The following new planning application was received for consideration this month:

22/00528/HOUSE Moatside, Finkle Street, Sheriff Hutton

Alterations to dwelling to include raising of the eaves and ridge height to allow formation of first floor living accommodation; erection of a side extension with bedroom within roof space; erection of a first floor rear extension; installation of dormer windows to both front and rear elevations; and alterations to fenestration and rendering of existing property.

Decision - No Objection.

The following new planning decision was received this month:

2/01319/CPO Sheriff Hutton CP School, West End, Sheriff Hutton Retention of prefabricated classroom unit 0982 (76 sq. metres) for a further 6 years. APPROVED.

Ryedale District Council Key Decisions Consultation

Ryedale District Council (RDC) are currently undertaking a key decisions consultation. The Key Decisions consultation is the latest public consultation being undertaken by the Council as they progress with the review of the Ryedale Plan. It follows a 'Call for Sites' exercise, a 'Distribution of Development' consultation, as well as a consultation on submitted sites, which is ongoing. This consultation focuses on a number of strategic considerations, namely: the proposed plan period/life of the review of the Ryedale Plan, the proposed housing requirement, the proposed distribution of development strategy and the settlement hierarchy and proposed consideration of Service Villages, including Sheriff Hutton.

Following complaints from residents of West Lilling, please can we ensure that the pavements in the village are kept clear of overhanging hedges, trees and bushes. Although some hedges have been trimmed, they are still encroaching onto the pavements. In addition, it is necessary to keep the pavements clear of soil and grass under the hedges to stop the pavements becoming narrower.

We have also received complaints from residents about cars parking on pavements. Whilst we acknowledge the road through the village is narrow and busy, pedestrians are having to walk onto the busy road to avoid the parked cars as they leave insufficient space to walk on the pavements. Gardening Club

The club meets in the Village Hall on Wednesday 15th March for a talk by Peter Mathers on 'London Squares and Gardens'. Seed potatoes for the potato competition will be available at this meeting, postponed from last month to allow for proper chitting.

Gardening tips

Now we are moving from winter into spring it is a good time to look at the garden to check all the winter jobs have been done. We were fortunate in February to have a good dry spell to catch up.

- The early bulbs have been lovely but if you want to enlarge the snowdrop and aconite patches
 for next year, ensure splitting is done before the leaves disappear. This is not the same for
 daffodils as the leaves need to die down to feed the bulbs before lifting.
- As the days lengthen and warm so the weeds will grow quicker. Disturb the top of the soil to kill off any young seedlings. This will open up the soil to stop capping and water run-off.
- Also, now is a good time to apply a mulch to keep in the moisture for drier times. Ground cover
 plants and close planting can have the same effect, as bare soil dries out the quickest.
- Those with dogwoods/cornus need to cut them down to a couple of buds when the new leaves start to appear to ensure good colour next winter.
- Check over all your pots for losses and any necessary repotting, as well as topping up with fresh compost and feed.
- Let the ground warm up before starting to sow seeds, unless indoors; they will then grow away quicker.
- If you have rhubarb and you like nice pink stalks cover the crown with a forcer or a bucket.

Lots to do, but there is time.

Just to advise the Village Oil Buying Group and in addition anyone who wants to join in from Sheriff Hutton, Lilling, Whenby, Farlington and Stittenham, that the next oil order is planned for:

Estimated delivery between April 5th and 12th Order cut-off Friday 31st March.

You can of course still join even if you only order occasionally. If you have already given your details to the group, you will receive a reminder in advance of the deadlines, asking for confirmation on whether you require an order and if so the details.

The group, run by volunteers purely for the convenience of and to provide savings to villagers, was set up many years ago buying heating oil for Sheriff Hutton and Lilling. It now includes in addition Whenby, Farlington and Stittenham.

If you would like to join please email us at sheriffhuttonoil@gmail.com with your name, email, mobile phone number, address, location of oil tank and oil order or request to be added to database.

After the deadline and we have the total number of litres required, we will discuss the price with a number of potential suppliers to get the best price and then let each person know how much their order will cost with the planned delivery date.

Recently, suppliers are finding it difficult to provide additional litres 'to fill', so it is fine to slightly overestimate your order as long as at least 500 litres can be delivered to ensure you get a fill up. The minimum quantity which can be ordered is 500 litres, but you can order any number of litres above that. Payment can be made to the driver or by phone within 7 days of the delivery.

Please note to enable the group to work your details will be held on a database, and certain details e.g., name and order will be shared with the rest of the group, and name, address and contact details will be provided to the oil provider in connection with oil orders.
