

### Our Call to be Co-workers in the Lord's Mission

At this time of year, many of us are preparing to go on holidays; packing bags, making travel plans, and getting ready to step away from our daily routines. It's the season of journeying. I myself am getting ready for a trip to Rome for a meeting. I am yet to think about what to pack! Some of us travel light; others bring more than we'll ever need! In the Gospel today, Jesus sends out seventy-two of His disciples on a very different kind of journey, not for rest, or vacation, but for mission.

Jesus sends them out in pairs to go ahead of Him, to the places He Himself was to visit. Their job was to prepare the way to announce that "the Kingdom of God is near." They didn't go with packed bags or extra sandals. They went with trust, faith, and a deep sense of being called. Their mission was simple yet vital: to be ambassadors of Christ, signs of His love, peace and presence. The Lord needs us all if his work is to get done. Through baptism we are all called to be laborers in the Lord's harvest. The seventy-two were sent out to prepare places where the Lord could come. That is our calling too.

What strikes me most is that Jesus didn't just send out the "professionals." He sent ordinary people like you and me, because the harvest is rich, and there is much work to be done. The Lord still sends us into our homes, workplaces, communities, to help others experience His love and presence. He needs our gifts and blessings. Are we bringing His presence in these places?

But we're not meant to do this alone. Notice that Jesus sent them out two by two. He knew they would need one another, especially when facing rejection or hostility. That's still true today. Our faith can feel counter-cultural at times; being Catholic isn't always easy in the world we live in. That's why we need each other, to support, encourage, and strengthen one another.

One of the most important ways we do this is by coming together for Sunday Mass. The Eucharist is our weekly gathering as co-workers in God's harvest. It's where we draw strength, where we remember we're not alone in this mission. Every person present and their gifts and talents matters. And every absence is felt, too. Being together matters.

Lastly, Jesus reminds the disciples, and us, not to measure our faith by results, but by our relationship with Him. Whether people welcomed them or not, the message stayed the same: "The Kingdom of God is near." We're called to be faithful, even when our efforts don't seem successful. What matters most is that we walk with Jesus, and that our names are written in heaven. God understands us.

So, as we journey through this summer, whether on holiday or at home, let us remember the Lord's call. Let us remember that we are always on mission. Not alone, but together. Not to carry everything, but to carry Christ. Let's keep each other in prayer this week.
