree and proudly hung their cards, fostering national pride, creativity, and a strong sense of community. The tree stands as a meaningful symbol of unity and young voices for Singapore's future.

As part of the Nature Magnified lesson on exploring flowers in relation to customs and culture, the children learnt about flower garlands as a traditional accessory in Indian culture. They discovered how garlands are often used in celebrations, religious ceremonies, and to show respect or welcome guests. To extend their learning, the children worked together in small groups to create their own flower garlands using a variety of materials. This collaborative activity encouraged teamwork while deepening their understanding of how nature and tradition are beautifully intertwined.

The children were introduced to the basic concepts of force and simple machines, focusing on levers. To make learning hands-on and engaging, they explored how a catapult worked by building a simple model using everyday materials such as a clothespin, a DIY bucket, and pom-pom balls as the load. By pressing and releasing the clothespin, they observed how stored energy created force to launch the pom-poms.

The children explored the concept of addition through a fun and interactive activity involving a spinning wheel. Each spin revealed an addition sentence, which the children then solved using bean bags and balls as concrete manipulatives. For example, if the wheel landed on '3 + 2,' they would count out three bean bags and two balls, then combine them to find the total.



Spending 'Quality Time' to Build Your Parent—Child Relationship

Positive parent-child relationships are built on quality time. Time together is how you get to know about each other's experiences, thoughts, feelings and changing interests. This is great for your relationship with your child.

Quality time can happen anytime and anywhere, in the middle of ordinary days and situations. It can be a shared laugh when you're bathing your toddler or a good conversation in the car with your teenage child.

When you spend quality time with your child, you're showing that you value and appreciate her. You can take advantage of quality time to communicate powerful positive messages with your smiles, laughter, eye contact, hugs and gentle touches.

Try to plan some regular one-on-one time with each of your children. Children have different personalities, and some children might seem to need less time than others – but they'll all benefit from special time with you. On busy work days, you might not have a lot of one-on-one time with your children, but it's good to have longer interactions when you can.

The time you spend with your child also makes a difference to how he learns. For example, the time you spend talking with your child in the first three years of life helps him learn language.
