

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Aldhelm's,

We hope you are ok wherever you are. We are delighted to be in touch with you through this newsletter.

We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you for joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

Readings Summarised

Today's readings centre on the theme of rejoicing in God's saving action. Isaiah encourages the exiled Jews in Babylon to rejoice because God is about to liberate them and bring the m home. The Responsorial Psalm echoes this hope as we sing "Lord, come and save us!" In the second reading, St James urges the early Christians to remain joyful and patient as they await the imminent return of Christ. The Gospel begins with Jesus inviting John the Baptist, who is imprisoned and burdened by doubts, to rejoice by letting go of mistaken expectations about the Messiah and recognising Jesus' healing and preaching as the fulfilment of Isaiah's prophecy. In the second part, Matthew shows Jesus paying exceptional tribute to John, praising his prophetic courage and affirming him as the Messiah's herald and the greatest of the prophets. Jesus ca Is the crowd to rejoice in John's greatness and faithful witness.

Bishop Nicholas Hudson installed as the new Bishop of Plymouth

The Right Reverend Nicholas Hudson was installed as the Bishop of Plymouth at the Cathedral Church of St Mary and St Boniface, Plymouth, on the Patronal Feast Day of St Cuthbert Mayne, Saturday 29 November 2025.

Senior Catholic clergy, including His Excellency Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía, Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, the Most Reverend John Wilson, Metropolitan Archbishop of Southwark and archbishops and bishops from England and Wales attended the Installation Mass.




