Recipe for Shortbread Biscuits

Ingredients: 125g/4oz butter, 55g/2oz caster sugar, plus extra, 180g/6oz plain flour

Preheat the oven 190 C/170 C fan/gas 5

Method: Beat the butter and sugar together in a mixing bowl, then stir in the flour until it comes together as a dough. On a lightly floured surface, use a rolling pin to roll out the dough to 1cm thick. Cut the dough into 12 separate fingers and place on a lined baking tray. Prick with a fork to create indented holes, then sprinkle with caster sugar. Chill the dough in the fridge for 20 mins, then bake for 15-20 mins until golden brown. Leave to cool on a wire rack. Select the best 4 biscuits.

Competition Rules

- Entries are open to all, but cups and trophies will only be awarded to residents of Sheriff Hutton and Lilling parishes or members of groups based in these villages
- Children may enter all classes with points going towards their overall total for the Alan Farnaby Memorial Trophy. No prize money will be awarded for children winning in adult classes
- Only 1 entry per person per class except for classes 15, 24, 26, 55 (2 entries permitted)

- Entry is free for all classes
- If fewer than three entries in a class, prizes awarded at the judge's discretion
- Prizes for Children's' Classes: First £2.00,
 Second £1.00, Cups and Trophies
