It's a good time to think of New Year Resolutions and plans for next year.

Observing the nature around us is free and benefits our mental health. If we all try and do a bit more to encourage nature we all benefit. This may be by planting early flowering plants suitable for bees, providing food and/or fresh water for birds, and mammals such as hedgehogs. Keeping a wild patch in the garden. Providing additional habitats such as bug hotels, piles of tree branches, nest boxes for birds.

Leading on from this on Wednesday, 1<sup>St</sup> February 2023 we are very pleased to have Ecologist Professor Alastair Fitter giving a talk on 'The State of Nature in Yorkshire.' Alastair is going to be covering 'How do we know what plants and animals there are in our county, how well they are faring and how well protected are they?'

Just to advise the Village Oil Buying Group and in addition anyone who wants to join in Sheriff Hutton, Lilling, Whenby, Farlington and Stittenham that the next oil order is planned for:

## Approximately late Jan/early Feb 23 with Order cut-off Friday 20 January 2023

You can of course still join even if you only order occasionally.

If you have already given your details to the group, you will receive a reminder in advance of the deadlines asking for confirmation on whether you require an order and if so the details.

The group run by volunteers purely for the convenience and to provide savings to Villagers was set up many years ago buying heating oil as a group for Sheriff Hutton and Lilling. It now includes in addition Whenby, Farlington and Stittenham.

After the deadline and we have the total number of litres required we will discuss the price with the potential suppliers and then let each person know how much their order will cost and the planned delivery date.

We aim to place the order as close as possible to the estimated delivery date to try and get a more accurate cost and actual delivery date from the supplier.

The minimum quantity which can be ordered is 500 litres, but you can order any number of litres above that. Please send the most accurate reading you can and add if you would like your tank filled if there is space available above your order and the driver has sufficient oil. Payment is due within 7 days of the delivery.

Please note to enable the group to work your details will be held on a database, and certain details e.g., name and order shared with the rest of the group and name, address and contact details will be provided to the oil provider in connection with oil orders. ## **Sheriff Hutton Art Group's November Workshop**

The Art Group's November workshop was well attended and we were pleased to welcome new members and visitors to what we hoped would be an inspiring day.

Local artist, Tim Walsh was born and brought up in this area and after studying in California and at the Slade felt drawn back to the north of the UK. Most recently, he taught at Ampleforth College and we were pleased to invite him to run our workshop knowing that he would set us a challenge.

We had all worked in watercolour before but Tim introduced us to a new approach using J.M.W.Turner's method of blending a limited palette of colours to achieve a soft hazy effect. Whilst developing tonal variation we worked to further add detail to create our own very individual results.

Our second piece of work involved using charcoal to sketch out a design which created tonal definition. Wetting the charcoal gave the basis for further work with watercolour bringing to life another painting in the same way that J.M.W.Turner had experimented 2 centuries ago! This new approach made us work further outside our comfort zone and the resulting variety of paintings were very interesting although Mr Turner may have disagreed!

Tim is a skilled teacher with a calm, positive approach and he was able to encourage us with positive support through this new creative experience.

We all agreed that much had been learnt and hoped to be able to incorporate this new knowledge into our work.

## **Gardening Club**

A venture into your winter garden or amongst your pots may already show the early snouts of Spring growth, so this is the ideal time to boost your gardening knowledge by coming along to the gardening club's first meeting of the year on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> January at 7.30pm at the Village Hall. Sarah Hopps will be talking about 'Gardens of Britain and their surprises', but we will also be revealing our programme for 2023 with its range of talks and garden visits. The club's subscription stays at £15.00 for 2023, which covers the cost of talks and part of the cost of visits. An added attraction is the 10% member discount at Dean's Garden Centres, Yates Garden Centre, Castle Howard Plant Centre, Steam and Moorland Garden Centre in Pickering, Wykeham Mature Plants, R V Rogers Nurseries and – from January - Vertigro Plant Nursery. This makes membership great value, and we hope to see lots of old and new members at the January meeting.

#### **Gardening tips**

A New Year - what will it bring; who knows? Whilst the garden is semidormant, let it lie. Take time to reflect and plan ahead. As long as those vulnerable plants are protected from the worst of the winter they will survive. Wet is worse than cold, unless there is hard frost for several days. Put pots in a sheltered corner, lifting them off the ground for drainage with bricks or pot feet, or put them in a cold greenhouse. Hostas don't need to be taken indoors.

Summer is not the only time to do garden visits: look at winter gardens to glean ideas to enhance your plot. There is a good selection of snowdrop woodlands open to the public towards the end of the month and into February. You'll be surprised how many plants perform at this time of year. If you are wanting to get on with seed sowing there is still time to buy; don't forget the 50% discount on Suttons seeds available through the gardening club. Alternatively leave activity until the spring when there will be plenty of flower and vegetable plug plants available. Very useful when only a small quantity is required.

## The Village Show

It's time to put the 2023 Village Show date in your calendar - Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> August. Time also to plan your entries for the creative show classes where you can demonstrate your skills. Craft classes include: canvas work using a kit or a chart or your own design; a piece of hand embroidery of your own design; an item of patchwork or hand-stitched quilting, not necessarily finished item; a knitted or crocheted hat; an item of hand-knitting, crochet or tatting; a cushion; a piece of cross-stitch; an item of beadwork; a paper craft item; an item of woodwork; a machine embroidery or free machine stitching item; a piece of hand-made jewellery; any other handicraft item not eligible for any other class; a painting in any medium; a placemat in any medium.

Photography entries must be no larger than 13cms x 18cms/5" x 7", preferably without a border, not framed or mounted, must have been taken by the exhibitor, and not shown previously at the Sheriff Hutton Village Show. Classes include: any scene (colour print); trees in winter (colour print); a wild-flower scene; one garden flower (no insects!); architecture or buildings (colour print); a view of Sheriff Hutton; a person or people (colour print); bird(s) (colour print); bug(s), butterfly/butterflies) or animals(s) (colour print); a bridge or bridges (colour print); black and white or monochrome print (any subject); sunrise or sunset (colour print); food.

## **Sheriff Hutton History Group**

In November the History Group was greatly saddened to hear of the death of Nancy Megginson at the age of 90. As many of you will know she had lived in Sheriff Hutton for much of her long life and had been an unfailing source of information and inspiration to our group, with her tales of past adventures and her knowledge of the village and its folk over the course of her lifetime. We will miss her greatly, but keeping her memory alive are her collection of papers, artefacts etc recording a lifetime in Sheriff Hutton, which have been donated to us and are now safely stored in our archives.

In November we were lucky to have a talk by Neil Hodges, one of our own members, on the 19<sup>th</sup> century designer Christopher Dresser who was a contemporary of such prominent figures as Pugin and Morris. His stated aim was to bring to the ordinary person items that were both useful, affordable and attractive and much of his work could be said to fall into the category of "everyday" items. In the main he did not make items himself but sold his designs to others and he designed many of the components that went into buildings but not the buildings themselves. The watchword was "everything artistic for furnishing the house".

Neil illustrated his talk with numerous pictures of the extraordinary range of things Dresser designed and sold – some so modern looking as to seem like Art Deco period items rather than from half a century earlier (indeed, some are still being made now). He is notably associated with ceramics design, particularly that of the Linthorpe Pottery.

We were also told about the somewhat troubled history of Dresser and his family. Born in Scotland in 1834, at 13 he attended the London School of Design and from that early date he showed his talents in the design of a vast range of items from carpets to teapots, writing a number of influential books on design in the course of his career. He travelled widely, particularly to Japan, and set up a business importing and selling goods from the Far East. This thrived initially and he, his wife and their 13 children lived in imposing circumstances in Richmond, but the business declined and with it the family's fortunes.

He died in Germany in 1904 in Mulhausen, where he is buried. Sadly, unlike his contemporaries, in his lifetime he did not receive the public recognition for his work that was richly deserved.

History Group Meetings will resume in 2023 but we are in the process of creating an (email) mailing list and will circulate list members with occasional notifications of matters that may be of interest.
