TOWF FACILITY



The incorporating Torch of Wisdom Foundation team envisioned acquiring a facility where youth and families could go for educational support, mentoring and recreation. The vision of a facility came to fruition in September 2011.

The Torch of Wisdom Foundation, Inc. acquired a commercial office building, located at 21819 West Nine Mile Road, Southfield, Michigan, which houses the Foundation's office, provides tenancy to DST-SAC and several small businesses. Our facility also has available public space that community members or organizations can rent to host meetings, training sessions and other community events.

To date, the facility manages monthly 60-70 hours of educational seminars and meetings with a direct emphasis on benefitting youth and families. Over 600 individuals pass through the halls monthly, participating in activities focused on enriching the community.

2021 CHARITY GOLF CLASSIC

We held our 12th Charity Golf Classic at The Links of Novi, with tremendous support from over 130 attendees. 2021 REVERSE RAFFLE

In tandem with our 12th Golf Classic, The Torch of Wisdom Foundation hosted its 2nd Reverse Raffle. The Reverse Raffle is a "high odds" raffle in which for 2021, only 200 tickets are sold for \$150 each. In this raffle, all tickets are drawn with small \$50 cash prizes distributed along the way.

When five tickets remain in the raffle drum, the five ticketholders have the opportunity to share the cash prize pot or have another ticket drawn to eliminate a ticketholder. If even one of the five finalists refuses to split the cash prize pot, another ticket is drawn to reduce the number of finalists by one! The process continues until all finalists agree to split the prize or one finalist wins the grand prize. Sounds complicated? Not really but keep in mind, you want your ticket to be one of the last tickets drawn! This raffle offers lots of energy, anticipation and excitement to be one of the five ticketholders left in the raffle drum!

Our net profit was **\$20,495!** 197 tickets of the 200 available tickets were sold enabling multiple \$50 cash winners. The decision of the five prize winners was for everyone to enjoy the winnings so they collectively decided to split the \$7,150 cash prize pot (each receiving \$1,430).

Our top prize winners were Jo Coleman, Joe DeBose, Kurt Day, Gwen Hatchett, and Stephanie Mitchell/301 Team. The Reverse Raffle will return in 2023 to pair with the 13th Charity Golf Classic.

TOWF CULTURAL ARTS PROGRAM

The Torch of Wisdom Foundation again partnered with the phenomenal founders of the Detroit Fine Arts Breakfast Club (DFABC) to present the 4^{th} Annual Art Extravaganza event, September 18-26. Art Extravaganza is a cultural arts program designed to educate the community about collecting original fine art to build future wealth while supporting Metropolitan Detroit artists.

The program kicked off on September 18 with a hybrid (live and virtual) educational seminar titled "Creating Generational Wealth Through Art Collecting." We were honored to have Izegbe N'Namdi from N'Namdi Center for Contemporary Art moderate the panel discussion with a spirited conversation about the art world and collecting journey. Guest panelists included collectors Sharon Gamblin, Nas Sorrell, and Todd & Carla Tinsley-Smith.

The online auction started the next day and ran for one week. Art lovers previewed the juried artwork during two "Preview Days" leading up to the live auction, which closed out the 2021 Art Extravaganza on September 26 at the Torch of Wisdom Plaza. We were thrilled to welcome our 2021 Honorary Chair, Ms. Vivian Pickard, who helped build momentum for the auction, which drew over 120 bidders from across the country, purchasing 85% of the art. Proceeds from the auction benefit community enrichment programs.

Small Business Saturday 2021 was a success for the Torch of Wisdom Foundation, Inc. On Saturday, November 27, we hosted a "Small Business Showcase and Food Truck Rally" as part of our Economic Education Series, a financial literacy program sponsored by Fifth Third Bank and executed in partnership with the Southfield Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

The day featured some great activities, including a Business Banking Workshop titled "Getting Your Pitch Ready," followed by a Small Business Saturday virtual watch party on Zoom and streamed via Facebook Live. After these morning activities, the public was invited to a Food Truck Rally at the Torch of Wisdom Foundation Plaza, featuring JJ's Fish & Shrimp, Dirty Rice, and D'Vine Cookies.

In addition to the Small Business Saturday event, the Economic Education Series includes a series of free workshops, panel discussions and other events focused on empowering individuals with the skills and knowledge needed to help them make informed and effective decisions with all their financial resources.





YOUTH PROGRAMS



THE LEARNING NETWORK (TLN)

In 2021, The Learning Network resumed virtually with our largest class to date–22 students! Participants from across SE Michigan, tuned in each week for our 6-week signature programming including career panels, budget and finance talk, dress for success sessions and ultimately our group business brand presentation better known as "The Innovation Pitch"; whereby community leaders and executives served as judges to identify the businesses in which they would invest.

We were able to culminate the program and celebrate our students with a drive-by celebration including local leaders. As always, students were able to "earn while they learn" where they receive a stipend each week along with an opportunity to earn over \$2,500 in awards and cash prizes!



WISDOM WARRIORS PROJECT (WWP)

Wisdom Warriors Project is a bi-monthly program from November-April that targets high school girls. The program aims to help girls build a philanthropic mindset through workshops focused on three pillars:

- 1. Who Am I?
- 2. What Obstacles Must I Overcome?
- 3. How Do I Leverage My Time, Talent and Treasure to Make a Difference in the World?


This year's cohort included eight participants who decided to focus their fundraising efforts to positively impact mental health and awareness along with drug abuse for youth. The Wisdom Warriors raised \$2,000 and combined with a 100% match by the Foundation they were able to award \$2,000 to each of their chosen charities, Pennies4Girls and The Power of Girlhood. 

On September 4, 2011, the Foundation acquired an 11,000 square foot community enrichment facility located at 21819 W. 9 Mile Road, Southfield, MI. The facility provides access to public meeting space, educational seminars, and other community events with a direct emphasis on building strong communities and families.

In, April 2017, the board launched a five-year capital campaign entitled "Keep the Torch Burning" to raise \$325,000 to extinguish the mortgage on the community enrichment facility and initiate capital improvements to further support the development of relevant programs and the offering of grants/scholarship to deserving individuals and organizations in alignment with our Mission. Through the generosity of our donors, facility improvements have been made and we completed the full extinguishment of our mortgage in November 2021.

We extend sincere appreciation to Public Service Credit Union (PSCU), our mortgage partner for extending the financial support to acquire our facility and special thanks to Nora Sharpley, retired PSCU board member for her pioneering efforts in assisting us to secure the financial relationship.
