

MASS INTENTIONS

The stipend or offering given, (\$10 or more) signifies the sacrificial nature of giving of something of yourself to associate more intimately with Christ who offers himself in the Eucharist.

For those families requesting a Letter of good standing, participation letter from the office for school registrations, Sacraments,

Godparent verification, etc., you must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be officially registered in our parish for at least six months. Considerations will be taken for military families new to the parish and will be addressed on case-by-case basis.
- 2. Be in good standing which means you and your family regularly attend Mass and contribute to our offertory program. You must use your assigned envelope/giving number for these donations to be recorded properly. We understand that sometimes people are unable to give to the parish; however, placing your envelope, even if its empty, in the basket helps us determine that someone is in fact participating in the life of a parish.
- 3. If you have moved away and are not actively participating in our parish life, and if we have not seen you at mass for weeks and months, we may be unable to issue you with the above mentioned documents. Additionally, your standing within the parish may differ from those who consistently attend and share with our community their Time, Talent and Treasure.

Sacrament of Baptism in OLSS

A newborn child should be baptized within the first few months of life. A child who has reached the age of kindergarten should receive some basic instruction/preparation before reception of the Sacrament. In order to have a child baptized at Our Lady Star of the Sea, at least one parent must be a practicing Catholic, and registered in the OLSS Parish. A child to be baptized should normally have two Godparents, a male and a female. In order to serve as a Godparent, a person mut be a practicing Roman Catholic, fully initiated, and at least sixteen years of age. A Godparent must supply a letter from his/her proper pastor indicating suitability to serve as a Godparent for Baptism. Parents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class which lasts approximately one hour.

Sacrament of Marriage in OLSS

Those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage need to contact the church office for a list of instructions at least six months in advance of the anticipated wedding date. Definite plans for a particular date should not be made until such contact has been completed. Only when a priest or deacon has decided that he will officiate at the marriage, will a definite date be set. There is a requirement for marriage preparation classes. Options for these will be discussed when you meet with the priest or deacon you have chosen as your celebrant.

The one absolutely necessary virtue is perseverance, to not give up on our journey. The mountain we struggle to climb is often our own weakness, failures, and sins. Persevere in prayer. Keep celebrating the sacraments. Embrace daily duties. With God's grace, you are strong enough to keep going. Perhaps the peak is not as far away as you might fear. Keep going!

In the first reading of today, Prophet Isaiah aims to console those people of Israel who had returned from exile and were depressed having witnessed the miserable state of Jerusalem and the poverty of their motherland. Their Temple was destroyed and they felt that God had abandoned them. The Prophet speaks to them perseveringly about the future glory of Jerusalem to which people from every nation will come. Their city would be the center from which the knowledge of the true God would go out in all directions. God's glory is associated with the things God does to lead people to salvation.

The second reading from the letter to the Hebrews tells us that we must expect hardship which is part of our training. We cannot win the ultimate prize unless we undergo such training. It is God our loving Father who sends us these trials and he is our trainer. He loves us and corrects us as good Fathers who will lovingly correct their children for their wrongdoings. Hence all difficulties must be seen as a gift of a loving father and an opportunity to bring forth the peaceful fruit of righteousness. So he advices us not to move away from their Christian duty but persevere in their Christian path as it is the path to salvation.

The Lord's message in today's Gospel was primarily intended for the Jews who had heard his teaching and refused to believe in him. However, the fate he foretells for them is the same fate that awaits all, Jews or gentiles, who fail to accept the Good News and live accordingly. Jesus tells us very clearly today

that it is not enough to follow him, have meals with him and listen to him. There is something more that has to be done. The response of Jesus comes to the question raised by the disciples whether only a few people are going to be saved. This also could be the result of the Jewish belief that only they would be saved. According to the Jewish tradition, there was little possibility for the pagans to be saved. The salvation of God's People, however, was virtually guaranteed, provided they kept the Law.

The Gospel tells us that salvation is not automatic. It requires cooperation and perseverance on our part to secure the kingdom of heaven. There should be the willingness to enter through the narrow gate. The best chance of success is to humble and serve others. What really counts is how to treat other people and accept them. It means that if we want to enter the kingdom of heaven we must mortify ourselves and make sacrifices in order to achieve our final goal. We have the hope that Jesus is the door through which we enter the kingdom. They are the indication that God loves us and corrects us as a loving parent through the pains and sufferings in our life.

Jesus does not at all say that only a few will be saved. He seems to ignore such a question as trivial and useless. The whole thrust of the Gospel is that Jesus came to bring God's love and freedom to the whole world. The primary role of the Christian community has never been simply to guarantee the "salvation" of its own members. It is not the function of the Church to turn all its energies in seeing that its members "save their souls" and sometimes pray for those in "outer darkness".

The next part of the discourse of Jesus deals, first of all, with the rejection of the Jewish People, which, for the most part, did not convert to following of Christ. This rejection made it possible for the pagan Nations to enter the Church and thus to take for themselves the place that had been left vacant by those who were the first to be called: "And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." We know that in Christ, the narrow door is symbolic of the hardships of life for those who follow Jesus.

Jesus links one virtue directly to salvation: perseverance, to not give up on our journey. The mountain we struggle to climb is often our own weakness, failures, and sins. Persevere in prayer. Keep celebrating the sacraments. Embrace daily duties. With God's grace, you are strong enough to keep going. Perhaps the peak is not as far away as you might fear. Keep going!




