#### MASS INTENTIONS

Offering Mass for a special Intention is a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is said. Masses are offered for many reasons: for the souls in purgatory, in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or in honor of a birthday or anniversary. If you would like to have a Mass said for someone, go to the Parish Office to get on the schedule. Cards are then given to you so that you can mail them to whomever you choose to so they may also participate in the Mass. The stipend or offering given, (\$10 or more) signifies the sacrificial nature of giving of something of yourself to associate more intimately with Christ who offers himself in the Eucharist.

For those families requesting a Letter of good standing, participation letter from the office for school registrations, Sacraments, Godparent verification, etc. you must meet the following criteria;

- 1. Be officially registered in our parish for at least six months. Considerations will be taken for military families new to the parish and will be addressed on case-by-case basis.
- 2. Be in good standing which means you and your family regularly attend Mass and contribute to our offertory program. You must use your assigned envelope/giving number for these donations to be recorded properly. We understand that sometimes people are unable to give to the parish; however, placing your envelope even if its empty in the basket helps us determine that someone is in fact participating in the life of a parish.
- 3. If you have moved away and are not actively participating in our parish life, and if we have not seen you at mass for weeks and months, we may be unable to issue you with the above mentioned documents. Additionally, your standing within the parish may differ from those who consistently attend and share with our community their Time, Talent and Treasure.

#### **Sacrament of Baptism in OLSS**

A newborn child should be baptized within the first few months of life. A child who has reached the age of kindergarten should receive some basic instruction/preparation before reception of the Sacrament. In order to have a child baptized at Our Lady Star of the Sea, at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the OLSS Parish. A child to be baptized should normally have two Godparents, a male and a female. In order to serve as a Godparent, a person must be a practicing Roman Catholic, fully initiated, and at least sixteen years of age. A Godparent must supply a letter from his/her proper pastor indicating suitability to serve as a Godparent for Baptism. Parents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class which lasts approximately one hour.

#### **Sacrament of Marriage in OLSS**

Those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage need to contact the church office for a list of instructions at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date. Definite plans for a particular date should not be made until such contact has been completed. Only when a priest or deacon has decided that he will officiate at the marriage, will a definite date be set. There is a requirement for marriage preparation classes. Options for these will be discussed when you meet with the priest or deacon you have chosen as your celebrant

All the names of the sick we receive will be entered on the prayer list for one month, and then removed. If you would like your loved one to remain on the prayer list longer, please let us know, and we will happily oblige.



#### FRIENDS IN HIGH PLACES

Let's drop some names. Who's the most impressive person you ever met? I had a glass of wine with Henri Nouwen some years ago. I was at a party attended by Hans Küng - though he certainly wasn't aware of me. I think I passed Yoko Ono at a crowded bazaar and was nine rows from Paul McCartney at a concert, speaking of the Beatles. I even sat next to a soap opera star at a funeral reception. That's the extent of my brush with royalty. My usual circles are far less august.

If my fate were uncertain and I had to make a midnight appeal to the person with the most juice possible, I'm afraid I'm not even on speaking terms with a bishop, mayor, or billionaire. It can be rotten to be unfriended by VIPs! So imagine being an anonymous person who did the crime and some time - and now your time is up and you're going to be executed. Where can you turn for hope of a reprieve? In ancient times you turned to the king. Only from the throne could such judgment be rendered. Because kings ruled by divine decree, a king's declaration went from his mouth to God's ear. Kings were bigger than high priests, procurators, and all their tribunals put together. What the king said came to pass. The problem for the average anonymous insurrectionist was gaining access to a king in the 11th hour - or any hour for that matter. Because neither you nor any friend of yours were on speaking terms with royalty, you could kiss your life good-bye.

So here you are, wretched and hanging from a cross, bleeding and dying, along with two other condemned men. And one of them, honest to God, is this Jesus person you've heard about. Rulers and soldiers are sneering, his friends and followers have clearly abandoned him - except for a few powerless women. Yet you know he's here under very different auspices than you. He did not do the crime, and he should not be on this cross, suffocating and humiliated in public like this. People who should know better are shouting: If you have friends in high places, Christ, why don't you call on them now? It's incredible that they speak to him this way. Even you, who are no angel, are offended. You take it upon yourself, criminal though you are, to be the only lawyer the Son of Man will ever have to represent him. And because you spoke for Jesus in this awful hour, when he doesn't look anything like a King of the Jews or a Prince of Peace, today you'll sit in the highest place of all with him.

# During the season of Advent Misa de Angelis will be celebrated Ad Orientem in OLSS. The permanent parts of the mass will be prayed in Latin language. The Latin text with English translation will be provided.


"Mass ad orientem is a Catholic Mass where the priest and congregation face east, or symbolically face east (face the Tabernacle)

Why would anyone prefer Mass where the priest faces away from the congregation? The key consideration given by those arguing for this, who include prominent theologians such as Cdl. Joseph Ratzinger, before his election as Pope Benedict XVI, and Cdl. Christoph Schönborn, in a book he wrote in 1996, can be expressed as a question: to whom are the prayers of the Mass, particularly the Eucharistic Prayer, addressed? If they are addressed to God, then it makes sense for the celebrant to say them toward something symbolizing God, in union with the people. Historically, this has been the East: the direction of the rising sun. The association of a particular direction, within a church, with God, is strengthened if that is where the crucifix and tabernacle are to be found, or, in ancient churches, a mosaic in the apse ceiling of Christ in glory. Even if the church is not in line with the geographical East, the direction of the altar from the nave can be regarded as symbolizing the East, and priest and people can direct their gaze, and their prayers, toward it, together.


Cdl. Ratzinger was particularly critical of a tendency he detected in celebrations "toward the people." On the one hand, the people in practice can end up looking not at what the priest is praying toward, but at the priest himself, introducing what Ratzinger called "an unprecedented clericalization." On the other hand, the priest can end up focusing his attention on the people.

The new result is what Ratzinger called a "closed circle": a group of people addressing each other, when they should be opened out toward God. (Quotations are from Ratzinger, Spirit of the Liturgy, 2000.) This is particularly emphasized when the seating in church is arranged in a circle around the altar.

The direction of prayer has had an enormous impact on the style of celebration. Priests celebrating toward the people can see if people are paying attention, like a public speaker or performer. If he is facing away from them, he has little idea of what is going on in the nave. Before Vatican II, this was regarded as a good thing: in the 1962 Mass, even when a priest is told to turn to face the people (for example, when he turns to them to say, "Dominus vobiscum"), he should keep his eyes lowered. He should not be distracted by the congregation from his work of prayer, and the congregation should not be distracted by him. Where celebration versus populum is the norm, Catholics can get used to priests trying to engage them in what is going on with eye contact, emphasis in what they are saying, and even unscripted remarks. Experiencing Mass celebrated the other way can even be disconcerting. The point of it, however, is to allow the people to do what the priest should be doing: addressing their prayers to God. Above all in the Eucharistic Prayer, a celebrant facing East allows the people to follow what is going on in their own way, and to unite themselves spiritually to his prayer to God, which he leads from the altar...'



At the 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Mass that took place on July 19 and honored this special milestone for our Diocese, a special cross was given to representatives of each community to return to their parish. As a sign of unity in honor of Christ Our Hope, Bishop Parkes have asked that the cross be placed upon the altars throughout the Diocese on the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, which is celebrated this weekend.


