MASS INTENTIONS

Offering Mass for a special Intention is a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is said. Masses are offered for many reasons: for the souls in purgatory, in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or in honor of a birthday or anniversary. If you would like to have a Mass said for someone, go to the Parish Office to get on the schedule. Cards are then given to you so that you can mail them to whomever you choose to so they may also participate in the Mass. The stipend or offering given, **(\$10 or more)** signifies the sacrificial nature of giving of something of yourself to associate more intimately with Christ who offers himself in the Eucharist.

From the
Pastor's
Desk



For those families requesting a Letter of good standing, participation letter from the office for school registrations, Sacraments, Godparent verification, etc. you must meet the following criteria;

1. Be officially registered in our parish for at least six months. Considerations will be taken for military families new to the parish and will be addressed on case-by-case basis.
2. Be in good standing which means you and your family regularly attend Mass and contribute to our offertory program. You must use your assigned envelope/giving number for these donations to be recorded properly. We understand that sometimes people are unable to give to the parish; however, placing your envelope even if its empty in the basket helps us determine that someone is in fact participating in the life of a parish.
3. If you have moved away and are not actively participating in our parish life, and if we have not seen you at mass for weeks and months, we may be unable to issue you with the above mentioned documents. Additionally, your standing within the parish may differ from those who consistently attend and share with our community their Time, Talent and Treasure.

Sacrament of Baptism in OLSS

A newborn child should be baptized within the first few months of life. A child who has reached the age of kindergarten should receive some basic instruction/preparation before reception of the Sacrament. In order to have a child baptized at Our Lady Star of the Sea, at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the OLSS Parish. A child to be baptized should normally have two Godparents, a male and a female. In order to serve as a Godparent, a person must be a practicing Roman Catholic, fully initiated, and at least sixteen years of age. A Godparent must supply a letter from his/her proper pastor indicating suitability to serve as a Godparent for Baptism. Parents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class which lasts approximately one hour.

Sacrament of Marriage in OLSS

Those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage need to contact the church office for a list of instructions at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date. Definite plans for a particular date should not be made until such contact has been completed. Only when a priest or deacon has decided that he will officiate at the marriage, will a definite date be set. There is a requirement for marriage preparation classes. Options for these will be discussed when you meet with the priest or deacon you have chosen as your celebrant

PLEASE PRAY FOR THE SICK



THE RIGHTEOUS PERSON'S DILEMMA

Joseph had a problem, and it wasn't a small one: The girl about to become his wife was pregnant. He wasn't the father, so the law was clear: Honor could be restored to both households by stoning. Regrettable, messy, a bad sort of public excitement, but over quickly. All that would be left is the task of finding another marriageable girl. This bloody business wasn't really the problem. The trouble was that Joseph was a righteous man. Righteousness is a technical term in Judaism. In Hebrew it's a form of measurement. A righteous weight is a true one. A righteous path leads directly to the destination. A righteous sacrifice is performed by the book. Righteousness means meeting the prescribed standard. The opposite of righteousness is dishonesty.

A righteous man, therefore, might well go by the book and stone the girl. But what if "the book" had conflicting standards? On the one hand, faithless women should be stoned. On the other hand, the girl Mary wasn't the faithless kind. Stoning the innocent was murder, and murder was prohibited by that same book. Could restoring honor possibly be more important than a potentially innocent girl's life? In the end Joseph resolves his dilemma by taking the advice of an angel in a dream. Great counsel if you can get it! More of us should pray for such guidance when faced with moral discernment. But the deeper issue of how to be righteous - how to discover the right standard - remains. With so much dishonesty around us, the truth can seem hard to acquire. Take Job. He claimed to be righteous, yet his friends weighed his great suffering as testimony against him. Whose perspective can you trust? Job called on God to decide. The Servant of the Lord in Isaiah's prophecies is also called righteous yet condemned by his peers. Unlike Job, his vindication is posthumous. Tamar is considered more righteous than Judah - but her avenue to justice is not something we'd recommend to our daughters. Which leads to the question: Is Christian righteousness different from the Jewish kind?

Saint Paul says it is. Bible scholar John McKenzie notes that Paul "found himself with an [Old Testament] vocabulary which had to be expanded to fit the fullness of his insight into the Christian mystery." So Paul stitched together the observation that both Noah and Abraham are deemed righteous by placing their faith in God, not by meeting a standard. Faith rectified the discrepancy between where they were and where they ought to be. We don't have to "know" what's right or make the judgment call by reason alone. If we place our trust in God, like Joseph, we will be led straight to the truth.
