

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, MAY 19, 2025, 6:00 P.M.

Members Present: Jenny Blaschka, Karen Czechowicz, Angela Greenfield, Cindy Hermel, Michael Klapperich, Russ Michalski, Dina Santangelo, Nicholas Schumacher, Lois Stasko, Mike Vaningan, Marla Zumann and Pastor Mary Zupansic. Scott Kufahl (guest)

Lois Stasko led the opening devotions.

Reports:

April Meeting Minutes: The April Council minutes were reviewed. Mike Vaningan moved and Lois Stasko seconded a motion to approve the April minutes. Motion passed.

Financial Reports: March Financial Reports were sent out via e-mail. The April Financial Reports have not yet been received from Wausau Tax & Accounting.

Committee Reports:

- Parish Ed Discussed cradle roll, which is a display that will keep track of baptisms/births. Received a youth roster to help plan activities. Kids in Mission will be two and a half days--the dates to be determined. Discussed 2025-26 education schedules consisting of two-year-olds through confirmation. Four- and five-year-olds might be split in two different classes.
- Worship & Music Pastor Mary Zupansic and Dan Larson will meet to work out details for music for summer. Summer music events may include hymn sing once a month, Christmas in July, the use of With One Music and the white contemporary soft bound hymnals. Regarding communion, individual prefilled glasses will be used for the wine. Trays will be on the altar for the Eucharist

blessing along with communion sets that can be used for home-bound visitation. Pastor Mary will order a wine glass purificator. Gluten-free wafers will be offered for those who need them and set aside in a designated place during communion. We will be looking into setting up a children's pray-ground in the front of the church for Pre-K school age children where the parents can be close for supervision, as needed, during the service.

- Stewardship Thank you cards were written.
 Will begin planning Stewardship packets in August.
- Church & Society Discussed Boys & Girls Club volunteer event. The volunteer survey consisting of places to volunteer was discussed. Habitat for Humanity Rock the Block event is looking for intergenerational group volunteers for Friday, July 18. Will volunteer in June to sort diapers for The Neighbors' Place/Babies Place. God's Will Our Hands volunteer activities are planned for September 7 to include Arts Festival and Children's Imginarium.
- Property Jenny Blaschka mentioned that she noticed some loose floor tiles and paint peeling caused by water seepage from the window wells. The bathroom off the narthex also has some tiles that came loose. The Property Committee to see if they can be glued down and possibly get covers to the window wells. Scott Kufahl to contact the person that cleans our gutters to see if extra downspouts can be added. The cylinder for our elevator repair has been ordered and will be stored downstairs at the end of June.
- Youth Nothing to report.
- Wage & Policy Nothing to report
- Fair Stand The rental of the facility has been paid for. Planning a meeting in June to solicit ideas on how to do things better and verify the menu.
- Treasure Sale Nothing to report.

Old Business:

- acknowledging Pastor Barry Levine, Pastors Bill and Tryphine Schruba this Sunday. Will have a card with their gift. Cindy Hermel made some colorful heart cards to write individual personalized notes to present to them. There will be flowers in church in appreciation of the service along with refreshments and treats. An appreciation acclamation will be read after the announcements.
- Pastor Mary's Installation July 20th is the date for the installation. The Synod and Pastor Asher are available for the afternoon on that date. It was decided to do only one service in the afternoon and cancel the Sunday morning and Thursday services.
- Goal Data Review The Welcome Visitors
 Group met and came up with a list of helpful tips for further consideration: 1) Create a single use visitor card for pews in a neon color to be more visual. 2) Identify who receives visitor cards and is responsible for follow up communications with the visitor(s). It was suggested the Stewardship Committee send a message to visitors thanking them for attending and inviting them to return.
 - 3) Create welcome packets for visitors (brochures with colorful pictures of various FELC activities, bookmark, stress ball with note; Life is stressful, you are loved).
 - 4) Develop welcome statements.
 - 5) Welcome signage created by children and display in church. 6) Create a tab on FELC Website for visitors/newcomers. 7) Display photos of FELC activities and share announcements on screen/projector.
 - 8) FELC tee shirts: Create three designs, display and have congregation vote on which one to order. Cindy Hermel to summarize the goals the Council came up with to help develop an action plan.
- Cancelation Communication Plan Realm has the capability for mass emailing/text messaging through Constant Contact. For an extra fee, mass messages can be sent out

to give notice of service cancellation. A small telephone tree is planned for those that do not use smart phone technology.

New Business:

- First English Tee Shirts Angela
 Greenfield's daughter will come with three
 designs to have congregation vote on their
 favorite. Suggested we create a new logo to
 mesh with a recognizable visual of the
 church. Also suggested utilizing youth
 artwork. The timeline ideally would be
 completed for use at the fair.
- Door Replacement Cost Received a quote from Complete Control Inc. for audio/video intercom and keypad entry for the Cedar Street for \$5,721.34. The Council previously approved this security system for up to \$5,000. Jenny Blaschka moved and Russ Michalski seconded that motion to approve the total amount of \$5,721.34. Motion passed.
- Narthex Photo Display (Old school & Digital) Looking at having an electronic display for the opportunities we offer at FELC. Michael Klapperich and Pastor Mary Zupansic volunteered to work on options on what works best for our building.
- July Council Meeting Pastor Mary Zupansic suggested the Council and committees take a break in July to refresh. Mike Vaningan moved, and Nicholas Schumacher seconded a motion to take a break in July. Motion passed.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jenny Blaschka and seconded by Dina Santangelo. Meeting adjourned.



"Lord, remember me"

The funeral of renowned evangelist Billy Graham was a celebration — not of the preacher's long life and many accomplishments but of his arrival in heaven. Graham, who died at age 99 in February 2018, was confident he'd spend eternity with Jesus but knew the reason wasn't his own status or actions.

Graham knew he was a sinner in need of forgiveness. "I still need the cross," he said.

Graham added, "I am not going to heaven because I have preached to great crowds or read the Bible many times. I'm going to heaven just like the thief on the cross who said in that last moment: 'Lord, remember me.'"



Whatever the Weather

No matter the forecast, weather can remind us of God's presence:

- When it's sunny, remember that Jesus is the light of the world (John 8:12).
- When it's cloudy, remember that God often spoke to and guided his people from a cloud (Exodus 13:21-22.)
- During a thunderstorm, remember the thunder and lightning when God beckoned Moses to Mount Sinai (Exodus 19:16).
- When it rains or snows, remember that God's Word serves his purpose just as precipitation does (Isaiah 55:10-11).
- When it's windy, remember that "a wind from God" came at Creation (Genesis 1:2), and God's Holy Spirit arrived at Pentecost like a mighty wind (Acts 2:2).
