

The Road Less Traveled: The Road to Glory- March 15, 2026

John 14:1-6

1. Jesus begins by saying, “Don’t be troubled.” What are some things that commonly trouble or unsettle people today? Which of those feel most real in your own life right now?
2. The sermon highlighted that Jesus offers confidence grounded in God’s character, not optimism about circumstances (Fleming Rutledge quote). What is the difference between optimism and true Christian hope? Why does that distinction matter?
3. Jesus speaks about preparing a place for his followers. What do you think this promise reveals about God’s heart toward us and our future with Him?
4. In John 14:3, Jesus promises: “I will return and take you to be with me.” How does the promise of being with Jesus shape the way we understand heaven or eternal life?
5. Thomas asks a very honest question: “We don’t know where you are going — how can we know the way?” Why do you think questions and doubts are important parts of faith? When have questions helped deepen your relationship with God?
6. Jesus says, “I am the way, the truth, and the life.” Which of these three descriptions of Jesus (way, truth, or life) speaks most strongly to you right now, and why?
7. If Jesus himself is the “way,” not just a teacher of the way, how should that shape how Christians live, make decisions, or relate to others this week?
