#### **MASS INTENTIONS**

Offering Mass for a special Intention is a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is said. Masses are offered for many reasons: for the souls in purgatory, in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or in honor of a birthday or anniversary. If you would like to have a Mass said for someone, go to the Parish Office to get on the schedule. Cards are then given to you so that you can mail them to whomever you choose to so they may also participate in the Mass. The stipend or offering given, **(\$10 or more)** signifies the sacrificial nature of giving of something of yourself to associate more intimately with Christ who offers himself in the Eucharist.

For those families requesting a Letter of good standing, participation letter from the office for school registrations, Sacraments, Godparent verification, etc. you must meet the following criteria;

- 1. Be officially registered in our parish for at least six months. Considerations will be taken for military families new to the parish and will be addressed on case-by-case basis.
- 2. Be in good standing which means you and your family regularly attend Mass and contribute to our offertory program. You must use your assigned envelope/giving number for these donations to be recorded properly. We understand that sometimes people are unable to give to the parish; however, placing your envelope even if its empty in the basket helps us determine that someone is in fact participating in the life of a parish.
- 3. If you have moved away and are not actively participating in our parish life, and if we have not seen you at mass for weeks and months, we may be unable to issue you with the above mentioned documents. Additionally, your standing within the parish may differ from those who consistently attend and share with our community their Time, Talent and Treasure.

#### **Sacrament of Baptism in OLSS**

A newborn child should be baptized within the first few months of life. A child who has reached the age of kindergarten should receive some basic instruction/ preparation before reception of the Sacrament. In order to have a child baptized at Our Lady Star of the Sea, at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the OLSS Parish. A child to be baptized should normally have two Godparents, a male and a female. In order to serve as a Godparent, a person must be a practicing Roman Catholic, fully initiated, and at least sixteen years of age. A Godparent must supply a letter from his/her proper pastor indicating suitability to serve as a Godparent for Baptism. Parents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class which lasts approximately one hour.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage in OLSS**

Those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage need to contact the church office for a list of instructions at least <u>six months in advance</u> of the anticipated wedding date. Definite plans for a particular date should not be made until such contact has been completed. Only when a priest or deacon has decided that he will officiate at the marriage, will a definite date be set. There is a requirement for marriage preparation classes. Options for these will be discussed when you meet with the priest or deacon you have chosen as your celebrant


#### **OUR PLACE AT THE TABLE**

The wonderful season of Easter surrenders each year to what might feel like a dull doctrinal thud: the triple threat of Pentecost, Trinity, and Corpus Christi. It's like pushing away from a satiating banquet only to be invited on a heavy theological sojourn: Sorry, but it's hard to think big thoughts after a feast of these proportions! We know that church, Trinity, and Eucharist are important ideas, and we are, after all, the church that's espousing and celebrating these notions. But do we need to hand over three entire Sundays each year to a survey of these great elements of Christianity?

We do. The church calendar invites us to deepen our faith with a wheel of opportunities: consolation in Advent, repentance in Lent, affirmation in Easter, and evangelization throughout Ordinary Time. During this short stretch of "idea feasts" we're also asked to do some catechesis. It's not that Catholics are unacquainted with the weighty doctrines we celebrate - although a surprising number may falter if asked to explain them. But in paying lip service year-round to these doctrines in our profession of faith, we may take them for granted if we don't explore their deeper meaning from time to time. Like any relationship, one that's ignored remains superficial or becomes irrelevant.

What Paul tells the Corinthians about the Eucharist sets the stage for everything else we may say about it. Jesus offers this gift "on the night before he was handed over." Like any gift, it has a clear context. Our Eucharist can't be understood outside of its proximity to the Passion and death of Jesus. Christ makes his great self-offering before anyone else can lay claim to his life. When we proclaim this great truth, we proclaim his death. When we drink this cup, we share his death. Eucharist is thanksgiving: What we are grateful for is that Jesus laid down his life for his friends—you and I among them.

As theologian Eugene Laverdiere points out, the giving and taking of Eucharist is far from a passive event. Jesus intends it, and we signal our intentions by our participation. Jesus gives his life - no one takes it from him without his permission. When we accept his life in the Eucharist, we join with Jesus in saying to the world: "This is my body, my life, and it is for you." We shouldn't take it if we don't mean it. We'd be fools to take it if we aren't prepared to do as we are saying. It's a big, hungry world out there, as the gospel story reminds us. Jesus invites us not to simply spread his Eucharist around but to "give them some food yourselves." Receiving consecrated food makes us consecrated people. This feast reminds us: It's time to live up to our reputation.



The Gospel for this feast reminds me of what my aunt used to tell us when we would visit her and share a meal. She always fixed more than enough for everyone (even with her three kids and my parents' eight kids); her favorite saying was, "If you don't get enough to eat, it's your own fault." Perhaps Jesus would say the same as he feeds us with his Body and Blood.

Some say that the multiplication of loaves was not done by breaking the laws of physics. Instead, they say that Jesus, when he began to share the little bread that he had, touched the hearts of all those who had brought food with them. They followed his example by sharing their food also—so much that there were twelve baskets left over. While I don't doubt that Jesus could have multiplied the loaves he had, it reminds me of the temptation in the desert, when the devil told him to make bread out of rocks. If he rejected that temptation, why would he do almost the same thing now?

No, Jesus came to change people's hearts, to show them God's love and how to love one another. The miracle of the loaves shows us that Jesus can feed millions with his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. The miracle of changing bread and wine into his Body and Blood is not just so we can feel good about having Jesus so near to us. It is meant to strengthen us to do our best as his disciples. As food and drink help us to keep on working, his Body and Blood help us to keep on loving. Look around as the Communion procession goes by and think about how many are united with Jesus. Let the broken bread and poured-out wine remind you of how Jesus gave himself up to death on the cross. When the disciples told Jesus about the hungry crowd, he told them, "Give them some food yourselves" (Luke 9:13). And one day they would. When they celebrated the Eucharist after Jesus' resurrection, they gave that spiritual food to the new followers of Christ. We continue that today. With Jesus' strength we can teach all people about the Father's love for them and how they can love each other.

## **ATTENTION YOUNG MEN**

Have received their First Holy Communion. Be mature enough to understand the ministry and responsibilities. Understand the disciplines and requirements of the Roman Liturgy.
