Pastor's Reflections

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

***Blow the trumpet in Zion;
sound the alarm on my holy mountain!***

***Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for
the day of the Lord is coming, it is near -
a day of darkness and gloom,***

a day of clouds and thick darkness!

***Yet even now, says the Lord,
return to me with all your heart,***

***With fasting, with weeping, and
with mourning. (Joel 2:1-2, 12)***

The days of Lent, especially Ash Wednesday, invite us into a time when we come face to face with our mortality. A time when we come to know at a very deep level that dying is part of life. The church stands contrary to society and culture in that it chooses not to ignore this reality. Society prefers the dying to be closed away in separated hospital wards. Talk of death and dying are rarely topics of discussion even when they become reality for friends or loved ones.

The church boldly declares once every year that there is no avoiding death. And yet at the same time provides a means to understand death as people in Christ. Ashes, the sign of death, are put on the forehead not in some random pattern but in the shape of a cross. A reminder that yes, you will die. But you can die in Christ, whose death transforms your own death.

The placing of ashes has been a ritual and tradition in the Church for centuries. Many denominations impose ashes on ASH Wednesday (made from the palm branches from the previous year's Palm/Passion Sunday service) as a reminder that we will all return to dust...but that the final sting of death will not touch us under the cross of Christ.

***"Remember, O mortal, that you are dust; and to
dust you shall return." (Gen. 3:19)***

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, DECEMBER 15, 2025, 6:00 P.M.

Neil Juedes led opening devotions.

Reports:

November Meeting Minutes: The November Council minutes were reviewed. Kalynn Pempek moved and Neil Juedes seconded a motion to approve the November minutes. Motion passed.

Financial Reports: October Financial Reports were provided via email. Dina Santangelo moved



and Michael Klapperich seconded a motion to accept the financial reports as presented.

Committee Reports:

- **Pastor's Report:** Presided and preached seven Sunday and six Thursday worship services. Participated as assisting minister in the Thanksgiving worship at Saint Andrew Lutheran Church. Presided at the funeral services of Alan Sexton and Joyce Utecht. Met with three prospective new members. Will have a cake reception for new members and they will be asked to wear nametags to identify them as new member. Attended the Wisconsin River Valley Conference meeting on December 9. Assisted with Christmas program practice and attended committee night.
- **Parish Ed** – Nothing to report.
- **Worship & Music** – Advent decorations on the Christmas trees will be swapped for Christmas ornaments after the December 21 worship service. Glow sticks will be provided for children attending the Christmas Eve services. Pastor Mary will purchase the glow sticks. Traditional lessons and hymns will be the content of the December 28 service.
- **Stewardship** – Discussed Christmas cards for homebound members, thank you cards, and Christmas flowers to be delivered December 19.
- **Church & Society** – Community supper will take place December 21. Lori and Matt Heyne will need support. Discussed The Neighbors' Place food pantry volunteering. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day will be celebrated on January 16, 2026 from 5:30-8:30 p.m. at Marathon Park East Gale Hall. United Way is another volunteer opportunity.
- **Property** – Nothing to report.
- **Youth** – There will be a meeting in January to gauge interest in the 2027 youth gathering in Minneapolis, MN and related fundraising. Other topics discussed were the February lock-in, Ash Wednesday soup supper and a sandwich fundraiser on Super Bowl Sunday.

- **Wage & Policy** – Nothing to report.
- **Fair Stand** – Nothing to report
- **Treasure Sale** – Nothing to report.

Old Business:

- **Narthex Screen** – Council viewed a demonstration of the screen setup last month. The monitor can display pictures and slides. There's a monthly subscription to a portal which allows us to sign in and upload content. The contract for the portal provides virtual training and tech support. The cost of the device is approximately \$1,300 with an additional monthly subscription. The only other expense would be for an electrician to run power to the device. Pastor Mary and potentially office staff would be the point of contact for generating content updates. Russ Michalski moved and Dina Santangelo seconded the motion to authorize purchase of equipment for the AV display, subscription cost and electrical expense. Motion passed. The installation logistics will be under the Property Committee.
- **Cancellation Policy** – We are having issues contacting Channel 7 to update our account to the new First English email. Will continue to try to contact them. A policy is in place for the pastor and council president to make the decision to cancel services.
- **Realm Introduction Committees:** At the January 6, 2026 Committee Night, Sharon Hunter will provide an introduction to Realm including downloading the app and creating a profile for all committee members. Step-by-step directions will be provided. After the presentation Committees will meet as usual.

New Business:

- **Annual Report Deadline: January 15, 2026 send electronically** – Committee reports need to be sent to Deb Kluetz electronically. It was suggested that the annual report be put on our Website.

- **Annual Meeting: February 8, 2026.** – The Tech Committee is discussing having a Realm demonstration and help stations to assist people with activating the Realm app. Still being discussed.
- **Committee Reports** – Reports need to be written and turned in to the church council and the office. Deb Kluetz needs to be informed if something needs to be printed in the bulletin.
- **Joint Wausau ELCS Church Housing Assistance Ministry** – St. Stephens and Good Shepherd Churches have been giving assistance to homeless people moving into housing. They help with security deposits and rent. They work with someone who is an employee of the Police Department in charge of low-income housing. They wanted to invite other churches in the community to join in the effort with contributions to help this cause. Pastor Jack from Saint Andrew is working on process and procedures and will share with congregations and presidents.
- **The Neighbors' Place** – The Neighbors' Place expressed their appreciation of our increased contributions in November and December to their food bank.
- **Endowment Disbursement:** Endowment distribution recommendations were reported for the fourth quarter of 2025. The Endowment Committee recommended the fourth quarter distribution of \$9,412.01 to be distributed as follows: 10% reinvested (\$941.20). The Benevolence Disbursements of \$6,250.00 as follows: ELCA Synod (\$1,000.00); ELCA World Hunger (\$800.00); Lutheran Social Services (\$500.00); Crossway Camp (\$500.00); ELCA Missionary (\$900.00); Lutheran Disaster Response (\$400.00); Greater Wausau Christian Services (\$300.00); Homme Home Foundation (\$300.00); and NAOMI (\$250.00); Miscellaneous (\$1,300.00). Michael Vaningen moved and Russ Michalski seconded a motion to accept the endowment distribution as presented.

- Motion passed.
- **Nominating Committee** – Neil Juedes indicated that a good list of names has been put together for council nominations. The committee will begin the calling process.

Next Meeting Date: Monday, January 19, 2026

A motion to adjourn was made by Neil Juedes and seconded by Mike Vaningen. Meeting adjourned.

A LENTEN PRAYER **by Henri Nouwen (1932-1996)**

The Lenten season begins. It is a time to be with you, Lord, in a special way, a time to pray, to fast, and thus to follow you on your way to Jerusalem, to Golgotha, and to the final victory over death.

I am still so divided. I truly want to follow you, but I also want to follow my own desires and lend an ear to the voices that speak about prestige, success, pleasure, power, and influence. Help me to become deaf to these voices and more attentive to your voice, which calls me to choose the narrow road to life. I know that Lent is going to be a very hard time for me. The choice for your way has to be made every moment of my life. I have to choose thoughts that are your thoughts, words that are your words, and actions that are your actions. There are no times or places without choices. And I know how deeply I resist choosing you. Please, Lord, be with me at every moment and in every place. Give me the strength and the courage to live this season faithfully, so that, when Easter comes, I will be able to taste with joy the new life that you have prepared for me. Amen.

(Henri Nouwen was a Dutch Catholic priest, professor, and a renowned writer and theologian.)

FAITH'S ROLE IN LOVE



In *It's Okay Not to Be Okay*, Christian author Sheila Walsh looks at the all-encompassing love that Jesus expects of his followers. He commands us to “love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself” (Luke 10:27, ESV).

But we can't love that way without faith, Walsh writes. “I'm not living by faith if I have an answer to everything. If I understand everything God does or doesn't do, then all I need to love him with is my mind. We're called to love him with more.” That “more,” she explains, involves these paradoxes: “We love with all our heart, even when it's broken. We love with our soul, even when our humanity wrestles against our situation. We love with our strength, even when it's almost gone. We love with our mind, even when we don't understand.”

Even if God's purposes and plans don't make sense here on earth, we can heed this advice from the great preacher Charles Spurgeon: “When we cannot trace [God's] hand, we must trust his heart.”


