The Parish Council met on the 13th May 2022. Councillors present at the meeting were Penny Bean (Chairman), Marcus Oxendale, Martin Dodd, Sally Wright, Sam Warriner, Dave Smith and Ed Stephenson. Clerk – Louise Pink.

Annual Meeting of the Council

Councillor Penny Bean was re-elected as Chairman and Councillor Marcus Oxendale as Vice Chairman to serve for the year 2022/2023.

The following new planning applications were received for consideration:-

22/00450/73 Howards End, East End, Sheriff Hutton.

Variation of Condition 02 of planning approval 20/00536/HOUSE dated 09.08.2020 to allow a reduction in the length of the Garden Room.

Decision – No Objection.

22/00444/HOUSE Gower Hall, Thornton Le Clay to Foston Road, Thornton Le Clay Malton.

Erection of four bay timber outbuilding (part retrospective).

Decision – No Objection.

22/00504/HOUSE Spring Cottage East End Sheriff Hutton

Erection of a single storey rear extension following removal of the existing conservatory.

Decision – No Objection.

The following new planning decision was received this month:-

22/00170/HOUSE The Sycamores, North Garth Lane, Sheriff Hutton

Erection of an extension to existing garage on eastern gable end to form a hobby workshop and erection of a detached garage in the south eastern corner of the rear garden.

Decision - APPROVED.

Other Planning Matters

A discussion was held regarding the community consultation received from Johnson Mowat Planning Consultants for development proposals at Middleton House, Finkle Street, Sheriff Hutton.

They have advised the parish council that a planning application is currently being prepared by them to submit to Ryedale Council with the development proposals involving the refurbishment of Middleton House and the erection of 3 no. detached family homes. After discussion, the parish council agreed that the proposed access is extremely dangerous, a query over how many houses the access road will serve and that there isn't a demand for 4/5 bed homes within the village, smaller houses are needed for downsizing. The parish council would encourage them to arrange and hold a public meeting.

Electric Car Charging Point

The parish council are currently looking into the costs and demand for an electric car charging point in the village and we would very much welcome your thoughts on this. Please get in touch by emailing the clerk on the email address provided below.

Sheriff Hutton History Group

Following our AGM in April, we were treated to an absorbing talk by our local artist Patrick Smith. As a result of having to lock down during 2020 he had employed his extraordinary skills as a print maker to produce a limited edition "box set" of prints of local buildings in our village. With great generosity he has presented one of these sets to the History Group for inclusion in our archives, something that will be treasured and displayed both at the Jubilee and our Open Day in October. We thank him most sincerely for this valuable addition to our collection of material about our village.

As an explanation of the background to this project Patrick described to us the process of print making in detail and shared his enthusiasm for a process less commonly seen in England than on the continent. He explained how his experience studying in Holland had had a major influence on both the composition and production of his prints. He shared with us two videos which took us through the whole of his printmaking production process in detail and also explained the invaluable contribution of catalogues of companies like Tool Station: masses of thin absorbent paper is needed when preparing inked plates for printing! An enthralling talk which left us with great respect for the enormous skills and plain hard work that is involved in making deceptively simple prints.

At the end we had the opportunity to both look at and purchase some of his stock of cards – always a bonus to be able to get some beautiful examples of local scenes.

Gardening tips

June! Gardens are at their best although this year's flowering in May will be hard to beat. If you aren't happy with how your garden looks, take time out to visit others for inspiration. The NGS yellow book, Yorkshire Arboretum open gardens, gardening club visits and Sheriff Hutton open gardens are all sources of inspiration.

If watering, try to do it in the morning, especially if you have a slug problem as they just love damp nights. Water butts of all shapes and sizes are easily fitted to down pipes to store water for possible drought periods.

If you have thought of doing the 'Chelsea Chop', now is the time to do it. Taller, later flowering herbaceous perennials can be cut back by half giving more flowers on shorter stems which are less likely to fall over. Google for more details!

Sheriff Hutton Nature Group

At our recent May meeting Dr Barry Wright Principal Ecologist gave us a very thought provoking and informative talk on hedgerows, in relation to their age, history and significant ecological value. This is not only relating to the actual hedge plants, and the ground flora but also the associated soil. Barry shared a method of surveying hedges to gain an indication of their age and value from such indicators as shape, hedge and ground plants and then showed how to include this detailed information in aerial plans of local areas. He also discussed how we can improve our current hedges with additional planting and leaving to grow wild where possible. Looking to the modern day in terms of climate change hedges are a valuable aid in locking in carbon. Thank you to those who attended; both as members and visitors to make this a very interactive, informative and social evening.

Following from this initial talk the Nature Group will be having a hedge surveying day in June as a training session by Barry Wright in applying this practically. Barry is currently reviewing some examples of local hedges with great interest in terms of their potential age and value. We will keep you updated on the findings from this.

Our evening talks have now ended until the autumn, but we have in place a varied and interesting programme of talks to look forward to from October onwards, with topics ranging from red kites in Yorkshire, to Astronomy, Spiders and to the State of Nature in Yorkshire.

30 days Wild

In June the UK Wildlife Trusts have their annual monthly campaign "30 days Wild" to raise the profile and interest in nature and wildlife and to give ideas of connecting with nature. At the time of writing, 32,000 people have already signed up. There is an activity pack available by post or download, with different packs for friends and family, schools, care homes and workplaces. THE METHODIST CHURCH

The Queen's platinum jubilee is upon us. As a great admirer of the Queen, I am very much looking forward to the festivities and I will be leading a short "Songs of Praise" in Strensall on 5th June as my small contribution to the celebrations. Others may be underwhelmed by all the fuss but nonetheless thankful for an extra bank holiday whilst some may find the whole concept of Kings and Queens anachronistic in the twenty-first century. Whatever our views on the monarchy it would be wrong not to recognise the enormous record of service the Queen has given to this country. Most of us were born after the Queen succeeded to the throne in 1952 and we have known no other monarch. Seventy years as Queen, a record which is unlikely ever to be broken; over 21,000 public engagements stretching back eighty years to when she was sixteen; service in the Auxiliary Territorial Service (ATS) during the second world war. A life lived in service to our country.

There is something deep within the human psyche which pushes us to volunteer and to serve which, as a Christian, I believe is shaped by our being created in the image of God and exemplified in Jesus who "came not to be served but to serve" (Mark 10:45). Service pervades all areas of public life; for example, the motto of Sandhurst, where the army trains its officers, is "Serve to Lead". Serving is an important part of leadership. We rightly recognise the people who work in the NHS, our armed forces and the plethora of council and government services who serve us.

There is also a significant body of people who willingly and sometimes at great personal cost volunteer to run the clubs, societies and churches which contribute so much to the enrichment of our lives. Imagine if there were no village hall, no Jumbies, Luncheon Club, Tennis Club, Gardening Club, History Group, Bowling Club, Cricket Club, Ladies Group, Nature Group, Tigers, rambles, no St Helen's, no Methodist church and no Village News. To quote John Lennon "it's easy if you try" but at the same time it feels unthinkable. Village life would be so much poorer if these did not exist and yet their existence depends on the willingness of people to give freely of their time. It is so easy to criticise those who step up to serve and lead in our community but without them these activities would disappear. They fulfil a function which might not carry the same kudos as being the Queen but is nonetheless important to Sheriff Hutton. Let's be thankful and raise a cheer for all those volunteers serving us.

On Jubilee weekend I will be giving thanks for Her Majesty's long reign and singing "God save the Queen". I will be joining in the picnics and fun days which will only happen because people choose to serve their local communities. So, I will also be giving thanks and praying for all who serve in any capacity, both great and small. God bless you all.

Caretaking
