Parish Council

The Parish Council met on the 14th March 2024. Councillors present at the meeting were Penny Bean (Chairman), Marcus Oxendale, Sally Wright, Dave Smith, Sam Warriner and Phillip Lazenby. Louise Pink – Clerk. 1 member of the public.

The following new planning application was received for consideration this month:-

ZE23/01660/MFUL Land Off Daskett Hill Sheriff Hutton.

Change of use of agricultural and equestrian land to allow the siting of 24no. holiday lodges, 1no. wardens lodge and 1no. reception/shop with associated access, parking, infrastructure and landscaping (revised detail to planning approval 20/00701/MFUL dated 15.11.2021).

RESUBMISSION.

Decision – The Parish Council object to this planning application, on the following grounds:-

The Parish Council feel there is insufficient detail on the planning application with many details missing.

The original planning application stated a certain type of lodge. This planning application provides no details of the material to be used.

The infrastructure for 24 lodges cannot be the same for 16 lodges.

The village has a commitment to support its local amenities. The planning application proposes a new shop. The village does not need a 2nd shop.

Over development of the site.

The location is too close to neighbours.

The development would create too many car movements on a dangerous hill.

It is vital that the occupancy must be partial only and not fully residential, in line with other holiday sites in the village.

No planning decisions were received this month.

Also, please be aware that you do not need to sign up to anything straight away – please take advice before entering into any contract. In relation to recent information supplied by broadband suppliers to some residents – the Parish Council do not believe that landlines will be lost.

Trees The Parish Council would like to request that if residents have any issues with any trees in the village that they are reported to the clerk. Action must not be taken by any resident to prune any trees themselves.

Sheriff Hutton History Group

In the middle of February, we had our first meeting this year when Malcolm Brooke gave us a fascinating talk on the "Baedecker Raid" on York during WW2. This was an afternoon meeting and attendance exceeded all expectations with 12 members and 32 visitors – a superb turnout.

Malcom talked us through the defences and air raid precautions in an around York, including the considerable night fighter coverage and made the point that the city was by any reckoning a "legitimate target" with factories making aircraft parts, gun and bomb sights, ammunition and other wartime manufacturing industries in full swing.

He remarked that there was actually no reason to assume that the Germans used the Baedecker guides to establish targets – the term only arose because of the comment by a German propagandist that "we will use the Baedecker Guide to flatten all of England's 3 star cities" – there is no evidence that this was actually the case.

The raid on the 27th April 1942 was one of several on the city and was by no means a particularly large one; some 75 tons of bombs and some 100 incendiary clusters being dropped and the indications are that the aiming point was the station complex.

We were shewn photos of the damage and told about some extraordinary survival stories, but some 115 people died in the raid and apart from extensive damage to the station, engines and rolling stock, the Guildhall was destroyed and a great deal of damage done to housing and infrastructure.

This was a superb talk and of the greatest interest and we are most grateful to Malcom for sharing his extensive knowledge with us.

Coming Up

On April 24th we will be holding our AGM at 7.00 pm in the Miss Ward Room in the Methodist Chapel. After the formal business has been concluded at about 7.30pm we will be going on a virtual tour around the village – we'll use pictures, artefacts and memorabilia from our archive store to peer into village secrets and historical events and to pose the question by means of a light-hearted quiz – "how well do you REALLY know our village?"

This should be a great opportunity for an informal meeting and enjoyable gathering of friends and fellow villagers and a chance to enjoy some light refreshments such as cheese nibbles, cakes and non-alcoholic drinks.

The last talk of the year before the club begins its garden and nursery visits, will be on Wednesday 17th April at the Village Hall. Sarah Owen Hughes will be speaking on 'Science in the Garden', beginning at 19.30.

Gardening Tips Apparently, slugs are our new best friends! Not something gardeners are going to agree with. The dry spring last year gave some respite from the onslaught, but this year is completely different - so watch out. Encourage birds, frogs and toads into your garden for some help. Grit, oatmeal or any other dry material spread round vulnerable plants will reduce the slug's advance.

It's time to cut back the stems which have given us so much colour over the winter - cornus and willow - to encourage fresh new stems for another year. The pruned material can be used in the garden as plant supports. They may root but that's all to the good if more plants are needed or friends would like some. If you haven't cut back your hardy fuchsias or buddleias it isn't too late; they will just flower later in the season when there are more butterflies about to feed on them. Lavenders and woody salvias showing new growth down the stems can be reduced in size to prevent legginess, but cutting down into bare wood can kill them.

However, spring pans out there will be some successes and some failures.


