How do we Know Christianity is the One True Religion?

Discussion Guide

1.	Is this a question you have ever been asked? Do you feel that you could give a good answer to this question? How would it go if you were not under pressure and had time to think about it?
2.	Do you think it is more important to have the right answers or the right attitude? Or both? Would you tend to overstate the evidence for Christianity when talking/arguing with someone, or would you try to find areas of common ground and agreement?
3.	Read Matthew 4:1-11 and discuss how Jesus' response to Satan's temptations illustrates application of the Know vs. Prove concept.
4.	The speaker used both Negative Arguments and Positive Arguments to help answer the question "How Do We Know Christianity is the One True Religion?" Does one of these approaches seem stronger to you?
5.	The speaker used an approach of a Contest of Worldviews to evaluate alternatives to Christianity. Did any of the contest results surprise you? Have you thought through the worldviews and presuppositions that inform and guide your Christian life?
6.	Can you think of questions or conversations you had in the past where the AIP methodology would have been helpful to determine truth?

7.	Several different types of evidence for Christianity and the Bible were presented in the talk. What was the most compelling evidence that was presented in the talk? Have you considered the evidence for Christianity and the Bible before? Consider doing a word search to see what the Bible say about evidence (examples – certainty, evidence, prove, proving, proofs)
