Dear Parents and Guardians,

Can you remember when you received the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time? What about your First Communion? Or maybe it was the celebration of a Baptism? Celebrating a Sacrament for the first time is an important step in the life of your child as a Catholic. Most of us have clear memories of celebrating these Sacraments tucked away somewhere; you may even have your dress or Mass booklet in a special place. St. Mary and St. Rose Religious Education Formation Program is excited and honored to help in the preparation of your child for the Sacrament(s).

This Parent Handbook will provide you the information about the catechesis your child will be receiving, how you can help your child at home, and give the details about the upcoming liturgies to celebrate each Sacrament. **Please take time to read through the handbook.**

Parent participation and support is crucial in the spiritual development of each child. As a family, attendance at weekly Mass is the best form of support and education you can provide your child. It will bring the classroom teachings alive as your child can experience all that s/he is being taught. Your family has four opportunities to celebrate Mass:

- **3rd – 12th Grade OCIC 2nd Year Class (This is the second year of the two-year program.)** will be preparing for **Confirmation and First Holy Communion (Eucharist)**.

Program Outline of Requirements and Eligibility

To be eligible to enter preparation to receive the **Sacrament of Healing (Reconciliation) and the completion of the Sacraments of Initiation after Baptism, known as the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist** at St. Mary Church and St. Rose Church, an individual must meet the following qualifications:

- Be a baptized Catholic;
- Be part of a registered family in the Religious Education Program at either St. Mary Parish or St. Rose Parish;
- Provide copies of Birth Certificates and Baptismal Certificates (if not baptized at either of the two parishes) to the office upon registration; and provide copies of other sacraments (if not received at either of the two parishes);
- Be registered and instructed in the Faith through Religious Education Classes;
- Maintain regular attendance in the Religious Education Classes;
 - Combination of six absences are allowed (excused and/or unexcused);
 - Disenrollment will occur after the sixth absence;
 - Attend Sunday Mass and provide proof to DRE each Wednesday with a **signed Bulletin or “Holy Heroes”**
- Attend and participate at the practice for the Sacrament;
- Have knowledge of prayers which are required for each grade level;
 - Testing will be conducted by the Catechist to ensure that the student has a basic understanding of the Sacrament s/he will be receiving;
 - Pass an evaluation for Sacramental readiness by the Catechist or Director of Religious Education and/or Pastor;
- If any portion of these requirements is not met, the Sacrament may be delayed until a later date.
- **PARENTS/GUARDIANS: Your attendance and participation at the parent meetings is respectfully requested.**

Practice the Sacrament of Reconciliation with Your Child

1. Explain to your child that Reconciliation is a Sacrament of healing in which our sins are forgiven and in which we are reconciled with God and the Church.
2. Teach your child that God is a loving merciful Father who is waiting for us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
3. Explain that Jesus granted the apostles and their successors (priests) the authority to forgive and retain sins.
4. Teach your child how to make an examination of conscience and have him/her make it at the end of the day as part of their night prayers.
5. Make sure your child learns the **Act of Contrition** and that s/he understands Reconciliation as a way of preparing her/his soul to receive Jesus in the most holy Sacrament of the Eucharist.
6. Emphasize that the priest will never tell anyone about your child's confessed sins.

(An Example of The Act of Contrition – Contemporary Version)

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things.
I firmly intend,
with your help,
to do penance,
to sin no more,
and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Amen.

(An Example of The Act of Contrition – Traditional Version)

O, my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended you.
I detest all my sins because of your just punishment,
But most of all because they offend you,
my God who are all-good and deserving of all my love.
I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace,
to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.



PROCEDURE

Receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation

When your child is ready to receive the Sacrament s/he will be asked to walk into the Confessional:

- When each child approaches the priest, s/he begins with the Sign of the Cross and tells the priest how long it has been since the last confession, or say, “**Forgive me Father for I have sinned, this is my first Reconciliation.**”
- The priest will guide your child through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The child will tell the priest his/her sins and answer any questions that might be asked.
- The priest might give your child some advice, and then he will give your child a **penance**.
- Your child will pray **an Act of Contrition**.
- The priest will **absolve** your child of his/her sins.

Your child will thank the priest and leave the Confessional. He or she will return to the pew, kneel and recite (do) the penance given in the Confessional.



EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

1. When I make choices, do I sometimes forget to think first about what God wants me to do?
2. Have I done what God wants?
3. Have I used the name of God or Jesus in a bad way?
4. Did I worship God at Mass each Sunday?
5. Have I disobeyed the grown-ups who take care of me?
6. Have I been angry with or cruel to others?
7. Have I forgotten to show respect for my body and the bodies of others?
8. Have I taken anything that is not mine, or have I treated others unfairly?
9. Have I always told the truth?
10. Have I hurt someone by what I have said or done?
11. Have I been jealous of others?
12. Have I refused to help people who are in need?
13. Have I been selfish?

DIFFERENT TYPES OF SIN

Mortal Sin: A very big sin that kills all life of Grace in our souls.

- A serious offense against God;
- Destroys the virtue of charity within us;
- Involves serious immoral acts, or grave matter such as the breaking one of the Ten Commandments;
- Can cause eternal separation from God;
- Requires full knowledge and complete consent.

Venial Sin: A small sin that makes a soul less pleasing to God.

- Less serious because they do not destroy our relationship with God;
- Wrong acts committed without full knowledge of just how wrong they are.
