ooking ahead to 2024, we couldn't be more excited about the future of the College of Adaptive Arts. Over the past several months, our small but mighty college has been fortunate to receive local, state, and national recognition for our groundbreaking educational model for adults of all abilities.

In July, the County of Santa Clara provided CAA with \$250,000 to help expand access to new workforce apprenticeship programs for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). Santa Clara County Supervisor Joe Simitian championed these efforts after touring CAA, meeting with students, and seeing firsthand the need for more opportunities for adults with disabilities focused on critical thinking, problem-solving, and promoting situational awareness.

Shortly after that, California State Senator Dave Cortese (D-San Jose) announced a state investment in the 2024 budget to CAA for 2.2 million Dollars. Senator Cortese and his wife also toured CAA, talked with our students, and witnessed the tremendous impact that our school has on the community. The county of Santa Clara and the State of California are investing not just in our programs but in our students and their abilities and futures.

We broke records at our "Celebration of Inclusive Collegiate Partnerships" Gala Fundraiser in September, raising six figures for the first time, thanks in large part to our fundraising maven Dee Dee Kiesow. Our sponsors and donors showed up big time, and we are so grateful for all their support.

CAA hosted one of its most anticipated yearly events in October: the CAA Annual Golf Classic. We had more students participate than ever before, and it was truly a magical day. Later that month, CAA's co-founder, Dr. Pamela Lindsay, traveled to Washington, DC, to receive a prestigious national award from AARP. The AARP Purpose Prize is awarded to only a handful of non-profit leaders over the age of 50 who have had a tremendous impact on their communities. We couldn't be prouder of the trailblazing work Dr. Pam is doing to advance access to higher education for people of all abilities.

We continue to enjoy a beautiful, symbiotic relationship with West Valley College, which has welcomed us onto its campus and truly embraced our vision of community, inclusion, and education for all.

In the coming year, we will celebrate our 15th anniversary. It's a momentous feat, and we hope to gain 150 new recurring donors at the \$15 giving level. CAA's 2024 Giving Campaign

Sharon says that she learns just as much from her students as they learn from her, and she loves coming away from classes and hearing new perspectives and ideas.

According to Professor Sharon, CAA is a unique workplace because the leadership puts people in positions where they can thrive.

"This has been such a wonderful growth experience for me," said Professor Sharon. "I feel incredibly lucky to be a part of a supportive environment which celebrates caring and collaborative teamwork."

Faced with what she wanted to do next, Paula enrolled in West Valley College and was introduced to CAA through

At CAA, Noah takes classes like Voice Acting, Graduate Theater, Shakespeare's Heartbeat, Technical Theater and Design, and Introduction to Employment Skills. When he is not in class, Noah enjoys traveling and hopes to take a trip to Korea over the New Year's holiday. He also enjoys hiking and going to the movies,

especially historical films. Noah also loves spicy foods and holds the unique distinction of trying the world's spiciest gummy bear.

Noah wants people to know he is a nice, friendly guy who likes to challenge himself and test his limits.

"There will always be people who judge you," said Noah. "But what's there to be scared of? I say, always give it everything you have!"



Noah Kang moved to Cupertino from Michigan when he was five years old and had a great life growing up. He loved school and described himself as a "super nerd" whose idol was Albert Einstein.

When Noah was 12 years old, he was in a horrible car accident which left him with a traumatic brain injury and he was hospitalized for nearly four months.

After his accident, Noah said he had a "hard reset" and had to relearn everything. It was a new territory he didn't know how to navigate.


