"Do not be afraid." How good it is for someone who is worried to hear those words from Jesus. In the Bible the words "do not be afraid" are used 365 times. Jesus knew we needed to hear those words. "Do not be afraid." Jesus, who was human as well as divine, knew that some of us need to be reminded again and again not to worry. So many times, in the Gospels we hear Jesus asking us not to worry. Three times in today's Gospel we hear Jesus saying, "Do not be afraid." The reason why Jesus tells us these words is that the Heavenly Father has great concern for us all. He knows us well, our person, our wellbeing, our needs. Hence the central theme of today's reading is that we should expel all fear and anxiety from our minds by cherishing an unshakable confidence in the never-failing providence of God.

Today's First Reading from the Book of Jeremiah recalls an event that took place when the Lord God called the great prophet Jeremiah as His spokesman to warn the people of the coming judgment that awaited Israel because of their sins. He never wanted to be a prophet since he knew the conflicts and the evil behavior of the people. His fidelity to his mission brought him nothing but heartbreak. The unbelievers laughed at Jeremiah. They plotted against him so that they could silence him. He was denounced for speaking on behalf of God and was put in prison. His former friends sided with his enemies, and he knew the whispers of many. They had made several attempts on his life. They were watching to see when he would fail so that they could take revenge.

Today's Second Reading, the Letter of Paul to the Romans, reminds us that by the grace of God the Father, we received a free gift through Jesus Christ. Paul tells us clearly that we are dealing with a God of infinite mercy and infinite love. He created man and gave him gifts which raised him above all other earthly creatures. Through these gifts man was able to recognize that he is a mere creature and must respect and respond faithfully to his creator. Through the sin of disobedience of one man, Adam, all his descendants were called to suffer eternal damnation. Because of the solidarity of the human race, by Adam's sin all human beings were alienated from God. But, thanks to the righteous act of one Man, Jesus Christ, all human beings have become right with God.

The reading from the Gospel of Matthew advises us not to afraid of human persons. Jesus repeatedly asks the twelve disciples not to be afraid. As disciples we stand with Jesus entrusting ourselves to him. Jesus reassures us of our value in God's eyes and promises us that he will protect us as he does with the birds of the air and entire creation. Jesus asks his followers to preach boldly, fearing no shame from their peers in this world. The flat housetops provided easier places of preaching than the streets themselves. He tells them that they should be "shouting from the housetops" that underlines the boldness with which disciples must make God's message known. Ultimately, they must fear God alone because God is judge in the end; we should not fear even persecutors who threaten death. Mortals can destroy only our body, while God can resurrect the body at any time.

Jesus plants into the hearts of his disciples the great power and might of God who is their caretaker. He assures them that they can trust God's sovereignty as their protection in the face of any disaster or death. He gives the example of the sparrows sold in the market and a buyer certainly could have a good bargain while purchasing them. Sparrows thus were the cheapest commodity sold in the markets; an assarion was a small coin, one-sixteenth of a denarius, thus equivalent to less than an hour's wage. Yet as worthless as sparrows were to people, and having such a meager monetary value, even then God watched over them. Jewish teachers agreed that God was sovereign over each bird's fate. We may therefore be strongly assured that nothing happens to us when God is "not looking".

Jesus delicately tells his disciples not to be worried of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. The history of the church is filled with examples where people have stood for Jesus and sacrificed their lives. A prominent example was when Archbishop Oscar Romero was gunned down in the middle of celebrating Mass by the military rulers of El Salvador, to be followed some years later by the brutal and sadistic murder of six Jesuit priests dragged from their beds in the middle of the night. All that these men did was to draw attention to the many injustices being perpetrated against the poor and powerless in their society. There are many others who have died silently and are known to Jesus alone.

Though He may permit us to suffer for our faith, our Father will never forget or abandon us. As Jesus assures us today, everything unfolds in His providence, under His watchful gaze—even the falling of the tiniest

sparrow to the ground. Each one of us is precious to Him. Steadfast in this faith, we must resist the tactics of Satan. He is the enemy who seeks the ruin of our soul in Gehenna, or hell.

Not all Christians have equal opportunities of being spokespersons for God. Bishops and priests have the official duty of encouraging and teaching the faithful. Their difficult but worthwhile task is to faithfully hand on Christ's teaching, and correct errors that threaten the integrity of the traditional Christian doctrine or ethical standards. Like Jeremiah and other Old Testament prophets, they remind their people of God's revealed will and of the high moral standards God asks of us. And, like the prophets, priests can often expect criticism and opposition, just for doing their job.

We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavor to live a Christian life. Sometimes we let the opinions of others prevent us from doing what we know to be right. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us.

Our commitment to Christ will be put to the test. We will hear whispered warnings and denunciations, as Jeremiah does in today's First Reading. Even so-called friends will try to trap and trip us up. For His sake we will bear insults and be made outcasts—even in our own homes, we hear in today's Psalm. As Jeremiah tells us, we must expect that God will challenge our faith in Him, and probe our minds and hearts, to test the depths of our love. "Do not be afraid," Jesus assures us three times in today's Gospel.

Parents who want a Catholic Faith Formation & Education for their children will see to it that their family attends Mass faithfully <u>EVERY Sunday</u>.
- An active parishioner gives of themselves by donating TIME, TALENT and TREASURE to the ministries of the parish and or to the volunteer organizations that support the parish. We are to share in the responsibilities that keep our Parish alive in a vibrant way. And lastly,
- An active parishioner is a good financial steward of the church. As a parishioner, it is important to understand that giving financially to support the parish is a vital and key component to active parishioner status.

### WHY YOU NEED TO BE AN ACTIVE PARISHIONER

Parishioners desiring to rightfully enjoy the number of services offered at Our Lady Star of the Sea and St. Francis of Assisi Mission, seeking to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, or those wishing to be joined in Holy Matrimony must first be verified as "active members" of the parish. Please do not think, "Well, Father sees me and knows who I am," because the verification is not based on memory but what is in the database.

### **An Active Member:**

- (1) Is properly registered on the parish rolls, with all contact information kept current.
- (2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
- (3) Participates in parish activities/ministries whenever possible; and
- (4) Consistently uses the parish envelope system for donations to support the parish ministries and other social and ministerial services. The envelope system tracks both Mass attendance and giving. If you give online, please turn in your envelope at Mass and check "I've given electronically".

An extended time with no activity will place a family on inactive status. This is important so that the Diocese does not assess OLSS & SFoA for Inactive parishioners.

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
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
