#### **MASS INTENTIONS**

#### Where God lives

Imagine the misplaced compassion of David! David the king felt sorry for God. As he looked out of his palace window and saw the Tent of the Presence, David felt that he lived better than God did. That old tent had come across the desert, sheltering the Ark of the Covenant for generations. David wanted to build a house for God, because the king had a nicer address in his splendid palace than his Divine Lord under a linen tent.

David meant well. His heart was in the right place. But his understanding of God was seriously flawed if he thought the Lord of the universe lived under a tent in his courtyard. But before we judge David for his simple-mindedness, we ought to examine our own understanding of God. Into what little compartment of our lives have we been willing to confine the God of all that is?

#### God and wonder

As children, we give ourselves over to the experience of wonder. The world is so big and new and marvelous! This is never so true as at this time of year, when the decorations and lights and music and holiday mood create a spectacle of expectation that practically overwhelms us. We can't wait. We can't wait! Whatever's coming is almost here, and we can hardly *sleep* thinking about it.

In the same way, as children, we approach the manger scene with an awe that is the closest thing to reverence we'll ever know. We peer in to see the baby in the straw who is the living God, and we believe the whole story: star, shepherd, kings . . . talking animals, drummer boy, littlest angel . . . it all fits. Whatever miracle you want to assign to that place is fine with us. The God in the straw is mysterious enough and magnificent enough to accommodate all of that and more.

But it gets more complicated as we grow older. Our capacity for wonder shrinks. We stop looking into the midnight sky for stars. We stop expecting God to come into the world in flesh like ours. We don't anticipate the arrival of God into our lives, period. The season of Advent shrinks down to the size of a shopping season. The Incarnation becomes just a story. The Lord of the universe may become simply a religious obligation. Our God gets very, very small and marginal. We might as well put God in a tent in the yard.

# Will you build a house for me

King David understood, at least, that God should never be marginal in our lives. He wanted to bring God back to the center, not only of his own life, but the life of the nation. Building the wonderful temple in Jerusalem was part of that plan.

When the people saw how wonderful the temple was, they would have some sense of the wonder of the God of Israel.

But God sent the prophet Nathan to David with another idea. God didn't want to be limited in the human imagination to a building or a place. God wanted to be known as a living and dynamic presence. So God said, "I will dwell in you and with your heirs for all time." God would be known in people, not in places; in flesh and not in stone.

#### The Holy Spirit will come upon you

Mary of Nazareth was a young girl who had rarely seen a city like Jerusalem. As a woman, she would not have entered the Holy of Holies of the great temple there, where the Glory of God was believed to reside. If God was understood to live in a building of stone, it was a place Mary would not have been permitted to go.

But God was willing to come to her, to her home, and to knit the divine Spirit to her very person. Can you imagine it? This is the very definition of wonder: that God found a home in a teenage girl! We don't expect to find God there. It's the wrong address. We won't be knocking on that door. We would much rather visit God in a building and keep the divine presence in a tabernacle of gold. It is much more convenient to have a God so small that you always know where he is and what he's up to. That kind of God won't interfere too much in the way you live your life.

When God came to David in the words of the prophet, David half-believed what he heard. He wanted to believe that God would live in him and in his line forever. But he still went ahead and dreamed up the temple. Mary, on the other hand, gave herself up utterly and confidently to God's words. If she started making anything, it was baby clothes.

#### Behold, we are the Lord's servants

We may have lost sight of wonder in our old age. We may have found a nice-sized box to put God in so he won't cause us any trouble. But the only place where God consistently asks to dwell is in us. In this season, and in every season, God seeks a home in us as a living and dynamic presence. If God lived in us, we would know it, and so would everyone around us. We would be the embodiment of peace. We would be shelter for the poor. We would be joy and compassion and love. We would be like Mary, the willing servant of her Lord, who opened her life to God so intimately that God shared her heartbeat and passed into this world through her. May there be willing volunteers among us, too, so that God's will may be done some more.
