

Readings this Sunday

The readings remind us that true discipleship demands discernment, detachment, and courage. The Book of Wisclom urges us to seek the Spirit's gifts of strength and discernment to follow God's will. Psalm 90 teaches that life is brief and uncertain, so disciples must live holy lives. St Paul's letter to Philemon shows the sacrifices discipleship requires: Paul gives up Onesimus, his helper, while Onesimus faces his master as a renewed Christian. The Gospel calls us to "count the cost" of following Jesus, for discipleship is demanding. Jesus sets out four conditions: placing God above family ties; living free from attachment to possessions; carrying the cross through suffering, sacrifice, and witness; and thoughtfully accepting the lifelong commitment discipleship entails. Christian life is therefore a radical surrender of self to Christ, who loves us and leads us to eternal life.






First Holy Communion – June 2026






Canonisation of Blessed Carlo Acutis, Sunday 7th September


Ordination of Remi Thivet to the Permanent Diaconate, Saturday 20th September





Thanksgiving Mass for Rem, Sunday 28th September, 10am

Temporary Road Closure Order Town Police Clauses Act 1847

IN ACCORDANCE with Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847, which section gives Wiltshire Council ("the Council") the power to make an Order for roads within its administrative area to be closed temporarily to all vehicular traffic (and for alternative routes to be observed) for the purposes of preventing obstruction.

The Council HEREBY ORDERS

On: Saturday 30th August 2025 between the hours of 16.00 and 20.00

Purpose: Malmesbury Carnival Procession

That the following roads and streets in the town of **Malmesbury** are to be closed (save in any case of emergency) to all vehicular traffic at the approximate times set out below:

Between the hours of 16.00 and 20.00:

 a) Park Road (Part); from its junction with Old Alexander Road to its junction with Gloucester Road;

Between the hours of 17.00 and 20.00:

- B) Gloucester Road (Part); from its junction with Old Station Mews to its junction with The Triangle:
- c) The Triangle (Part); from its junction with Gloucester Road to its junction with Abbey Row;
- d) Abbey Row; from its junction with The Triangle to its junction with Gloucester Street;
- e) Gloucester Street; from its junction with Abbey Row to its junction with Oxford Street;
- f) Oxford Street (Part); from its junction with Gloucester Street to its junction with Cross Hayes Lane;
- g) Market Cross; from its junction with Oxford Street for its entire length;
- Cross Hayes Lane; from its junction with Oxford Street to its junction with St. Dennis Road:
- i) St. Dennis Road; from its junction with Cross Hayes Lane to its junction with High Street;
- j) High Street (Part); from its junction with St. Dennis Road to its junction with Oxford Street.

Nothing in this Order shall prevent vehicles from proceeding in the said lengths of roads when being used in connection with the event stated above.


IMPORTANT: It is an offence to wilfully breach the terms of this order and anyone committing such an offence shall be liable on summary conviction in the Magistrates' Court to a penalty not exceeding £1,000.

We are pleased to report that good progress has been made with our parish hall project, and we have met the conditions from the diocese to allow us to start the build. We have resolved the VAT issue with HMRC. Raised sufficient funds to make a start and agreed a firm price with the contractor.

Yesterday the 20th of August we have had formal approval to proceed. We still need £40,000 so we will continue to fundraise through events, our applications to donors and grant giving bodies. We will also continue to sell tiles for the roof.

It is planned to start the build on the 1st September. We will at that stage lose the use of the clubroom and garages. Access to the choir loft will also not be available during the build.

We will lose most of the courtyard to the contractor during the build. Our access to the church vill be via a path cut down adjacent to the presbytery shown crosshatched in red on the diagram be ow. The church will be open as usual. In addition we must be prepared dust and the noise in the court yard.
