② Write down three things you're grateful for and reflect on them.


② Volunteer your time or resources to support local charities. Take time to thank God for both the big and small blessings in your life.



Reports:

August Meeting Minutes: The August Council minutes were reviewed. Jenny Blaschka moved, and Neil Juedes seconded a motion to approve the August minutes. Motion passed.

Financial Reports: July and August Financial Reports were e-mailed. Mike Vaningan moved and Jenny Blaschka seconded a motion to accept the financial reports. Motion passed.

Committee Reports:

- Pastor's Report: Pastor Mary Zupansic provided a written pastor's report. She led and preached for Rally Day Sunday and prepared backpack blessing tags. Met with Dan Larson to review plans for worship services through Reformation Sunday. Thank you to Pat Severt, Pastors Tryphine and Barry Schruba for leading services while recovering from a broken arm and surgery. In the process of setting up a meeting with our sacramental visitors to review the ministry and consider how to expand/enhance it. Working on a Saturday morning workshop for children and parents in preparation for First Communion. Prepared the Stewardship letter, estimate of giving card, and weekly plan, which will be emphasized in October. Need some volunteers to help with a pet blessing.
- Parish Ed Discussed blessings in a backpack. New Teachers for 3-year olds, 4-year olds, second grade & fourth grade will be Gracin Dittmar and Mia Lodahl. Five-year olds through fifth grade teachers are Jenny Blaschka and Dilynn Koehler. Confirmation will consist of three rotating teachers who will be Pastor Mary Zupansic, Amy Abitz, and Nina Dittmar. Will announce a Mission Sunday school supplies collection. Signs will be made and posted on Sunday school classroom doors. The Christmas program will be December 14, 2025 and will include a puppet production. Rally Sunday will use toolbox for faith.org.
- Worship & Music Working on four themed services that will include an activity.
 Planning should be completed by the end of September and should incorporate time and talent collection.
- Stewardship There will be changes to Stewardship forms for this year. Pastor Mary

- will finalize the cover letter sent with stewardship materials.
- Church & Society Topics Discussed: To discuss God's Work Our Hands homes project with other local ELCA churches on September 14, 2025. FELC will provide fruit trays, coleslaw and coolers. Jim Kraft requested and received a \$250.00 Thrivent grant for this project. The Labor Day parade route changed, which resulted in no outreach. Will continue to look for additional outreach opportunities. Habitat Women Build participants were Dina Santangelo and Lynne Santangelo. Information on Habitat for Humanity volunteer opportunities will be printed in the bulletin. Discussed fall forum Wired Word. Discussed the possibility for a kids' table at the Christmas Treasure Sale with small gifts i.e., stickers, coloring books etc. Will have a guest speaker in October. Jenny Blaschka asked if there's a way to find out if there's any interest in doing activities with other congregations' youth.
- **Property** Fans in the church are not mechanically sound and need to be replaced. Mike Vaningan got a quote from Cunico Electric to replace all six fans for \$3,400. Also got a quote for replacing and adding more downspouts on the church from B&R Seamless Gutters for a little less than \$1,500. Window wells covers are needed and they need to be customized because of the size. Looking at replacing the two doors near the Fireside room and the front Cedar Street side door with automatic closers that automatically lock. In the process of getting a quote. Outside spigots need to be fixed or replaced. Will look into replacing all the phones so that we have the ability to transfer calls. The lighting at the altar needs to be replaced because the lighting is too yellow for recording. Will also have someone look at our recess lights and see how that can be improved along with several other small lighting update. Jenny Blaschka requested we purchase a wide-spread commercial vacuum cleaner. Jenny will get some quotes.

She also mentioned that we need to get the carpet cleaned. Expenditures will be calculated and approved at the next Council meeting.

- Youth There's a possibility of a Youth gathering at the end of October. Sunday school is going well.
- Wage & Policy Nothing to report.
- Fair Stand On October 13, the committee
 will meet to finalize total profits and discuss
 how the money will be allocated. Bills are
 still being paid but when finalized, a report
 will be given to the Council.
- **Treasure Sale** Mini-Christmas sale will take place in November.

Old Business:

- First English T Shirts Tabled due to time constraints.
- Retain Current & Attract New Members
 Goal Data Update The group finalized gift
 packages for guests. They wanted to make
 sure they communicated to users and
 greeter on how to recognize new visitors to
 give gifts to. The other goal is to retain current
 members by developing fellowship and
 commodity. In the next meeting, they will
 review the list the Council came up with to
 see if ideas can be incorporated.
- Cancelation Notification Procedure Cindy Hermel has the contact information for Channel 7. We have a dial-in number and password for us to communicate cancellations through television scrolls. Channel 9 has not answered back. Other ideas were to create an e-mail blast that could be sent as a group e-mail about closures along with posting on Facebook. Would also like to add a text blast but more information is need on how that works incorporating our Realm system.
- Realm Conference Update Sharon Hunter and Cindy Hermel are registered for the conference. The sessions are tailored for what FELC needs and should be very beneficial to our congregation.

New Business:

- Thanksgiving Service Musical directors usually worked out partnering of services.
- I-pads for visually impaired A couple of people have given a gift for purchase of a new iPad
- Smart TV: Confirmation Curriculum A smart TV has been added in the youth room for on-line lessons.
- Bulletin Prayer Lists Pastor Zupansic has been approached about the prayer list. The consideration is to just print prayer lists in the Lantern and not the bulletins to condense the size. Need to limit the time individual are on the prayer list and extended only on request. Suggested just have new prayer concerns for the week when a call comes into the office.
- **Endowment Disbursement:** Endowment distribution recommendations were reported for the 2nd Quarter of 2025. The Endowment Committee recommended the second quarter distribution of \$9,409.75 to be distributed as follows: 10% reinvested (\$940.98) and 30% education option (\$2,168.77). The Benevolence Disbursements of \$6,300.00 as follows: ELCA Synod (\$1,000.00); ELCA World Hunger (\$500.00); Lutheran Social Services (\$400.00); Crossway Camp (\$400.00); ELCA Missionary (\$800.00); Lutheran Disaster Response (\$300.00); Greater Wausau Christian Services (\$250.00); Homme Home Foundation (\$250.00); and NAOMI (\$200.00); Miscellaneous (\$2,200.00). Mike Vaningan moved and Jenny Blaschka seconded a motion to accept the endowment distribution as presented. Motion passed.
- Immanuel Lutheran Church sent FELC a check for \$5,000 upon the closing of their congregation on September 10, 2025. A very nice letter accompanied the check crediting the generosity of giving from their member. Immanuel also offered a lot of choir music that Dan Larson will look into. The money will be held for future use.

 Amy Abitz asked if she could borrow the long tables and a couple Nesco roasters for an event for her son on Oct. 1. Council approved.
