

Dog friendly beaches

Berrow Beach, Brean Beach & Brean Down
(approx. 25 miles)

Dogs are permitted at all times of the year on these sandy beaches. At Brean Beach and Brean Down, it's possible to park your car directly on the sand – a great place for you and your dog to run free!

Please take care at low tide.



The Countryside Code and your dog

The countryside is a great place to exercise dogs, but it's every owner's duty to make sure their dog is not a danger or nuisance to farm animals, wildlife or other people.

- ✿ By law, you must control your dog so that it does not disturb or scare farm animals or wildlife. You must keep your dog on a short lead on most areas of open country and common land between 1 March and 31 July, and always near farm animals.
- ✿ You do not have to put your dog on a lead on public paths if it is under close control. But as a rule, keep your dog on a lead if you cannot rely on its obedience. By law, farmers are entitled to destroy a dog that injures or worries their animals.
- ✿ If a farm animal chases you and your dog, it is safer to let your dog on the lead – don't risk getting hurt by trying to protect it.
- ✿ Take particular care that your dog doesn't scare sheep and lambs or wander where it might disturb birds that nest on the ground and other wildlife – eggs and young will soon die without protection from their parents.
- ✿ Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections – so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly. Also make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people.
- ✿ At certain times dogs may not be allowed on some areas of open land or may need to be kept on a lead.

IMPORTANT

Please read our dog rules,

(these have been put in place to ensure the most enjoyable stay for all our guests)

- ✿ Please keep your dog on a short leash/lead in all areas whilst on the park, this includes on your pitch.
- ✿ Please refrain from extendable leads around the park.
- ✿ Please keep dogs tethered, within the boundaries of your own pitch.
- ✿ If your dog is likely to bark, whine or get distressed while you're in reception, the shop, or the shower block, please do not leave your dog unattended outside.
- ✿ Prolonged or frequent periods of barking / woofing / whining is likely to impact on the relaxation and enjoyment of other guests so please do try to be aware of this and take the necessary actions to ensure a pleasant experience for all.
- ✿ We do understand that it's not always possible to predict how your dog will take to a new environment, especially if it's your pet's first holiday however it's your responsibility to ensure other guests are not being disturbed.
- ✿ Please only leave dogs unattended on your pitch or in your unit if you are certain they will not become distressed or cause any problems for other guests. **(In extreme heat we ask dogs not to be left in vehicles/tents alone at any time).**
- ✿ Dogs are **Not** to be walked or exercised on the park any time, there are many areas nearby where dogs can be walked.
- ✿ We ask all dog owners do a visual check of their pitch before leaving to ensure the next guests doesn't get any unwanted surprise.
- ✿ We reserve the right to refuse or ask customers to leave should their dog's behaviour cause a nuisance or upset to any other guests, this includes showering aggressive behaviour or if owners are not abiding by the site regulations.
- ✿ Dog parking is provided outside all buildings.
- ✿ We ask all dog owners please be mindful where dogs are urinating as this is causing several of our plants/shrubs to die.
