### Prepare the Way.

What are you waiting for? The most disastrous answer anyone can give to that question is *nothing*. It's the Advent question, boiled clean of all the theology and catechism we were taught and can't use where the rubber meets the road of life. Forget the miracle birth for a moment; and incarnation and the sacred science of salvation. What is it we need and want, and is that the same as what we anticipate?

For some of us the problem lies right here, in that what we really hope for and what we expect are two very different things. The deep desire of our hearts, and what we've come to expect from religious promises, have very little in common. Oh, sure, we believe we'll get pie in the sky when we die. God will make everything all right in the end, if we keep the rules and don't cause too much damage to ourselves and others. What it comes down to is that we've come to view the whole enterprise of religion as a severely delayed system of gratification: Almost too little. And certainly too late. It doesn't have to be this way.

### Listen to your heart.

So what's the answer to the question: What are we waiting for? The longing of our hearts tells us the answer, if we take a moment to listen. Life can be really hard on us, and we poor humans are very vulnerable creatures. Our families may be hurting. Love hurts, and the loss of it hurts. Loneliness makes us feel isolated. Our jobs may be killing us, or joblessness may threaten our security. We carry the burdens of our sick with us; our own health may be in jeopardy. We worry about our children and our elders. At this time of the year especially, financial trouble may bear down on us. Conflicts that arise during the holidays every year may already be surfacing. When we are truthful about what we are waiting for, some of us will have to admit that we're waiting for the other shoe to drop, or for the hardship to just get harder.

But when we feel the tensions and even the despair of living, some part of us is also waiting for something else. We call this experience hope-against-hope. Even when things all seem to be going in a bad direction, our hopes are pushing in a better one, however absurd that may seem. When the economy is shrinking all around us, we hope we won't be affected. When someone is very ill, we hope the doctors will be able to affect a cure. When we have lost someone to death, we hope we will see them again. Life goes down a difficult road, but our hopes refuse to follow.

If we listen to our hopes, instead of to the voice of despair, we experience the meaning of religious faith. We don't wait for evidence to appear that things will get better. We simply fling all our anticipation in the direction of our heart's desire and trust that God does too.

### Listen to the promises.

"Comfort, give comfort to my people." These words from Isaiah, the prophet of Advent, remind us who we're dealing with. Our God is the God who fills in the valleys and lowers the mountains so that the way between God and us is smooth. This road between us is the highway of hope, and it's a two-lane route. Our hope in God's promises moves on one side, and God's strength and encouragement travels on the other. In a world of rough words and deception, kindness and truth meet here. Despite the overwhelming evidence of injustice and violence, on this smooth road between God and us, justice and peace shall kiss. We don't have to wait for "later." God's promises are waiting for us on this road right now.

It may be hard for us to see up this road, because by our nature we are locked into a single moment of time when things seem pretty fixed as they are. But "a day with the Lord is like a thousand years," and God is not bound by the inconvenience of time. If hopes that seem almost absurd rise up in us in times of distress, that's because as believers we share in God's freedom to move beyond the present hour to the eternal promise of joy and victory. It's not just that things will work out "someday." In God's eyes, from the perspective of eternity, they already *have* worked out. The victory was never in question.

### Don't just wait, prepare

The generation into which John the Baptist arrived was waiting for the fulfillment of its hopes, just as we are. John told them that it wasn't enough for people of faith to wait: They had to *prepare*. It makes sense. If we really trusted that God was coming, we wouldn't just sit around and wish that it would happen. (If *you* thought God was coming today, to your house, what would you do about it?) Hope is not a passive virtue. We can't just sit on it. Hope is a working virtue. We lean into it—and into its fulfillment—as we prepare for what we trust is coming. Comfort is coming. Kindness and truth are coming. Justice and peace are coming. Jesus the Lord is coming! And if we believe that, we will live as though it's already come to pass. In the heart of God—which we come to know in our experience of hope—it already has.


