#### **MASS INTENTIONS**

Offering Mass for a special Intention is a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is said. Masses are offered for many reasons: for the souls in purgatory, in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or in honor of a birthday or anniversary. If you would like to have a Mass said for someone, go to the Parish Office to get on the schedule. Cards are then given to you so that you can mail them to whomever you choose to so they may also participate in the Mass. The stipend or offering given, (\$10 or more) signifies the sacrificial nature of giving of something of yourself to associate more intimately with Christ who offers himself in the Eucharist.

For those families requesting a Letter of good standing, participation letter from the office for school registrations, Sacraments, Godparent verification, etc. you must meet the following criteria;

- 1. Be officially registered in our parish for at least six months. Considerations will be taken for military families new to the parish and will be addressed on case-by-case basis.
- 2. Be in good standing which means you and your family regularly attend Mass and contribute to our offertory program. You must use your assigned envelope/giving number for these donations to be recorded properly. We understand that sometimes people are unable to give to the parish; however, placing your envelope even if its empty in the basket helps us determine that someone is in fact participating in the life of a parish.
- 3. If you have moved away and are not actively participating in our parish life, and if we have not seen you at mass for weeks and months, we may be unable to issue you with the above mentioned documents. Additionally, your standing within the parish may differ from those who consistently attend and share with our community their Time, Talent and Treasure.

#### **Sacrament of Baptism in OLSS**

A newborn child should be baptized within the first few months of life. A child who has reached the age of kindergarten should receive some basic instruction/preparation before reception of the Sacrament. In order to have a child baptized at Our Lady Star of the Sea, at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the OLSS Parish. A child to be baptized should normally have two Godparents, a male and a female. In order to serve as a Godparent, a person must be a practicing Roman Catholic, fully initiated, and at least sixteen years of age. A Godparent must supply a letter from his/her proper pastor indicating suitability to serve as a Godparent for Baptism. Parents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class which lasts approximately one hour.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage in OLSS**

Those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage need to contact the church office for a list of instructions at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date. Definite plans for a particular date should not be made until such contact has been completed. Only when a priest or deacon has decided that he will officiate at the marriage, will a definite date be set. There is a requirement for marriage preparation classes. Options for these will be discussed when you meet with the priest or deacon you have chosen as your celebrant

#### YOU'VE GOT TO BE IN 100%

Half measures will never do. That is today's gospel response to the idea of the "good-enough Christian": one who basically colors inside the moral lines and meets the minimum requirements of church membership. Good- enough isn't good enough. Being the Body of Christ makes us sharers in the life of Jesus! And he was never known to do things halfway. That isn't the popular answer, I know. Joseph Champlin wrote a thoughtful book 20 years ago titled The Marginal Catholic: Challenge, Don't Crush. He cautioned pastoral ministers to go slowly, invite warmly, and back off immensely when it comes to ecclesial rule-enforcement. We choose between representing "the cruel or compassionate church," in Champlin's terms.

Certainly we're all in favor of compassion here. Challenging people too far ahead of where they are will surely be a compelling excuse for some to bail off the path of righteousness altogether. But it's perhaps more dangerous to give our assemblies the impression that Christianity has an agreeable comfort zone and it's right where they happen to be sitting. The satisfied Christian courts disaster. The plain truth is: Not being "bad" isn't the goal. Being a disciple of Jesus is the goal, and that's a lot harder.

Consider the person constructing a tower with only a vague idea of the bottom line. That tower doesn't get built - but it does garner a few laughs at the would-be builder's expense. Abandoned worksites around the country today bear witness that quite a few people haven't thought through the cost of their ambitions lately.

If our intention is to follow Jesus, we have to be thoughtful about the dimensions of this proposition. What does it cost to follow Jesus? Chances are you can see a symbol of that from where you're sitting: the cross. Discipleship is an expensive proposition. It costs everything you have and everything you are. Renounce all your possessions, Jesus says. This is no time to talk tithing; Jesus expects you to render the whole enchilada.

Why is the price so high? Because the stakes are just as high. This earthen shelter of ours isn't for keeps. It's a collapsible tent, struck down in a handful of decades. It's a watch in the night, says the psalmist, come and gone. And the life of the body isn't only corruptible in terms of time but also in terms of virtue. We stand to lose everything worth having if we're not willing to pit everything we have as ballast against that inevitable corruption. Jesus isn't asking us to throw our stuff away. He's begging us not to throw our lives away. Take a few moments. Consider your blueprints. What are you building, and what are you willing to spend?

#### FREE TO LOVE

St. Paul must have understood today's Gospel very well. Like Jesus, he knew what being a disciple would cost. It landed him in prison. Yet he seems to have no regrets; he accepts that imprisonment as part of his discipleship. Also like Jesus, he is not afraid to ask others to take that discipleship seriously. And he is not ashamed to ask a favor: Would Philemon accept his runaway slave, Onesimus, back into his home? Not just as a slave, but as a member of his family. He shamelessly calls himself a prisoner for Christ five times in the short letter (three times in our reading). If that didn't tug Philemon's heartstrings, Paul also calls himself an old man. In the Gospel, Jesus talks about the cost of discipleship. Paul takes that a step further; he reminds us to accept that cost freely. He could have ordered his friend to free the slave. Paul was an apostle, a leader in the early church. Instead of giving an order, he called on Philemon to respond freely to his request. Perhaps we can learn from that example.

Like Paul, when Jesus commands us to love one another, he leaves us free to accept that challenge. Remember, he always says, "Love one another, as I have loved you" (John 13:34). Jesus was never compelled to cure anyone or forgive their sins. No one ordered him to feed the hungry with loaves and fishes or raise Lazarus from the dead. Yet how often do we go to church because we were told we have to? Do we volunteer for the picnic only because the pastor twists our arm? Or do we love Jesus so much that we volunteer to help without being asked? Do we love Jesus enough to invite others to follow him?

We can live life just doing what we have to. Or when Jesus offers us a new motive - love for God because God loves us - we can choose to follow him freely. In John's Gospel, there is no Agony in the Garden. He shows us that Jesus chose to obey his Father and willingly took up the cross. Let us ask the Spirit to fill us with the freedom to love.


