#### **MASS INTENTIONS**

Offering Mass for a special Intention is a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is said. Masses are offered for many reasons: for the souls in purgatory, in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or in honor of a birthday or anniversary. If you would like to have a Mass said for someone, go to the Parish Office to get on the schedule. Cards are then given to you so that you can mail them to whomever you choose to so they may also participate in the Mass. The stipend or offering given, (\$10 or more) signifies the sacrificial nature of giving of something of yourself to associate more intimately with Christ who offers himself in the Eucharist.

For those families requesting a Letter of good standing, participation letter from the office for school registrations, Sacraments, Godparent verification, etc. you must meet the following criteria;

- 1. Be officially registered in our parish for at least six months. Considerations will be taken for military families new to the parish and will be addressed on case-by-case basis.
- 2. Be in good standing which means you and your family regularly attend Mass and contribute to our offertory program. You must use your assigned envelope/giving number for these donations to be recorded properly. We understand that sometimes people are unable to give to the parish; however, placing your envelope even if its empty in the basket helps us determine that someone is in fact participating in the life of a parish.
- 3. If you have moved away and are not actively participating in our parish life, and if we have not seen you at mass for weeks and months, we may be unable to issue you with the above mentioned documents. Additionally, your standing within the parish may differ from those who consistently attend and share with our community their Time, Talent and Treasure.

#### Sacrament of Baptism in OLSS

A newborn child should be baptized within the first few months of life. A child who has reached the age of kindergarten should receive some basic instruction/preparation before reception of the Sacrament. In order to have a child baptized at Our Lady Star of the Sea, at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the OLSS Parish. A child to be baptized should normally have two Godparents, a male and a female. In order to serve as a Godparent, a person must be a practicing Roman Catholic, fully initiated, and at least sixteen years of age. A Godparent must supply a letter from his/her proper pastor indicating suitability to serve as a Godparent for Baptism. Parents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class which lasts approximately one hour.

#### Sacrament of Marriage in OLSS

Those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage need to contact the church office for a list of instructions at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date. Definite plans for a particular date should not be made until such contact has been completed. Only when a priest or deacon has decided that he will officiate at the marriage, will a definite date be set. There is a requirement for marriage preparation classes. Options for these will be discussed when you meet with the priest or deacon you have chosen as your celebrant

#### PLEASE PRAY FOR THE SICK

All the names of the sick we receive will be entered on the prayer list for one month, and then removed. If you would like your loved one to remain on the prayer list longer, please let us know, and we will happily oblige.

#### **CONSIDER THE SOURCE**

We call scripture the "word of God." That's a grand claim. If God said it, or wrote it, such an idea carries a great deal more currency than if you or I take the credit for it. We may be smart on a good day; God is the very author of Wisdom and remains the source of truth through all eternity. That's the difference. It's considerable.

Today's passage from 2 Timothy is celebrated in Dei Verbum, Vatican II's Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation. This document tells us how Catholics understand the Bible, especially how it acts as revelatory source and inspired text for us. All scripture is inspired and useful, it declares. All. This includes what we dismissively refer to as the Old Testament which was, to the writer of Timothy, what he meant by scripture to begin with. So the story about doddering old Moses getting a little help from his friends in the task of prayer is at least as useful for our consideration today as the parable - or the psalm. Bible scholar Raymond Collins even wrote a book called Preaching the Epistles for those brave enough to do that on a Sunday. When it comes to the word of God, we often operate from a false sense of biblical hierarchy. Furthermore, this much-cited passage from Timothy tells us how scripture is useful: It equips us for the good work we're called to do, for our vocation to discipleship. So when we consider the three old men literally holding down the fort in spiritual warfare against Amalek, that helps us to appreciate how our faith-sharing groups, Rosary before Mass, and monthly adoration crowd contribute vitally to the life of the church. Reflecting on our confidence in God's fidelity - as the psalmist does - enables us to step out in faithful action more boldly. When Jesus tells a story about the need for a tireless commitment to prayer (scholar Mary Ann Getty calls Jesus "Our Prayin" Lord" in Luke's gospel), it's a wake-up call to take the injunction to pray unceasingly more seriously. All of that is inspired advice, full of the breath of God waiting for us to exhale it into the world. Proclaim this word whether convenient or inconvenient, we're told in Timothy. But which word, just the letter itself? Hardly. It's the divine word we're exhorted to proclaim - and proclamation obliges us to more than mere profession of it. It's not enough to say, "Oh yeah, the Bible is God's word, I believe it." Good for you; proclamation, however, involves trumpeting this message far and wide in speech and lived example. And proclamation is not just Father's job, as some of us were raised to imagine. Don't forget: When it comes to doing God's will, even Moses couldn't do it alone.

#### **PERSEVERANCE**

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives a clever example of why we are to persevere in praying, even if we think the prayer is not being heard. The crooked judge just wanted to get that widow off his back. She was lucky her adversary didn't pester the judge, too; he might have gone the other way. So we can pray to God with even more confidence, because we know that God loves us and will answer our prayers. St. Paul carries that theme of perseverance even further. He is not just talking about prayer here; he encourages Timothy to persevere in proclaiming God's word as well. That command we may find more challenging than prayer. He tells Timothy (and us!) to "convince, reprimand and encourage through all patience and teaching" (2 Timothy 4:2). How can we do that? "Convince" reminds me that our faith should be reasonable. Not that we can prove all that we believe in a scientific way, but our faith should be realistic; after all, God made the world, so God should know how it works. Jesus' command to love one another, for instance, can be taught much more convincingly by giving examples of love. A mother who hugs her child when he is hurt, forgives him when he is sorry, and encourages him when he feels lost is teaching that command in a way that will be remembered much longer than just telling him to love people. So we can convince others of our faith by showing them examples of love, forgiveness, and encouragement. Paul also talks about reprimanding each other. That may be what he was thinking when he says that proclaiming the word can sometimes be inconvenient. Most people find it difficult to reprimand someone they are in charge of, much less one who is equal in status. That's where patience comes in. A reprimand can be made patiently and gently, as a sign of concern rather than authority. Paul lastly mentions teaching. He probably was referring to teaching the Hebrew scriptures and how they were fulfilled in Christ. Parents can do their part by teaching the stories from the Bible, helping children to see God in creation, teaching them to pray, and being good examples of God's love for them. If you send your children to religion classes or the parish school, do what you can to support the teachers so that what the children learn at school is practiced at home. What the children see (or don't see) at home has a much greater effect than a few hours a week in a classroom.
