

We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you for joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

#### **Readings this Sunday**

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated (n 14 September, is one of the twelve great feasts honouring Clirist. It recalls the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in 335, where the relics of the true cross, discovered by St Helena in 326, were first installed. The relic was later seized by the Persians in 614 but restored by Emperor Heraclius in 630. The cross quickly became an object of veneration, with early liturgies allowing the faithful to bow, touch, and kiss it. To this day, both Eastern and Western Churches celebrate this feast, the latter adopting it in the seventh century. Scripti re readings highlight the significance of the cross: Numbers recounts God healing Israel through the bronze serpent; Philippians proclaims Christ's humility and obedience unt o death; and John recalls Jesus' words to Nicodemus, expla ning that, like the serpent lifted in the desert, He would be lifted up to bring salvation.


Ordination of Remi Thivet to the Permanent Diaconate, Saturday 20th September








# Thanksgiving Mass for Rem, Sunday 28th September, 10am

# THE TOOLS REQUIRED TO BE A JOYFUL WITNESS OF JESUS




We are pleased to report that good progress has been made with our parish hall project, and we have met the conditions from the diocese to allow us to start the build. We have resolved the VAT issue with HMRC. Raised sufficient funds to make a start and agreed a firm price with the contractor.

Yesterday the 20th of August we have had formal approval to proceed. We still need £40,000 so we will continue to fundraise through events, our applications to donors and grant giving bodies. We will also continue to sell tiles for the roof.

It is planned to start the build on the 1<sup>st</sup> September. We will at that stage lose the use of the clubroom and garages. Access to the choir loft will also not be available during the build.

We will lose most of the courtyard to the contractor during the build. Our access to the church vill be via a path cut down adjacent to the presbytery shown crosshatched in red on the diagram be ow. The church will be open as usual. In addition we must be prepared dust and the noise in the court yard.

During our annual retreat this year our preacher kindly provided a set of handouts, one for each talk, designed to support our personal reflection and prayer. Just sharing with you here in case you find them helpful for your own reflection and medication.

# Anger

'Jesus, as the Lamb of God, takes [sin] away by transforming it, by taking it inside of him and not giving it back. An image can be helpful in explaining this: What Jesus did in his death, in the way he died in love, is analogous to what a water filter does. It takes in water that contains impurities, dirt, toxins, and occasional poisons. The filter does not simply let the water flow through it, as does an electrical cord; rather the water filter holds the dirt and toxins inside of itself and gives back only the pure water. In simple language, Jesus took away the sin of the world by taking in hatred and giving back love; by taking in anger and giving out graciousness; by taking in envy and giving back blessing; by taking in bitterness and giving out warmth; by taking in pettiness and giving back compassion; by taking in chaos and giving back peace; and by taking in sin and giving back forgiveness.' # The Twelve Degrees of Silence - Sr Marie-Aimée de Jésus OCD

- 1. **Silence in words:** is to be as silent as Mary, who was able to hear the voice of the angel.
- 2. Silence in actions: silence in walking, softness in looking, gentleness in speaking.
- 3. Silencing one's imagination: The imagination with its emotions, vague impressions, fears and sadness. In solitude, the soul stays in silence.
- 4. **Silencing one's memories:** forgetting the past and live in a state of gratitude.
- 5. Silence with others: the soul must gently retire to the intimate depths of herself where Jesus will reveal himself to her.
- 6. Silence with one's heart: like a lamp flickering noiselessly at the tabernacle, such is love's silence.
- 7. Silencing one's own self-interest: a silence that stretches us beyond ourselves and our natural tendencies.
- 8. Silencing the mind: in solitude, silence obsessive thinking. In meditation, silence curiosity. In devotion, silence personal desires and plans.
- 9. Silencing judgements: abstain from judging people and things.
- 10. Silencing the will: This is the silence of the lamb that has been sheared. It is the silence of the cross.
- 11. Silence towards oneself: do not complain. Do not feel sorry for yourself. Forget yourself. Separate yourself from yourself. This is the most difficult of silences.
- 12. **Silence with God:** In the beginning, God said to the soul, 'Don't speak too much to others, but speak a lot to me.' Now God says to the soul, 'Don't talk to me any more.' Silence with God is to be united with God.
