

Ordinance No 54

**A Bill For an Ordinance Entitled
"An Ordinance Creating the Cotter
Volunteer Fire Department And For
Other Purposes."**

Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the Incorporated Town of Cotter, Arkansas,

Section 1.—That there is hereby created a city volunteer fire department to be officially known as "The Cotter Volunteer Fire Department."

Section 2.—That the Cotter Volunteer Fire Department shall consist of the Fire Chief, Captain and such number of hosemen as the City Council may order, but not less than twelve.

Section 3.—That the Fire Chief shall be appointed by the City Council and shall be directly charged with the responsibility and accountability to the city for all equipment and have control and management of the organization. He shall name and select, with the approval of the City Council, the members of the department, and shall direct and control all the work of the department.

Section 4.—That there shall be held not less than one meeting each month of the department for the purpose of instructing and training, and that all members shall attend unless excused for reasonable cause.

Section 5.—That each member of the Cotter Volunteer Fire Department who has been selected and approved as herein provided, shall receive the sum of \$1.00 for attendance upon and for service at each and every fire, services at each and every fire being deemed performed when the circumstances of such fire are such as to require the necessity of unloading and connecting the hose to the fire hydrant.

Section 6.—That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, and this ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of the public interest shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval, and publication.
