Parish Council

The Parish Council met on the 12th October 2022. Councilors' present at the meeting were Penny Bean (Chairman) Marcus Oxendale, Dave Smith, Ed Stephenson, Sally Wright and Sam Warriner.

The following new application was received for consideration:

22/00539/FUL Middleton house, Finkle Street, Sheriff Hutton

Erection of rear two story extension to form additional living space and bedroom along with new entrance door to west elevation with canopy for Middleton House, and the erection of 2 no. four bedroom dwellings and 1 no. five bedroom dwelling with detached garages, parking and landscaping.
DECISION: The council objects to this application on the following grounds.

Objection based on dangerous access to this proposed site and leading to possible access to adjacent development site. Extreme concern about construction vehicles accessing on to a blind corner, as well as residents, should the plans be approved. Plans show three new houses plus Middleton House all accessing and egressing on to a blind corner. Given that each house will have a minimum of two vehicles this would put at least eight vehicles accessing and egressing via a blind corner onto a very busy road. The plans show the site road joins up to the boundary hedge of a development site which has already received planning permission for three large houses subject to satisfactory access. The reason this has not been developed so far is that existing site access is not deemed to be "satisfactory access".

Opening up access to the site via the development to the rear of Middleton House would mean an additional minimum of six vehicles using the proposed access on to the blind corner, totaling fourteen vehicles. Councilors' expressed concern that the Highways Report is not shown on the Portal. Entry on the 29th September re Highways Report, refers to previous report on 14th September which is not shown. Councilors wish to have access to this report.

The application states that the development is to meet the local need for 4/5 bedroomed houses. This is false information. A recently completed site to the East End of the Village amply met any need for additional large houses. The village need is for 2/3 bedroomed properties to attract families and to accommodate those wishing to downsize but not leave the village, thus freeing up existing 4 bedroomed properties.

Plot 4 plans show a two-story garage. If the plan is approved The Parish Council would request a condition be applied to prevent residential use of the upper story.

Change of use of agricultural land to a wild camping site to include siting of a maximum of 10 no. canvas tents, 10 no. camping pods, 5 no. yurts, 9 no. off-grid composting toilets, 6 no. off-grid LPG shower units and 1 no. non-permanent site office/reception and formation of new vehicular access off the C91 and area of hard standing, and closure of 2 no. existing accesses off the C91 (Part retrospective)

DECISION: APPROVED

22/00732HOUSE 20 Castleside, Sheriff Hutton

Demolition of existing single garage and erection of a rendered block work detached double garage with a pitched pantile roof, alterations to the dwelling to raise the height of the ridge and the eaves, part rendering and weatherboarding of the elevations, together with 1 no roof light and additional first floor window

DECISION: APPROVED

Message from the Jumbles

Over 80 people attended our 23rd Macmillan World's Biggest Coffee Morning at the end of September, and it was lovely to see so many of our regulars and lots of new faces. It was particularly nice to see lots of youngsters too and we hope you all enjoyed it as much as we did.

Although it is always a busy morning, we love being able to chat to everyone and to catch up with those we don't often see. Bonnie's preloved jewellery stall was as popular as ever, and we almost sold out of cakes. There was a steady queue all morning at the tombola stall and the fantastic raffle prizes attracted lots of people trying their luck. The catering team were kept very busy making sure everyone was served as quickly as possible. Everyone pulled together to make the morning another huge success.

As usual Elaine spent the morning on her knees with lots of eager young helpers to add money to her money tree. It took some people quite a while to guess the theme, but others got it quickly. It was a Tea Tree (T tree). Thank you so much to everyone for your generosity. The final total raised was £1,099, which included £93.80 from the Money Tree and over £300 from Bonnie's Preloved Jewellery Stall. For those who like statistics, since we started our World's Biggest Coffee Mornings, way back in 2000, we have raised £22,439 for Macmillan Cancer Research, which includes approximately £3,500 from the Money Trees.

Pat and I took Bonnie's Jewellery Stall to the Marie Curie Coffee Morning at Kirkbymoorside at the beginning of October, and their supporters were very eager to snap up the bargains raising £189 for their funds. This brought our total raised for the year to £10,736 and our total raised since The Jumbles Started in 1986 to £366,051.

This month sees the club's AGM, which will be held on 16th November at 7.30pm, at the village hall. All members are welcome and the meeting will be followed by a supper. Formal notification will shortly be sent directly to members with a call for motions and nominations for the committee.

Those who have not already returned their potato competition containers are urged to do so as soon as possible, either at the AGM or directly to any committee member.

Gardening tips

The summer has been hard on the garden, but how pleasant it was to have warmth and sunshine. Close planting has helped to preserve moisture, showing which plants are in the right place. Even in the veg patch, covering the bare soil prior to planting out winter greens, has helped weed suppression and moisture retention, enabling plants to become established without too much watering. Now it has rained and everything is green again, with few losses hopefully. It is time to reassess our patches big or small. As the evergreens should have been dealt with, it is time to look at deciduous plants and bare root planting, which is cheaper and can be done between now and March, as with roses, deciduous shrubs and tree pruning.

November is leaf-fall: valuable material or a nuisance? Leaf mould is one of the best soil conditioners so worth making if you have the space. It is slow to break down but collect leaf litter, heap it up in a corner, put wire round to keep it together, then leave to decompose. It breaks down differently to compost material so keep the two separate. When you are on top of the weeding it will be time to put on compost and/or soil enhancer and let the worms do the work for you. The more done now will make spring a lot easier.

We will be opening our Art Studios on **Saturday 3rd December** at 10am until 5pm. This will take place with Justine Warner at Laburnum Cottage with Textiles and Mixed Media (also showing the very talented Steve Page sculptural work), and Patrick Smith (Painter and Printmaker) at Nesslyn.
