TOTAL CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY

ACCORDING TO ST. LOUIS DE MONTFORT

The parish of St. Joseph will sponsor a group Consecration to Jesus through Mary according to St. Louis de Montfort, which is the 33-day preparation method long cherished by the Catholic faithful since the 1700's. We will follow St. Louis de Montfort's preparation method described in the great Marian Saint's masterpiece "True Devotion to Mary". The first day will begin on February 20 and the consecration day will be on the feast-day of the Annunciation, March 25.

Why should we consecrate ourselves to Jesus through Mary?

The purpose of our life is to arrive at our final destiny: our home in heaven! God created us out of pure love so that we might know Him, love Him, and serve Him in this life and be happy with Him forever in heaven. St. Louis de Montfort tells us that the quickest, easiest, shortest, and most efficacious path to Jesus is through the Blessed Virgin Mary. Other paths might lead to union with Jesus eventually, but Mary is the shortcut!

Does the Catholic Church and the Saints recommend Marian Consecration for us?

Since the time of St. Louis de Montfort (1673-1716), French priest, and the apostle of the Marian age, many other Marian saints such as St. Maximilian Kolbe and St. John Paul II have highlighted this all-important truth: "TO JESUS THROUGH MARY". The Venerable Fulton J. Sheen said "If you have never before prayed to Mary, do so now. Can you not see that if Christ himself willed to be physically formed in her for nine months, and then be spiritually formed by her for thirty years, it is to her that we must go to learn how to have Christ formed in us? Only she who raised Christ can raise a Christian."

What if I have already done the Consecration to St. Joseph?

God desires that all His children be committed to the love and care of a mother and a father. You are not a member of a single parent family. Mary is your spiritual mother, and St. Joseph is your spiritual father. The spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph is extremely important for your spiritual growth. Total Consecration to Mary is not diminished by Consecration to St. Joseph – in fact, Mary wants you to be consecrated to her beloved spouse as well. Be at peace: the Hearts of Jesus, Mary and Joseph are one!

What do I have to do to make my Consecration to Jesus through Mary?

- 1) Sign up for the parish group consecration by registering at the St. Joseph's parish office. The first 33 who sign up with the parish office in advance will receive **Preparation for Total Consecration according to St. Louis de Montfort** at the meeting. Not one of the first 33? The book is widely available, including at a discount from Amazon.
- 2) Come to the first day of the Consecration on Friday, February 20. We will meet in the Social Hall immediately after the Friday 8 a.m. Mass, at 8:30 a.m. There will be a brief presentation on the consecration method, and we will begin day 1 together. For those who wish to do the consecration but cannot be present due to work/home obligations, the readings and prayers can easily be accomplished at home.
- 3) Fr. Eli will lead the prayers on each of the consecration days immediately after all scheduled daily Masses. Additional daily readings from "True Devotion to Mary" are outlined in the book and are encouraged for those who wish to experience the fullness of devotion to Jesus through Mary.
- 4) There will be a final preparation meeting on Tuesday, March 24, immediately after a special 6 p.m. Mass in the Social Hall, which is the day before Consecration Day.
- 5) The group Consecration will take place after a specially scheduled Mass on the Feast of the Annunciation, March 25, at 6 p.m. In summary, there will only be two meetings prior to the Consecration on March 25: February 20 and March 24.
