for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the
sin of my soul?”
- ⁸ He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the
LORD require of you but to do justice and to love kindness
and to walk humbly with your God?

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:18-31

A reading from 1 Corinthians.

¹⁸ The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us
who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written,

“I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,
and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart.”

²⁰ Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scholar? Where is the debater of this
age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since, in the wisdom
of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the
foolishness of the proclamation, to save those who believe. ²² For Jews ask for signs
and Greeks desire wisdom, ²³ but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to
Jews and foolishness to gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are the called, both Jews and
Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ For God’s foolishness is
wiser than human wisdom, and God’s weakness is stronger than human strength.

²⁶ Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by
human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. ²⁷ But God
chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the
world to shame the strong; ²⁸ God chose what is low and despised in the world,
things that are not, to abolish things that are, ²⁹ so that no one might boast in the
presence of God. ³⁰ In contrast, God is why you are in Christ Jesus, who became for
us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, ³¹ in
order that, as it is written, “Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.”


