# Mental Health & Well-Being




14% of members said they are doing great with their conflict resolution skills

This summer, Horizons Mental Health Center paid a visit each week to our Avenue A site, to help our members build social and emotional skills. It has been an incredible experience! Our members learned the importance of teamwork and how to build on others' ideas. They also discovered how to cope with changes made by others, which can be quite challenging. These skills are essential for thriving in the classroom or at work. We're thrilled to see our members grow and develop these crucial skills. Supporting youth mental health is more important now than ever!

Through engaging discussions and interactive role-playing activities, SMART Girls learn how to confidently say no to drug and alcohol use, as well as premature sexual activity. We also delve into important topics like dealing with BFFs and frenemies, understanding the qualities of trustworthy friends, and navigating

We believe that every young man has the power to make a difference in the world, and Passport to Manhood equips them with the tools to do just that. # Not Child Care...

#### ...But Part of the Equation

There is a child care shortage in Reno County. It impacts each of us as parents, residents, and employers.

Last fall, Kansas State University conducted a child care needs assessment and market study for Reno County. It shows there is a childcare shortage for children ages 0-5. It's a pressing issue in our community.

We support our community partners who are working diligently to address the early child care shortage. At the Boys & Girls Clubs of Hutchinson, our role is serving and advocating for school-age children.

## **How the Child Care Crisis Impacts the Club**

The need for school-age care is often overlooked because school hours encompass most of a child's day. However, the needs assessment also shows that parents of school-age children are facing a gap in care. Even parents who have care arrangements for their school-age children report needing child care on key days or times, including school in-service days, natural school breaks, and after school.

At the Boys & Girls Clubs of Hutchinson, we fill many of those gaps. We provide a safe, fun place for K-12 students to spend spring break, part of holiday break and 8 weeks of the summer. What remains a challenge for the Club are the days that school is not in session due to professional development.

## **Challenges in Meeting Community Need**

Our challenges to better meeting community needs identified in the needs assessment include:

- Staffing. Increasingly, we need to pay more in order to attract and retain high-quality youth development professionals.
- School In-Service Days. We employ school personnel and high school and college students—individuals who are largely unavailable to work on USD 308's in-service days because they are attending professional development sessions or are taking classes.
- Space. The need for our service is higher than we can meet. At our K-5 program, we reach capacity during the school year and summer and end up turning some kids away each year—even if we hired more people, we simply don't have the space to serve more K-5 students. Our 6th and up program is not at capacity yet but is growing each year.

Did you know? 89% of Club kids say they feel more safe at the Club compared to other places.

#### **Meeting the Needs of School-Age Children**


From high school workers to those in their 70s, Club employees agreed that one of the biggest needs for Club members now is building social and emotional skills.

Young people need to learn how to regulate their emotions, how to interact with others, how to compromise, how to win and lose. They must build social and emotional skills so they can become successful adults.

We meet these needs through structured and unstructured play, by building relationships between kids and their peers and staff, and through targeted programs.

Did you know? 91% of Club kids say Vision Leaders listen and understand what they have to say.
