Sheriff Hutton History Group

This month Tony Morgan returned to Sheriff Hutton to give us a most interesting talk on Margaret Clitherow – the York Catholic woman who was ultimately the victim of both the religious ferment of the late 16th century and the contorted political and legal systems pertaining at that time. Tony described Margaret Middleton's early life in a prosperous Protestant family in York and explained some of the political scene that existed there during and after the reign of Queen Mary. Margaret's father died in 1567 and her mother them married Henry Maye who was later to become Mayor of York.

In 1571 Margaret married John Clitherow another York businessman who had inherited land and grazing in the Cornborough area. John's brother was a Catholic priest (and as such subject to execution if found and arrested) and in 1574 Margaret converted to Catholicism herself. At that time recusant Catholics were subject to numerous civil penalties and general harassment by the authorities including fines and imprisonment for not attending the established church services on Sundays, and while her husband and stepfather did pay various fines and seem to have arranged for some of her "misdemeanours" to be overlooked, she was nevertheless in and out of prison in York on several occasions in common with other Catholic ladies with whom she was friendly.

Regardless of these events and having had three children, one born in prison, she became more deeply involved with the Catholic underground, harbouring priests in her house in the Shambles and allowing Mass to be performed there. Inevitably this led to her arrest and arraignment before the York Assizes, when she refused to plead innocent or guilty, a capital offence in itself. Being pregnant again, the law did not allow for her punishment until after the birth of her child and the Judge refused to take action. However the Assizes moved on to another town and her fate then lay in the hands of the York Corporation, who chose to ignore the law and since she still refused to plead, despite the urgings of her husband and her step-father the Mayor, sentenced her to "peine fort et dure" – crushing to death under her own door. She died in 1586 and has since been proclaimed as a martyr and made a saint.

Time to think again of our Hedgehogs

In this year of the 40th anniversary of the launch of the British Hedgehog Preservation Group and with Hedgehog awareness week 1-7 May it is time to think of our local hedgehogs. Recent research is indicating that urban populations may be stabilising but that is not the case in rural areas where numbers are continuing to decline.

Hedgehogs are now well out of hibernation and feeding up. Please think of them and check before strimming particularly under overhanging foliage and shrubs as this causes many injuries. Please be aware using metaldehyde slug pellets is now banned from 1st Apr2022 for use outside. If you can leave a dish of water outside particularly in dry weather.

If you have hedgehogs visiting, they like hedgehog food, kitten biscuits, meaty canned pet food and calciworms as a treat, but not mealworms which can make them very ill. See www.britishhedgehogs.ork.uk/feeding on how to make a simple hedgehog feeding station to restrict access to pets.

If you see a hedgehog out in the day (except when disturbed) and it looks lethargic or confused/wobbly please seek help for it. Note adult females may be out in the day with final nest preparations or when feeding young but will be moving purposely unless frightened.

Sheriff Hutton Gardening Club

The club's programme of garden visits starts with a trip on Wednesday 18 May to Brodsworth Hall near Doncaster, an English Heritage property with a beautifully restored Victorian house and garden. Members offering or needing a car share place should meet at the village hall by 1.30pm. Those travelling independently should be at Brodsworth by 2.30 pm.

The club is having a plant stall at the village hall on the Jubilee Fun Day on Saturday 4 June, so stop and have a chat and, perhaps, buy a plant or two.

Gardening tips

Having a week of summer in March was unusual but useful for giving the garden an end of winter blitz. It did, however, bring forward a lot of spring flowering plants, offering some lovely displays.

May sees the beginning of the evergreen pruning/clipping period, which runs through to September. Buxus, however, should traditionally be left until Derby Day at the beginning of June. Stoned fruit trees - plum, cherry for example - should be pruned through the summer to avoid disease. Annual seeds can be sown direct into the ground's warming soil and, of course, there are always lots of temptations to be had in the garden centre. The end of May sees off the last of the frosts bringing us into the summer.

Sheriff Hutton Nature Group (formerly Sheriff Hutton Field Naturalists Group)

At our recent April evening meeting Keith Gittens of the Yorkshire Dragonfly Group educated us on the life history of the dragonfly and also gave us illustrated tips on identifying dragonflies we are likely to see. All the amazing photographs shown had been taken by him and included some local sites. I think we were all inspired to take a closer look at them this summer.

In May, a week later than usual on Wednesday, 11th May at 7.30 pm at the Sheriff Hutton Methodist Church Hall we welcome Dr Barry Wright, Principal Ecologist. Barry is going to talk about hedgerows, in relation to their age and history and significant ecological value. We will learn how to date hedgerows using natural indicators, and hear about the wealth of other plants, birds, animals and insects that make their homes in and around hedgerows. We are currently planning to use some of the skills Barry has taught us to survey an ancient hedge in Sheriff Hutton over the summer which will provide much historical and ecological information which will be of wider interest in the village.

All welcome to this talk – non-members £2 on the night. Membership for the full year is £12.50. We are welcoming new members to the Group who share a love of nature.

As an update to members, Sally Harrop has come onto the committee to fill the secretary role. This role will now include coordinating, setting up the programme of evening talks and other activities. Peace on Earth Goodwill to all... thoughts from Revd. Steve, May 2022.

'Peace on Earth Goodwill to all,' this is usually associated with Christmas and the birth of Jesus, yet I find myself reaching for this phrase in this the season of Easter (*Easter Day to Pentecost (05 June*)). Why you may wonder do I am mixing my seasons; the answer is fairly simple allow me to explain.

At Christmas we look forward with eager anticipation for all that we hope Christmas brings – hope, joy, peace. Easter Day, the day we commemorate the Resurrection of Jesus – new beginnings, new life, fresh starts, new hope...

With all that is happening in the world as I write this letter, peace seems in short supply, tensions are high and anxiety raised. Naturally, we are and should be concerned when disorder and confusion reign; we have had a lot to deal with in recent years enduring the pandemic and now conflict in Europe with war in Ukraine. If you are like me all this turbulence and the instability it brings makes me wish for calmer times and the restoration of peace or at least peacefulness.

You may not want me to remind you of the turmoil on our European doorstep, but this brings me directly back to Easter. Easter is not just about Jesus dying and coming back to life. Easter is about celebrating our new life through him.

Pope Francis speaking of Easter said, "We proclaim the resurrection of Christ when his light illuminates the dark moments of our existence." At Midnight Mass we should read the prologue of the Gospel of John chapter one, verses 1-14; verse five gives us, 'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.' Jesus came to bring light and life and through his resurrection has gifted to humanity the gift of eternal life. The resurrection is at the core of our beliefs as Christians. Without it, our faith is meaningless. It is through the eyes of faith that I view the world today and to quote Pope Francis again, "God is love and he has defeated evil."

In this season of Easter up until the Day of Pentecost, whether you have a faith or not, hope for and if you will, pray for an outpouring of peace.

I leave you with this Celtic blessing.

Deep peace of the moving waves to you, Deep peace of the flowing air to you Deep peace of the quiet earth to you, Deep peace of the shining stars to you Deep peace of the shepherds' watch to you, Deep peace of the Son of Peace to you And the blessing of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, be with you all, evermore. Amen.

Much interest was shown in the information, photographs and artwork produced in some of the year's tutored workshops and the delightful school children's artwork was praised.

We were very pleased that the raffle of Patrick Smith's original abstract painting collected over £200 for the Red Cross's Appeal Fund for Ukraine.

The refreshment room was constantly busy with the hum of visitors sharing lively conversation. Many thanks must go to all the members who volunteered to help over the two days and to the committee for the excellent work they carried out in the background to ensure another successful exhibition.
