Furthermore; we know that there are better suited areas in Arkansas that need stimulation, and would welcome whatever employment a prison might provide.

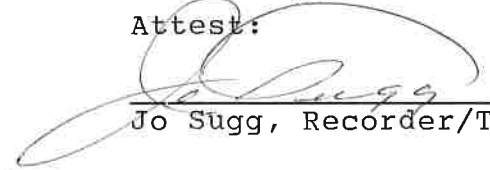
Further; we do not agree that it is too late to stop this project. It should never be too late to correct a bad mistake.
