Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Aldhelm's,

We hope you are ok wherever you are. We are delighted to be in touch with you through this newsletter. We extend a warm welcome to all visitors and thank you for joining us in celebrating the Lord's love for us in the Holy Eucharist. There are no strangers here, just new friends you have not yet met!

The readings today remind us that faith in God gives courage in times of difficulty. Jeremiah faces opposition and personal attacks, yet he trusts in God's power and continues to proclaim His message fearlessly. The psalmist, though misunderstood and rejected even by his own family, places his confidence in the Lord. St Paul assures the Romans that, through their union with Christ in His death and Resurrection, they need not fear suffering or opposition.

In the Gospel, Jesus prepares His disciples for rejection and persecution as they continue His mission. Three times He tells them, "Do not be afraid." Using the image of the sparrow, Jesus reassures them of God's loving care and protection. The message for us is clear: as followers of Christ, we may face challenges and opposition, but with trust in God we can persevere and faithfully carry out His mission.

SECOND COLLECTION, 21ST JUNE, DAY FOR LIFE

Day for Life – the day in the Church's year dedicated to celebrating the dignity of life from conception to natural death. The collection assists The Anscombe Bioethics Centre for Healthcare and Ethics in Oxford (formerly the Linacre Centre) and other pro-Life groups. The Centre exists to help Catholics and others to explore the Church's position on bioethical issues. St Gerard Majella Relics to Visit Clifton Diocese

2026 marks the 300th anniversary of St Gerard Majella's birth. He was born to a poor family in the South of Italy, and eventually joined the Redemptorist order as a lay brother.

Numerous and varied miracles are attributed to him, but he is known most of all as the patron of mothers, couples trying to conceive, those looking for work, and making a good confession.

In order to promote devotion to St Gerard, the Redemptorists are taking his relics to every diocese in England and Wales. In Clifton diocese there will be a major celebration on Saturday 6th June at St Gerard Majella, Knowle, with a Mass celebrated by Bishop Bosco MacDonald.

There are visits to other parts of the Diocese as well: Holy Ghost, Yeovil (1st, 6pm); St Peter's, Gloucester (2nd, 7pm); St Mary's, Swindon (3rd, 6pm); St Osmund's, Salisbury (5th, 6pm). In each case the relics will be available for personal prayer for an hour before the Mass, and individual blessings with the relics will be offered afterwards.

St Gerard Majella died at the age of only 29, from Tuberculosis, and was canonised in 1904. Come along, and bring your petitions and prayers.

Clifton Diocese Trustee: The Diocese is currently looking for an individual to join the Board of the Trustees to enhance the skills of the Board. Suitable applicants should have a detailed understanding of governance, and experience in change management and transformation activities. This is a voluntary role with the commitment to one 4 hour meeting approximately eight times per year on a Wednesday from 9.30 am in Bristol, along with membership of at least one sub-committee which would meet six times per year. Time to prepare for the various meetings is also required. It is usual for a Trustee to give somewhere in the region of 8 hours per month plus travelling time. Trustee training and travel expenses will be provided.

Marriage course
