#### Keeping the light on

The image shows up in countless love songs and stories. It's a symbol of hope against hope, and heartache that hasn't yet become heartbreak. The porch light left on, long after midnight, tells us that someone's missing and someone's waiting. We can't see to the end of the story from here, but we already know that love keeps vigil, no matter how long it takes.

Extinguishing the light, by contrast, has always been an emblem of despair. As the Christophers say: Better to light one candle than to curse the darkness. But some of us, unused to the practice of patience that hope requires, have learned to live in the darkness even as we curse it. We may grope in the dim security of fatalism, believing that whatever comes down the road won't be any better than what's already here—and could well be a tad worse.

Those who live with the light on, however, are prepared to welcome something better and admit the possibility of a wonder. Will life come to replace our fear of loss and death? Will love return where there has been only longing? Will anxiety be dispelled by joy? Those who have already turned the light off may never know.

#### A date with Lady Wisdom

All good things come to those who wait; and among the best that's coming is wisdom. This attribute enjoys a feminine persona, much like boats, cool cars, and the church. Perhaps it's the classic male expression for something desirable that is devoutly to be sought. In any case, wisdom is presented as a lady in the Hebrew tradition. In books like Proverbs, Sirach, and the Wisdom of Solomon, she makes her rounds, inviting all who are alert to join her at her table and learn from her good counsel.

So who or what is Lady Wisdom? By no means a goddess, wisdom speaks like a prophet, sometimes imitating Jeremiah or Ezekiel in her promises that are not unlike the "new covenant" of prophecy. Her words may echo oracles, but there is one dramatic distinction: Prophets speak for God, ending their pronouncements with the rousing cry, "The word of the Lord!" Wisdom, however, speaks on her own authority.

Wisdom doesn't only speak; she acts. She creates, saves, and directs human history, prompting the name "mediatrix of the works of God" from some scholars. Because her results are similar to the fruits listed in Galatians 5, some identify wisdom as another name for the Spirit. Others, seeing her perform as the active word of God, understand her as prefiguring Jesus. Whoever wisdom precisely is or however she operates, she is definitely worth waiting for.

#### The women who wait

Matthew offers a flipside image: that of the women who sit and wait. They do not keep vigil for wisdom, but are themselves separated into the wise and the foolish. Wisdom, it appears, has already made her rounds, and the five who took her counsel brought extra oil for their lamps. Is this story a precursor of the scouting motto: "Be prepared"? Only in the most cosmic sense possible. What the women are prepared for is nothing less than the fulfillment of history, which Paul also speaks to in his letter to Thessalonica. The Bridegroom they are waiting for arrives in the wink of an eye, though his coming is not announced. It is simply believed in and longed for, as they light their lamps in "joyful hope" for the coming of a presence that is the consummation of every human desire. If he is called the Bridegroom, it is no accident. Who waits more fervently on love than the one who is already in love? And who is more beloved than the one to whom we have already entrusted our hearts? The women awaiting the beloved are the perfect complement to those seeking Lady Wisdom. And neither will be disappointed.

#### Kingdom coming

All of us who live in faith await the hour of God's choosing we call the Reign, or Kingdom. It's ahead of us, but also within us. It's at the end of history but also at hand in the midst of it. We keep vigil for this Kingdom even as we embrace and embody it. The Kingdom is coming, but it's coming all the time.

Most of us don't have time in the average day to consider the End of the World. "Apocalypse now" is more like "Apocalypse who?" Jesus may be coming on Judgment Day, but the clothes need to get to the cleaners and dinner has to get on the table. Unlike some communities in the early church, who dropped what they were doing, quit their jobs, and became resident busybodies slouching toward the eschaton, we members of the later church have given up on keeping vigil for the Second Coming. That's not necessarily a bad thing.

But what we must not miss is that, as Bernard of Clairvaux noticed, between the historical coming and the Second Coming of Jesus, there is a third and most crucial coming: his daily arrival—in the Eucharist, but not only there; in the word and the church, but also in the poor, the sick, the schmuck, as well as in the face of the beloved. If we miss the Jesus who comes to us there, we turn the porch light out on the possibility of wonder. Someone is indeed missing, and we are invited to wait for that someone. And while we keep our vigil, let's not miss the continual sightings that let us know the one we love is on his way.




