The Exhibitor's Hall includes entries for Junior, Youth, Adults, Household Arts, Baking, Horticulture, and Floriculture.

All exhibitor's entries will be on display in the Exhibitor's Hall during the fair. You will be able to browse in the air conditioning and see the beautiful exhibits completed by talented people.

## GENERAL RULES

*All rules apply to each category unless otherwise specified in that section*

- Entry forms for items to be exhibited in the 2024 fair must be in the Secretary's Office on or before July 12, 2024. Entry forms must contain all current information and be printed in legible forms.
- Exhibits are open to residents of all Ohio counties.
- Exhibitors may enter in as many categories as they choose, but only one item may be displayed in each category from the same exhibitor.
- All entries/items entered MUST be the work of the exhibitor (Excluding Antiques).
- A fee is required for exhibiting at the fair:
  - Ages 9 and under:** \$10 entry fee. (This does not include a ticket because children 9 and under get in free with a paying adult). Exhibitor may exhibit up to 15 items.
  - Ages 10-17: Three Options**
    - 4-H/FFA members who wish to enter may do so for \$10 (their Fair ID badge is their admittance). Allows youth to exhibit 15 items at no extra charge.
    - Pay \$15 and receive a Mini Exhibitor Pass which allows entrance to the fair for 2 days (No Re-Entry with this pass) and allows youth to exhibit 10 items.
    - Purchase a Seasonal Pass for \$30 and exhibit 25 items. There will be \$1 charge for each item over 25.
  - Adults 18 and up: Three Options**
    - Purchase a Seasonal Pass for \$30 which admits one person into the fair for all 7 days and allows 25 items to be exhibited. There will be \$1 charge for each item over 25.
    - Purchase a Membership Pass for \$25 (with this pass you must live in Greene County and be 18 years of age and older) the Membership Pass allows daily entry to the fair and allows pass holder to vote for Senior Fair Board members during the fair. Allows 25 items to be exhibited, there will be a \$1 charge for every item over 25.
    - Pay \$15 and receive a Mini Exhibitor Pass which allows entrance to the fair for 2 days (No Re-Entry with this pass). 10 items may be exhibited.
- All entry tags must be attached securely by the exhibitor. Photography entries should label the back of picture with name & phone number and bring entry tag to drop off.
- Any article brought for display may be rejected by the staff because of being soiled, stained or because of size or content of article.
- Those in charge of the Exhibitor's Hall will make every effort to see that the exhibits are properly protected but cannot assume any obligation for loss or damage to items. All items entered are at the liability/risk of the exhibitor.
- No professionals are permitted to enter. A professional is someone whose trade is considered to be a way of living.
- Directions on rules must be followed or entry will be disqualified.
- Judges results are final. Judges may refuse to issue a first place premium if items are not deemed worthy of first place.
- Entries receiving first place may not be entered again for 2 years.
- In consideration for exhibits any item on the grounds of the Greene County Fair, 120 Fairground Road in Xenia, Ohio 45385, those who exhibit must understand that you will covenant and agree to save said Society of the Greene County Agricultural Society harmless from any and all claims of every type, character and description pertaining to or growing out of being on said property and that every effort will be made by each person to conduct themselves and their activity upon said premises in such a manner as to avoid injury or damage to the public or property of said Society.

6. In all classes, evidence of dirt, dust or spray residue should be washed off, all dead leaves and bugs removed and plants or flowers well-groomed before they are brought in for exhibit. No oiling or polishing permitted on foliage.

Items may be brought in between 8:30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday July 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024.  
Late entries not accepted. The judge's decisions are final.
