

Readings this Sunday

In today's readings, we see the power of gratitude faith, and God's universal love. Naaman, a Syrian commander and pagan outcast with leprosy, returned to thank the prophet Elisha and pledged allegianc 3 to God after being healed. St. Paul encourages Timo hy to remain grateful to God even amid suffering and the dangers of spreading His Word, trusting in God's faithfulness. In the Gospel, only one of ten lepers- –a Samaritan considered a heretic—returned to thank Jesus, while the others, perhaps assuming healing was their right, went on their way. Faith and healir g are closely linked: Naaman's faith led him to the Jordan, and the lepers' faith brought them to Jesus. These readings also highlight that God's love extends beyond Israel to all peoples, including Samaritans and pagans, showing that gratitude, faith, and recognition of God's mercy are universal.



Starting School? If you have a child born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, then now is the time to apply for a place at a primary school for admission from September 2026 onwards. You must complete an application form that is available from the school admissions team of the Wiltshire Council. If your child has been baptised and you are applying for a Catholic school, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15 January 2026.






St Carlo Acutis - Mr Wilkinson
