Binding and loosing

Who do we say Jesus is? Identifying Jesus has never been as easy as it looks. Walk into any Catholic church and the most prominent image will be his: either as suffering Savior or triumphant Lord. It will be clear to any alien from outer space that whatever happens in this context has to do with this person, whoever he is. But the question of who precisely he is remains the one to answer. Even believers spend a lifetime taking stabs at addressing it, with greater or lesser accuracy.

We know what the Creed says: "We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God, from true God, begotten, not made, one in being with the Father." That is a long sentence, a theologically complex one, and it is only the first one that seeks to identify Jesus in our profession of faith. It claims that Jesus is "one," unique in history, and that he is "Lord," to be revered. He is "Christ," the anointed of God, as well as "Son of God," the special and personal claim that God is his only Father. "Eternally begotten"? There was never a time when the Son of God was not, or when the Christ came into being, "Not made"—Jesus is not simply a creature like us, not a product of the divine imagination but "one in Being with the Father," sharing God's very life and substance.

Unpacking our profession

Who else do we, the church, say that Jesus is? This astounding statement: "Through him all things were made." By this we understand that Jesus, the man of history, also stands outside of history as the Christ, present at the creation of the world. For our salvation "he came down from heaven"—this is a big comedown, what Saint Paul describes in Philippians as emptying himself of divine privilege and entering into slavery.

He was born of a mother and became flesh, like the rest of us. And he suffered, died, and was buried in a way most of us would shudder to consider. Just as his birth came about through a woman with a name, Mary, so too his crucifixion was due to a man, Pilate. There is something so specific, time-bound, and purposeful about these two namings. They are the only two people who appear in our Creed apart from Jesus himself. These two names represent all the human choices throughout history that give birth to Jesus, or put him to death, in every generation. Individuals do that. It doesn't just happen.

According to holy scripture he rises, ascends, and returns to his rightful place with his Father. He will preside over the great judgment, and the Kingdom he once announced is his everlasting. That is who we, the church, say that Jesus is. But saying isn't believing, and believing isn't behaving as if it's true. The difference between believing with our heads and behaving with our lives can be a huge chasm. Like Peter, we can come up with the theologically correct answer "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" and still get it all wrong in the ways that matter.

The man with the keys

Two people get the keys handed to them in this Sunday's readings. The first is a fellow named Eliakim, who is named the successor to Shebna, master of the palace in Jerusalem. He gets the responsibility of admittance to the king's presence, a position of great trust because the king is vulnerable to his servant's judgment. We care more about the second recipient, Peter, who receives the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Keys mean access—just ask anyone who's lost theirs to describe how immediately helpless they feel. Peter is granted a share in the divine power to open and close doors to the reign of God itself. What a staggering authority is his!

"Binding and loosing," as this authority is described, are technical rabbinical terms. First they refer to exorcism and the binding of demonic power. Jesus took charge over a lot of demons in his time and expected his disciples to do the same. The other forms of binding and loosing had to do with membership and excommunication, respectively, and juridical decision-making in general.

These last categories of binding and loosing pretty much describe our present understanding of the magisterium of the church, its teaching authority over its membership. Binding and loosing, saying yes and saying no, opening and shutting the gates, is a divine privilege and an awesome responsibility.

We, too, share the responsibility

Traditionally, the church understands the unique selection of Peter as rock and master of the keys through apostolic succession and the historical papacy. But biblical scholars also note that the powers of binding and loosing are given to the church as a whole through Peter its representative.

Not all of us legislate, administer sacraments, and absolve sins, of course. But we do make moral discernments, welcome or forbid others to our community, and offer or deny forgiveness to those who seek it from us. We judge and administer judgment a thousand times a day in acts of acceptance and rejection. Whether we intend it or not, we are participating in the binding and loosing of our sisters and brothers, as well as of the demons that inhabit our own hearts. If that idea intimidates us or gives us pause, it should. We admit or deny the reign of God breaking into time in every hour by our choices.

If we read a little further on in Isaiah's story of Eliakim, the palace gatekeeper, we discover that eventually he lost the position of authority he had been given. He had been fixed "like a peg in a sure spot." But a later note is added ominously to chapter 22: "The peg fixed in a sure spot shall give way, break off and fall, and the weight that hung on it shall be done away with; for the Lord has spoken." We don't know exactly what Eliakim did to lose his sacred trust. But we are forewarned that we are held responsible for how we use the keys.
