Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Aldhelm's,

We hope you are ok wherever you are. We are delighted to be in touch with you through this newsletter. We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you for joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

The first reading from Sirach affirms the God-given freedom of the human will, making

clear that God is not responsible for evil: we are set before life and death and must choose. In the second reading, Paul urges the Corinthians to recognise the hidden wisdom of God's saving plan, now revealed through the Spirit. In the Gospel, taken from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus calls his disciples to a righteousness surpassing that of the scribes and Pharisees. As the new lawgiver, he deepens the Mosaic Law, teaching that anger is akin to murder, lust to adultery, divorce a serious violation, and false oaths a profanation.

Fast and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Members of the Eastern Catholic Churches are to observe the particular law of their own *sui iuris* Church.

Friday 13th February marks the end of Term 3 for St. Joseph's staff and pupils. We say a sad farewell to Mr Paul Bacon and Mrs Sharon Carpenter as co-headteachers at the

end of this term. Mrs Carpenter has worked alongside Mr Bacon since September 2025 and has been dedicated in co-leading the school with Mr Bacon over the past six months in a temporary capacity.

Mr. Bacon has been with St Joseph's since the Autumn of 2023. He initially led St. Joseph's in partnership with Miss Karen Bathe between 2023 and 2024. Thereafter, he led St. Joseph's full time between 2024 and 2025 and then in a part time capacity with Mrs Carpenter since last autumn. The school and parish have been very grateful for the tireless commitment of these school leaders during a period of difficulty for the school.

Mr. Bacon is now leaving St. Joseph's to enjoy a well deserved retirement. We send him our sincere thanks and good wishes as well as huge appreciation for his skill and dedication over the past nearly 3 years.

Bishop commends “ordinary heroism of married love”

Marriage Week, 7-14 February 2026

Bishop Bosco MacDonald, Bishop of Clifton and Lead Bishop for Marriage and Family Life for the Bishops' Conference, has praised the “ordinary heroism of married love, and the strength of family life” in a message to mark Marriage Week that runs from 7-14 February 2026.

“Love has a purpose,” says Bishop MacDonald. “Love is sustained by choice as well as by affection. It is a promise lived again each day, sometimes at a cost, often in quiet, hidden ways. Mercy keeps love alive when people are disappointed in one another. Discernment helps couples face the realities in front of them without bitterness.

The Relics of Saint Carlo Acutis to visit St Gregory the Great, Cheltenham in March.

The Visit of the Relics of Saint Carlo Acutis to St Gregory the Great, Cheltenham, March 8th to 10th 2026

In March 2026, we will host the relics of St Carlo Acutis at two of our churches over three days, during which time we will welcome schools, parishioners and people from all over the diocese for veneration.

Born in 1991, Carlo is the first millennial saint and he is celebrated for his profound faith and use of the internet to log Eucharistic miracles from around the world. At just 7 years old, he wished to receive his First Holy Communion and told his parents, “this is my programme of life.”

Alongside his digital Evangelism, Carlo is revered for his charitable work and great desire to help others. He gave his time towards helping those experiencing homelessness and hunger in Milan, even purchasing sleeping bags and food for the homeless using his own money. Carlo was passionate about spreading the teachings of the Catholic Church up until his death from leukaemia at the age of 15.


