### **The following new planning applications were received for consideration this month:-**

22/00843/HOUSE                      2 Terrington View, Sheriff Hutton

Erection of two single storey side extensions and conversion of existing garage to additional living accommodation.

Decision – The parish council do not object to this planning application but do wish to make the following comments:-

The parish council have a query regarding potential over development of this site.

The parish council are concerned regarding the loss of existing car parking spaces which are being reduced from 3 to 1. This will increase street parking which is already an issue in the area due to limited sight lines.

Concern regarding access - no details provided in the plans.

22/00732/HOUSE                      20 Castle Side, Sheriff Hutton

Demolition of existing single garage and erection of a rendered block work detached double garage with a pitched pantile roof, alterations to the dwelling to raise the height of the ridge and the eaves, part rendering and weatherboarding of the elevations together with 1no. roof light and additional first floor windows.

Decision – No Objection.

22/00738/HOUSE                      The Hollies, Strensall To Sheriff Hutton Road, Sheriff Hutton

Erection of two storey rear extension and detached garage following the demolition of existing garages and store building.

Decision – No Objection.

Certificate of Lawfulness for a proposed use or development in respect of external alterations to include installation of french doors and existing door opening to create a window, replace existing doors and windows, loft conversion to include two new bedrooms and associated rooflights together with proposed works to outbuilding to include new garage doors to existing openings and a new door to the southern gable.

## **News from the Village Hall**

### **Caretaking**

We are delighted to announce that we have recently appointed Sarah as the new part-time caretaker to the Village Hall. Sarah will manage the Village Hall around her existing commitments and therefore will, on occasion, be unavailable to assist with a hall hire.

Much of the role of caretaker is not directly related to hires; monitoring the security and safety of the building, maintaining consumable supplies as required, keeping the hall and its contents in good order and other such tasks. Sarah will be able to fit this work around her other duties.

With respect to getting furniture out in preparation for hires, putting it away afterwards and ensuring the rooms used are left in a clean and tidy state, Sarah will sometimes be available to assist and at other times not. Therefore, primary responsibility for these tasks will need to remain with hirers, as it has for the last few months.

### **Impact on hire charges**

When we announced revised hire charges in July Village News we did state that "These charges will be reviewed and revised (upwards) if we recruit a caretaker in the future".

However, given the timing of these new arrangements, the Operations Group has decided to stay with the revised charges announced in July, from 1<sup>st</sup> September until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2022. This will give us time to see how the new caretaking arrangements and increases in fuel and other costs are impacting on the Village Hall finances. Later in the year we will announce new hire charges to come into effect from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023.

### Gardening Tips

"Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness"

All change again. Once the ground is moist enough, moving and splitting of plants can begin and recently bought plants still in pots will settle in nicely. If moving evergreens they will establish themselves if done now, but if not it will be best to leave them until spring. Autumn raspberries should be fruiting but the summer varieties need the old canes removing with new growth being tied in over winter.

Roses will have their second flush and deadheading other late flowering plants will extend the season.

We are so fortunate in having such a wide range of plants suitable to our climate to be able to personalise our gardens.

Great thanks to all who supported us on our summer events which attracted both members and non-members alike. We had 22 different individuals/supporters attending either one or multiple events including many new faces and hope to meet many of you again at our evening programme.

## **Sheriff Hutton History Group**

With no meetings on which to report in July and August, we are looking forward to the next meeting in the Village Hall at 7.30 on 30<sup>th</sup> September when our own Hugh Ainsley will be giving a talk entitled "Two Men Went to War – a Village Story". He tells us that this is two separate tales – one about a man born in the village, who died in the first world war and was not remembered by anyone until a few years ago and the other about the grandfather of people living in Sheriff Hutton now, who had an extraordinary career, survived both wars and left a collection of fascinating photographs and other documents, copies of which are now in our archives.

In October we open our doors to visitors from all around in an exhibition entitled "Looking Back, Looking Forward". This will be on the 29<sup>th</sup> October in the Main hall and Refreshment Room of the Village Hall and we will welcome visitors in the afternoon between 1pm and 4pm – entrance is free.

Among other exhibits we will again be showing the display we had at the Jubilee Weekend for those who missed it, a table with some of the artefacts which we have had presented to us over the years, the albums assembled for the Millennium and the story of how we came to get our invaluable archive store. There will be photographs of village groups and personalities from the past – please help us to identify some of them! A display about certain village properties through the ages will be on show. ## **Samaritans Childrens Christmas Shoe Box Appeal**

With autumn just around the corner, we need to start working towards the Shoe Box Appeal, ready for collection week, which starts November 14<sup>th</sup>.

Our community has managed a high level of contributions, over 100 boxes each year, for quite some time so it would be great to continue this. Sadly, around the world demand only increases and last year 277,350 shoebox gifts were given out to children aged two to fourteen years old, in eight countries across Eastern Europe, Africa and Central Asia!

Some aspects are becoming problematic, the number of helpers to collect items and assemble them, and getting hold of the right sort of shoe boxes. The Samaritans can supply one hundred shoe boxes for a cost of £52, so this would solve one issue, but funds need to be raised to cover those costs, so please pop a date in your diary.

**Saturday October 1<sup>st</sup>**, 10.30am to 12.30pm, a Pop-Up Café offering hot and cold drinks with cakes and sweet treats, will be held in the Methodist Church. There will also be a chance for small and big kids to decorate their own cupcakes, so please join us.

Also, for eight weeks running, starting **6pm to 8pm Thursday September 8<sup>th</sup>** until Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> October, the Methodist Church will be open for Creative Crafting and the collection of shoe box items. ## **Sheriff Hutton Bridge Cricket Club**

The ups and downs of local cricket are no more apparent this month than at any time during the season.

The 1<sup>st</sup> XI chased down a huge total of 274 at Harrogate; having toiled in very hot conditions they bowled Harrogate out in the final over and then reached the total for the loss of only four wickets with hundreds for Mark Fisher and Dulash Udayanga. Youngster Will Bennison contributed with a quick 27 and two wickets. The highlight of the attack was a “five for” for Ash Watson.

They then succumbed at home to both the league leaders Driffield and then Castleford, two bad days at the office. There were a few individual victories with both bat and ball but not enough together.
