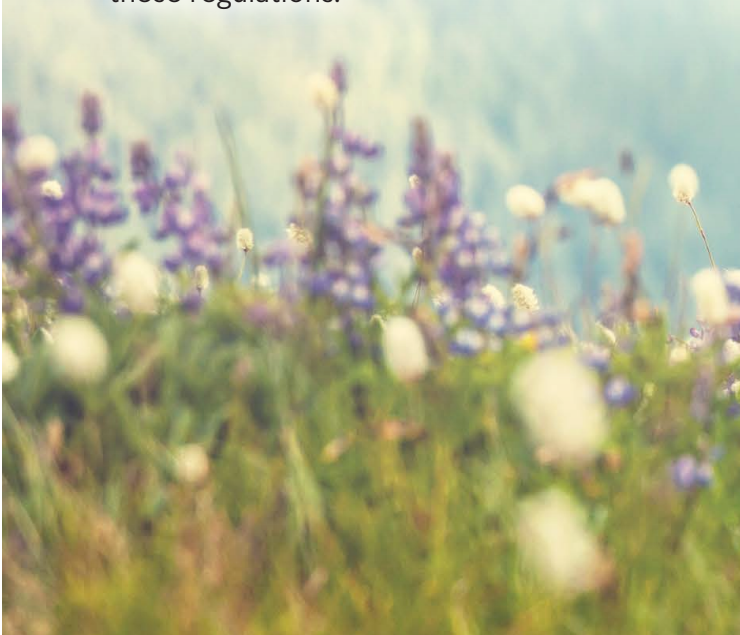




We understand and respect our families' desire to pay tribute through the placement of floral arrangements at their loved one's gravesite.

GROUND BURIAL

FUNERAL FLOWERS

Funeral flowers, holders, containers, baskets and easels will be removed between the third and fifth day following burial, depending on the condition of the flowers.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- The following are not permitted and will be removed and disposed of immediately, as they present significant hazard to other visitors and our landscaping staff: glass or breakable containers, ceramic or porcelain figurines, statues, balloons, or any other fragile or potentially breakable object on or around the memorial.
- Any floral arrangement may be removed when they become discolored, wilted, unsightly, or deemed “seasonally inappropriate.”
- Planting flowers, shrubs, trees, etc. on or near any burial site is not permitted under any circumstances.
- No wind chimes or other decorations are to be hung in trees, shrubs, or other memory garden topiary at any time.
- The memorial garden reserves the right to promptly remove/dispose of any placed items deemed to be fragile or easily damaged at any time.

MOWING SEASON

From *February 15 - November 19*, no objects of any kind are allowed to be placed directly on the memorials or the surrounding ground. Cut flower arrangements, artificial flower arrangements, shepherd hooks, and solar lights may be placed only in memorial vases. Shepherd hooks and solar lights must not exceed three feet in height.

HOLIDAY SEASON

From *November 20- February 14*, artificial arrangements such as Christmas trees, wreaths, sprays, shepherd hooks, solar lights, and easels may be placed on the memorial and surrounding ground, as long as the decorations do not infringe on other spaces. Fragile or breakable objects, such as those listed above, are still not permitted. All holiday decorations must be removed by January 30 or they will be discarded.

FLAGS

Flags are permitted on graves one week before and one week after Memorial Day. The memory gardens will place a flag on the graves of Veterans who have a military marker for Memorial Day only. If your loved one is a veteran, but does not have a military marker, complimentary, Memorial Day flags will be available to families in the main office. Flags are not automatically placed for the 4th of July or Veterans Day, but may still be available at the main office.

MAUSOLEUM & COLUMBARIUMS

Funeral flowers will be displayed for three to five days after the entombment as close to the mausoleum crypt/columbarium niche as possible.

All cut flowers and artificial flowers must be contained within the memorial vase. No flowers or objects are allowed to be placed on the walkways surrounding the mausoleum or columbarium and will be immediately removed and discarded.

No pictures, poems, notes, etc. are to be taped or glued to the mausoleum crypt front or the columbarium niche front.

These regulations are for the safety and well-being of all visitors and staff, and to ensure that our memory gardens continue to be a place of enduring beauty and a continual source of comfort to all whose loved ones reside here.

The memorial garden reserves the right to remove and dispose of any item that does not meet these guidelines. The memorial garden is not liable for any items placed at the site which are damaged, missing, or stolen.

MEMORIAL RESTRICTIONS

Before designing or ordering a permanent memorial for your loved one's space, please check with your *family service counselor* for the rules regarding the types of memorials allowed. For example, most gardens do not allow foot or corner markers. All memorials are subject to approval prior to installation.
