

Per the policy of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe in regards to the Sacrament of the Eucharist (First Communion): "It is the responsibility of parishes to provide programs for all children and parents preparing for the celebration of First Reconciliation and the First Eucharist" and in regards to the Sacrament of Confirmation: "Parents or Guardians of Confirmation candidates are expected to participate in any meetings or classes required by the parish" and "sponsors should participate in sessions with candidates, and they are expected to participate in sessions specifically designed for sponsors." Our parish provides such programs for both parents and sponsors.

This year our focus will be on the Eucharist as part of the National Eucharistic Revival where we are invited to deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ, Our Lord, through the celebration of the Eucharist.



The schedule for each unit of classes is listed below. The cost for each unit will depend on the cost of the resources used. **REMEMBER**: however, money should not prevent you from attending.


