Restoration of the Bells

The bells restoration project has started. The scaffolding is up, the bells are now at a specialist bells factory in Oxfordshire and work on the stone turret will be starting soon.

During the work taking place to restore our two bells to working order it may be necessary to limit access to the church from time to time. We will endeavour to keep the church open for private prayer or 'quiet time' as much as is possible. The churchyard remains open at all times but please avoid the west (back) end of the church while the work is in progress.

St Mary's Church, Marton in the Forest.

We have 2 services planned for February: a Celtic Communion at 3pm on Sunday 1st February and a Celtic Worship service (no communion) at 3pm on Sunday 15th. The church may be cold, but our welcome is warm!

We currently have a new and temporary feature in our churchyard - a labyrinth! This was designed to provide a free peace/prayer/mindful walk for all visitors, in the area of the churchyard known as 'The Spring Meadow' (to the right of the stone path as you enter through the church gates). This labyrinth was designed and laid out by Peter Clark, a local labyrinth enthusiast. We have used locally-sourced sawdust (with many thanks to D Wilson Timber) to create a simple pathway with three connected loops. As the grass grows up, the labyrinth will gradually disappear. There are leaflets near the church gate and in church if you would like to come and try it for yourself. Everyone welcome.

Spring Fling - a free party for over 70s on Saturday 21st March

Plans are now well underway for our annual party for people aged 70 and over, in Sheriff Hutton Village Hall at 3pm on Sat 21st March. This party comprises a delicious afternoon tea, followed by local entertainment. Sheriff Hutton Jumblies

To bring you up to date with the last fund-raising events of 2025:

Sales of pre-loved jewelry and handbags at the Christmas Fair and the Jigsaw Exchange Christmas Coffee Morning resulted in us being able to donate £350 to the Parish Church and £350 to Autistic Angels, a very small charity based near Harrogate, run by volunteers, which gives people with Autism the opportunity to enjoy riding.

Our final total for 2025 was £20,262 of which over £2,000 was raised from your generous donations of pre-loved jewelry, handbags and scarves. The total raised since 1986 now stands at £426,390.

When Doreen Lynch, Doreen Langdale, May Barner and I held our first jumble sale, at the Primary School, as part of a campaign to raise money to fund a new classroom we were over the moon to raise about £200. We did not anticipate that in 2026 we would be celebrating our 40th birthday with a team of 20, many of whom have been giving their time for over 30 years.

During that time we have raised money for most of our village organisations as well as local and national charities, all of which benefit our community. We have, by passing on unsold good condition items, also provided support to Carecent in York, the Rainbow Centre in Scarborough and other small organisations to help their fund raising and support for those less well-off people.

Whilst those organisations who we raise money for are expected to collect much of the jumble we sell, we also depend on donations from our village and surrounding area and we would like to express our sincere thanks for all your support and hope you feel able to continue in the future. It goes without saying that it would not be possible to hold our mammoth sales without being able to use the Village Hall which is a wonderful facility and the rent we pay contributes to their annual income.

Our sincere thanks to all those people who have stepped in to help at the sales when needed, usually at short notice, and Paul and Nigel who regularly come to help clear at the end of the sale.

At the time of writing despite our many appeals we are still trying to find someone willing to take away left over bric-a-brac and toys at the end of each sale. If we can't find anyone we will have to resort to employing a clearance company which will cost and reduce our totals raised for charities.

Our next Jumble Sale will be on the **14th February, at 2pm** raising money for the Bowling Club. Donations of good condition clothes, books, toys and bric-a-brac will be very much appreciated and we will be at the Hall from 8.30am on the morning of the sale. Nearer the time we will know if we are able to receive your donations on the Friday night. Please check our Facebook page for details. Please note we are unable to accept any large items of bric-a-brac and everything must be in a useable state.
