

### **Readings this Sunday**

Isaiah's prophecy speaks to the exiles returning to Jerusalem, assuring them that salvation is not lim ted to Israel but open to all, including pagans. His bock concludes with a vision of all nations streaming to Jerusalem to praise God. The Responsorial Psalm "Go out to all the world and tell the Good News," underlines Israel's mission as a light to the nation 3. St Paul, in the second reading, reminds believers that the "narrow gate" of following Christ means embracing suffering as God's loving discipline. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches that salvation comes through the narrow way of sacrificial love and service. He urges his disciples to focus on their own salvation with humility and self-discipline, rather than concerning themselves with the fate of others. Together, the readings stress universality, discipline, and love as the true path to salvation.





#### Ordination of Remi Thivet to the Permanent Diaconate, Saturday 20th September


After four years of preparation and formation, Remi Thivet will be ordained a permanent deacon at Clifton Cathedral on Saturday 20th September at 11am. We have organised a coach to take parishioners to the ordination, with around 45 seats available. The coach will depart from here at 9.15am, allowing plenty of time to arrive, settle in. If those who sign up can be ready in the churchyard by 9am, it will greatly help with boarding and preparations.


#### **HALL UPDATE 21st August 2025**


We are pleased to report that good progress has been made with our parish hall project, and we have met the conditions from the diocese to allow us to start the build. We have resolved the VAT issue with HMRC. Raised sufficient funds to make a star: and agreed a firm price with the contractor.


On the 20th of August we have had formal approval to proceed. We still need £40,000 so we will continue to fundraise through events, our applications to donors and grant giving bodies. We will also continue to sell tiles for the roof.

It is planned to start the build on the 1<sup>st</sup> September. We will at that stage lose the us  $\ni$  of the clubroom and garages. Access to the choir loft will also not be available during the build.

We will lose most of the courtyard to the contractor during the build. Our access to the church will be via a path cut down adjacent to the presbytery shown crosshatched in red on the diagram below. The church will be open as usual. In addition we must be prepared dust and the noise in the court yard.







Our annual Formation Day will take place on 11 October at St. Brendan's College, Brislington, with Mgr John Armitage (Parish Priest, Former Rector of the National Basilica of Our Lady of Walsingham and Master of the Guild of Our Lady of Ransom) as our keynote speaker. He will be reflecting on the theme of Being an Evangelist Today: the tools required to be a joyful witness of Jesus'.

In addition, there will be several workshop options for you to attend. You may choose two workshops when booking your ticket. Please bring a packed lunch for the day.
